HIGHLIGHTS

ELECTRIC INFORMATION

- Currently, over 3.1 million customers are without power in Florida. See table below for outage data in hard hit counties.
 - Florida Power and Light is reporting 1,823,500 customer outages (about 43% of its customer base). These numbers may continue to climb. (9/5/04, 5:00 PM)
 - Progress Energy is reporting 494,841 customer outages. (9/5/04, 5:00 PM)
 - Tampa Electric Company is reporting 153,000 customer outages. (9/5/04, 5:00 PM)
 - Municipal utilities are reporting a total of 431,343 customers currently without power. (9/5/04, 5:00 PM)
 - Cooperative utilities are reporting a total of 238,342 customers currently without power. (9/5/04, 5:00 PM)
