As a result of a request for information not available in the NIC Information Center, I conducted a mini-survey of six separate states. The purpose was to find out who had jurisdiction for awarding presentence time served credits for sentenced offenders.

In all cases but one, the jurisdiction was the county, either through a county clerk to the prison or county clerk to the sentencing judge. The state officials I talked to indicated they were not aware of other types of practices in other states. Positions and phone numbers of people I contacted are as follows:
