

Bond Swamp is part of a system of more than 540 National Wildlife Refuges, which provide for the conservation and management of habitats to benefit fish and wildlife. The refuge strives to provide quality hunting and fishing opportunities when compatible with the refuge management objectives.

In 2000, through a partnership effort with the State of Georgia and the Ocmulgee Heritage Greenway, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service opened Bond Swamp National Wildlife Refuge to some compatible wildlife oriented recreational uses. Some of the approved recreational uses include hunting for white-tailed deer and feral hogs, fishing, wildlife observation through hiking, and environmental education.

The refuge is open to the public year round for visitation and pre-hunt scouting during day light hours, except during hunts. The Refuge is closed to non-hunters during hunts, with the exception of Brown's Mt. Brown's Mt. is open year round during daylight hours per refuge regulations, with the exception of hunting and fishing, which are prohibited. Public access is permitted only on the portion of the refuge that is located east of the Ocmulgee River in Bibb and Twiggs counties.

The refuge is primarily river swamp with creeks and sloughs traversing the entire area. When the Ocmulgee River overflows its banks, the flood plain may remain flooded for weeks. Access by vehicle and foot may be difficult. Portions of the refuge may be closed during periods of high water.

### Refuge Permits

**When signed, and in your possession, this brochure serves as your permit for sport fishing and all hunting.**

**Refuge permits are required for all hunters and fishermen and anyone who accompanies them. Permits are NOT transferable.** Additional permits may be obtained at the Stone Creek and Longleaf Pine Trail parking lots, the Piedmont Refuge headquarters in Jones County, or downloaded from the internet at [www.fws.gov/bondswamp](http://www.fws.gov/bondswamp).

### General Hunt Regulations

Public hunting is permitted on approximately 5,500 acres of the current 7,900 acres of Bond Swamp National Wildlife Refuge. Areas closed to public access are marked with signs and orange paint. The refuge boundary is marked with signs and yellow paint.

In addition to Federal regulations, State Game and Fish laws and regulations are adopted and in effect unless they have been further restricted by Federal law or regulations. Licenses, permits, all hunting and fishing equipment and effects, and vehicles or other conveyances are subject to inspection by Federal and State officers.

**A refuge hunt permit is required for all hunters who enter the hunt area during refuge hunts.**

**Hunter access is permitted from 4 am to one hour after sunset during open seasons.**

**Persons possessing, transporting, or carrying firearms on National Wildlife Refuges must comply with all provisions of state and local law. Persons may only use (discharge) firearms in accordance with refuge regulations (50 CFR 27.42 and specific refuge regulations in 50 CFR Part 32).**

All harvested game must be reported at check station before leaving the refuge.

At least 500 square inches of hunter orange is required to be worn as an outer garment above the waist during all hunts.

All refuge lands on the west side of the Ocmulgee River are closed to all public entry. Hunting is not permitted on Brown's Mt.

### Hunter Education/Children

Hunters ages 16-25 must possess the hunter education certificate while hunting. Children age 15 and under must remain within sight and normal voice contact of an adult age 21 or older possessing a valid hunting or fishing license to hunt or fish on the refuge. One adult may supervise no more than one youth hunter during refuge firearm hunts.

### Deer Hunting

Harvested deer must be recorded on the hunter's state harvest record at the site of kill.

### Hog Hunting

Feral hogs may be harvested during the refuge archery season with archery equipment only.

Firearm hunting for feral hogs follows State of Georgia Deer firearms restrictions except buckshot is prohibited. Legal firearms include center-fire rifles, shotgun with slugs, muzzle loader and archery equipment.

### Tree Stands/Hunting Blinds

Tree stands/hunting blinds may be placed the day prior to each hunt and must be removed by 11 am the day after the hunt.

### ATV's

Use of ATV's is prohibited except by disabled hunters (wheel-chair bound for mobility) with a refuge Special Use Permit. Contact the Piedmont Refuge office for information.

### Boats

Boat launching is permitted at Stone Creek Boat Launch and on refuge roads during high water. Gasoline motors are not permitted.

After launching boats at the Stone Creek parking area, vehicles and trailers must be parked in the parking lot.

State boating laws and equipment requirements are in effect.

### Sport Fishing

Fishing is open **March 15 through October 15, from sunrise to sunset.**

Fishing is permitted in all areas not designated as closed.

Fishing is not permitted on Brown's Mt.

Species limits: same as State regulations except largemouth bass must be 14 inches in length to keep.

Fishermen may use only rod and reel or pole and line to fish.

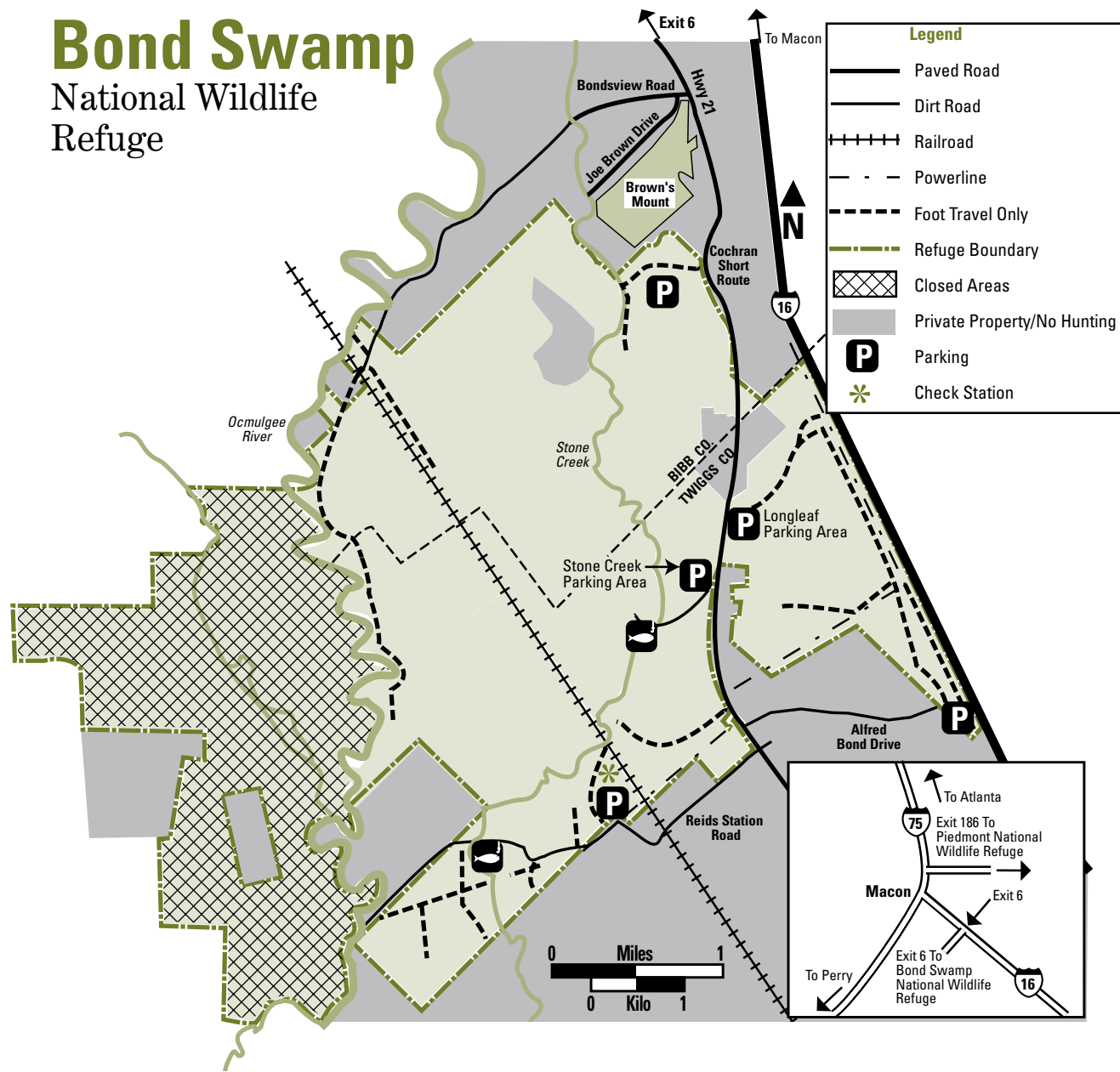
Fishermen may not possess, place or throw feeds to attract fish

### General Prohibited Activities

- Taking, collecting, or disturbing any artifact, property, plant, wildlife, or part thereof, other than that specifically permitted by refuge regulation
- Possession or use of alcoholic beverages
- Driving metal objects into trees or hunting from a tree in which metal objects have been driven
- Marking trails with flagging, blazing, painting, paper, trash or other devices
- Walking, hunting, fishing, or trespassing on the railroad right-of-way
- Entering the refuge during firearm hunts without refuge hunting permit.
- Possess or hunt with buckshot
- Hunting or shooting from or within 50 yards of a road open to vehicle travel or 200 yards of a building
- Target shooting
- Off road vehicle travel
- Use of ATVs or other off road vehicles
- Leaving vehicles or trailers on refuge overnight
- Blocking refuge road, boat ramp or gate with vehicles or vehicle travel around a closed gate
- Disturbing, annoying or interfering with other persons
- Open fires
- Unleashed pets
- Removing live hogs from refuge
- Hunting with or by aid of dogs
- Littering
- Horses or mules
- Camping
- Man-drives for deer or feral hogs
