IMPORTANT NOTE ON THE CURRENCY OF THIS REGIONAL POLICY

This PPM is based on current regulatory and policy considerations, which may change from time to time based on statutory changes and case law. Moreover, certain resource categories are affected by state laws as much as Federal. The FAA will make all reasonable efforts to keep this regional policy current. However, sponsors and their consultants are urged to verify the currency of referenced documents, particularly in cases where the FAA is not the designated oversight agency and/or the proposed project may impact the associated resource.

Background

To reduce unnecessary paperwork, Council on Environmental Quality regulation 40 CFR 1500.4(p) allows for the exemption of certain categories of actions from NEPA Environmental Impact Statement requirements. Specifically, 40 CFR 1508.4 defines categorical exclusions as categories of actions that do not individually or cumulatively have significant effects on the human environment and which have been found to have no effect in procedures adopted by the federal agency.

In developing categorically excluded actions, each Federal agency must consider extraordinary circumstances in which a normally excluded action may have a significant environmental effect.

Accordingly, it shall be the policy of the Airports Division, Great Lakes Region that any Airports District Office (ADO) reviewing Federal Actions for compliance with NEPA shall evaluate the applicability of a categorical exclusion, using this PPM and the applicable checklist components to make and document its determination.

In addition, ADOs must provide written notification to the sponsor, in accordance with FAA Order 5050.4B, paragraph 608, which states in part that:

Via a dated email or letter, the responsible FAA official must notify the airport sponsor, that FAA has or has not categorically excluded a proposed action. This ensures the airport sponsor knows that FAA has met the requirements of NEPA and that FAA has addressed all associated extraordinary circumstances applicable to a proposed action. The responsible FAA official must place proof of notice in the project file. If the FAA cannot categorically exclude an action, the responsible FAA official should explain why.

Categorical Exclusion (CATEX) Actions

According to FAA Order 1050.1E, paragraph 303b, the FAA has classified the following functions as categorically excluded types of actions:

- 1. Administrative/General: Actions that are administrative or general in nature;
- 2. Certification: Actions concerning issuance of certificates or compliance with certification programs;
- 3. Equipment and Instrumentation: Actions involving installation, repair, or upgrade of equipment or instruments necessary for operations and safety;
- 4. Facility Siting, Construction, and Maintenance: Actions involving acquisition, repair, replacement, maintenance, or upgrading of grounds, infrastructure, buildings, structures, or facilities that generally are minor in nature;
- 5. Procedural: Actions involving establishment, modification, or application of airspace and air traffic procedures; or
- 6. Regulatory: Actions involving compliance with, or exemptions to, regulatory programs or requirements.

Under FAA Order 1050.1E, paragraph 303c, FAA may categorically exclude actions listed in paragraphs 307 through 312 of that Order. In categorically excluding an action, FAA meets its NEPA responsibilities. This allows the appropriate FAA official to determine if FAA should approve or fund that action without requiring further environmental documentation or processes.

Some actions that would normally be categorically excluded could require additional environmental analysis to determine whether the proposed action involves extraordinary circumstances. Extraordinary circumstances (as specifically described in FAA Order 1050.1E, paragraph 304 and FAA Order 5050.4B paragraph 606) exist when the proposed action may have a significant effect and involves any of the following resources or issues:

The FAA will update that reference document periodically as required; please note the date indicating its most recent update.

The CATEX Short Form (Appendix B) shall be used only for administrative and certification actions, equipment acquisition, instrumentation and planning-related activities as defined in FAA Order 1050.1E, paragraphs 307, 308, and 309.

The CATEX Long Form (Appendix C) may generally be used for actions involving acquisition, repair, replacement, maintenance, or upgrading of grounds, infrastructure, buildings, structures, or facilities that are generally minor in nature as defined in FAA Order 1050.1E, paragraph 310.

The CATEX Long Form is designed to prompt consideration of the full range of

environmental issues, regulatory processes, potential impacts, and extraordinary circumstances that must be considered before deciding to support a categorical exclusion. It is not intended to serve as the sole documentation in this decision. An indication of "Yes" on any single issue or factor may not necessarily preclude a categorical exclusion; however, in general, a "Yes" indication will prompt the need for additional documentation before issuing a categorical exclusion finding.

Under no circumstances does this PPM or the CATEX Long Form eliminate the need for full and proper documentation, agency coordination, any required Federal or state environmental or other permits, or full compliance with all applicable Federal and state laws, regulations and policies.

Planning Documentation

Before proceeding with any environmental review process (including a proposed CATEX), it is crucial that all associated planning be completed to the fullest extent possible. If the project plans or justification change after environmental review has begun, it could be necessary to restart the environmental review process.
