

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eterans are valuable and needed members of the American workforce. The U.S. Department of Labor wants to ensure that current and former military personnel have access to the career tools necessary to find good jobs with good wages and career pathways — especially after returning home from combat. The Key to Career Success campaign is designed to connect veterans with workforce services that can be secured through One-Stop Career Centers in communities so veterans can access high quality employment and training services.

HOW DOES A VETERAN FIND A LOCAL ONE-STOP CAREER CENTER?

Enclosed is the Key to Career Success card that will help locate the nearest One-Stop Career Center in a local community. There are currently more than 3,000 One-Stop Career Centers across the United States.

The U.S. Department of Labor sponsors two tools to help veterans find a local One-Stop Career Center. America's Service Locator, **www.servicelocator.org**, locates the closest One-Stop Career Center by entering a zip code. Once a One-Stop Career Center has been located, a map and driving directions can be downloaded.

As an alternative, veterans can call the Toll-Free Help Line at **1-877-US2-JOBS** (TTY: **1-877-889-5627)**. Help Line staff can provide a referral to a local One-Stop Career Center, as well as help with employment and training related questions.

HOW DOES A VETERAN USE THE KEY CARD AT THE ONE-STOP CAREER CENTER?

Once a One-Stop Career Center has been located, the Key to Career Success card can unlock a veteran's career potential. One-Stop Career Center staff are ready to serve veterans and their family members through an exciting array of career and supportive services including:

- Skills assessment and interest surveys;
- Career guidance;
- Job search assistance:
- Skills training for high-demand jobs in a local community;
- Child care; and
- Transportation.

One-Stop Career Center staff will ensure that veterans receive the highest priority of service as highly valued members of American society.

WHAT OTHER VETERAN SERVICES ARE AVAILABLE?

One-Stop Career Center staff can also assist veterans in applying the valuable skills and training acquired during military service and translating those skills into civilian employment positions. Also, many One-Stop Career Centers offer relocation assistance.

WHAT RESOURCES ARE AVAILABLE TO HELP MILITARY SPOUSES/FAMILIES?

Frequent permanent changes of station (PCS) moves associated with the military lifestyle create challenges for spouses and family members, including maintaining stable careers and job tenure and obtaining and receiving training and education. It is critical to provide military spouses with the best available tools to aid them in their search for employment. One-Stop Career Centers are also prepared to offer services and special programs targeted to meet their specific employment needs.
