Irwin Army Community Hospital (IACH):

- Right-sizing Healthcare Delivery for Fort Riley
- Irwin Army Community Hospital (IACH) continues to identify access and implement supportive measures to provide access to care to the Central Flint Hills Region.
- According to Col. Jeffrey Johnson, IACH commander, the need for 383 additional positions has been identified to meet the demands of a growing community.
- "Between 2005 and 2011, Fort Riley's healthcare eligible population will increase by 59 percent," said Col. Jeffrey Johnson, IACH Commander. "We plan to right-size our organization to marry the network capacity by establishing sufficient infrastructure and capacity, investing in personnel, renovating facilities and implementing community outreach programs," Johnson continued.
- IACH's goal is to provide a full spectrum of services. "Focus areas for staffing increases include 38 primary care positions, 34 specialty care positions, 125 behavioral health positions and 166 support staff positions," said Johnson. Included in the original proposal, IACH has hired a full-time healthcare recruiter to assist with recruitment efforts while addressing hiring sensitivities for surrounding communities. Behavioral Health staff increases will allow IACH to see not only Active Duty Service Members, but retirees and Family Members. The Army Substance Abuse Program staff will increase to decrease wait times for appointments. Of the 383 positions identified, 142 have been hired.
- The Warrior Transition Battalion continues to be the number one priority of IACH.
 Construction of the WTB complex is on schedule with an estimated completion date of
 spring 2010. Other facility community projects with 2010 completion dates include a Soldier
 Family Care Clinic, a Traumatic Brain Injury Clinic and Automated Neuropsychological
 Assessment Metrics Testing Site. The new hospital is estimated for completion by the fall of
 2013.

Health Beginnings Class

- After receiving the exciting news of your pregnancy, the OB/GYN clinic at IACH invites you
 to our Healthy Beginnings class. During this time, participants will have the opportunity to
 informally ask questions and address concerns specific to their special pregnancy.
- IACH hosts Healthy Beginnings Classes for Soldiers and beneficiaries with positive pregnancy tests. The classes, held for information purposes, are for those who are waiting on their first scheduled OB appointment. During this informal class, topics of discussion include medication safety during pregnancy, exercise and smoking cessation.
- We will also discuss The Parent Review (TPR) & Centering Pregnancy programs and assist you in signing up, if interested. The Parent Review provides continued, centralized education for patients to increase healthy pregnancies and decrease preterm labor. It is an innovative communication tool used to foster consistent contact. Centering Pregnancy® brings prenatal care into a group space where women receive education and support. The centering approach offers an alternative to the traditional molds of exam room appointments for pre-natal care. It challenges women to take responsibility for their own health. The classes held on the 2nd and 4th Wednesday of each month at 1:30pm on the third floor of IACH in the back of the OB/GYN clinic. Staff Judge Advocate:

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 Money Back for New Vehicle Purchases

Overview:

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act permits taxpayers to take a deduction for state and local sales and excise taxes paid on the purchase of new cars, light trucks, motor homes and motorcycles. Consumers who are considering buying a new car may find that this tax incentive means there may have never been a better time to buy.

Here are seven things you should know about this new deduction:

State and local sales taxes paid on up to \$49,500 of the purchase price of qualifying vehicles are deductible.

- 1. Qualified motor vehicles generally include new (not used) cars, light trucks, motor homes and motorcycles.
- 2. Purchases must occur after Feb. 16, 2009, and before Jan. 1, 2010.
- 3. This deduction can be taken regardless of whether or not you itemize other deductions on your tax return.
- 4. Taxpayers will claim this deduction when filing their 2009 federal income tax return next year
- 5. The amount of the deduction is phased out for taxpayers whose modified adjusted gross income is between \$125,000 and \$135,000 for individual filers and between \$250,000 and \$260,000 for joint filers.
- 6. The deduction may not be taken on 2008 tax returns.

Questions and Answers:

- **Q.** What are considered to be "qualified motor vehicles" for the purpose of this deduction?
- **A.** A qualified motor vehicle is a passenger automobile, light truck or motorcycle which has a gross vehicle weight rating of 8,500 pounds or less. A motor home is also considered a qualified motor vehicle.
- **Q.** If I purchase a really expensive car, can I deduct the entire amount of state and local sales taxes paid on the vehicle?
- **A.** No, only state and local sales taxes paid on up to \$49,500 of the purchase price of a qualifying vehicle are deductible.
- **Q.** Does the purchase of a used car qualify for this deduction?
- **A.** No. In order to take the deduction, you must be the first owner of the vehicle.
- Q. Do I have to itemize in order to take this deduction?
- **A.** No. Anyone who qualifies can take this deduction. You will claim this deduction when filing your 2009 federal income tax return in 2010. There will be a line on the 2009 tax forms, just follow the instructions.
- **Q.** What about those 2008 models still sitting on the lot can I claim the deduction if I purchase one of last year's models?
- **A.** Yes, you can take the deduction as long as you are the vehicle's first owner.
- **Q.** At what income does the deduction fully phase out?
- **A.** The amount of the deduction is phased out for taxpayers whose modified adjusted gross income is between \$125,000 and \$135,000 for individual filers and between \$250,000 and \$260,000 for joint filers.
- **Q.** What if my state doesn't have a sales tax?
- **A.** Purchases made in states without a sales tax such as Alaska, Delaware, Hawaii, Montana, New Hampshire and Oregon can also qualify for the deduction. Taxpayers in states without a sales tax are entitled to deduct other qualifying fees or taxes imposed by the state or local government. The fees or taxes that qualify must be assessed on the purchase of the vehicle and must be based on the vehicle's sales price or as a per unit fee.

Q. Can I take the deduction for a second or third vehicle I purchase?

A. Yes. There is no limit on the number of cars for which you can claim the deduction, provided each car is a qualified vehicle under the law.

Q. Can I take this deduction for any qualified vehicle — even those made by foreign car companies?

A. Yes. As long as it is a new car and otherwise qualifies, you may take the deduction.

Important News

Post 9/11 GI Bill Transferability Policy Quick Reference

To be eligible to transfer Post 9/11 GI Bill benefits a Soldier must meet three requirements:

- 1. Be eligible for the Post 9/11 GI Bill.
- 2. Have at least 6 years of military service when the request to transfer benefits is submitted; all military service counts towards the six year requirement except time in the Individual Ready Reserves.
- 3. Not have an adverse action flag.

If all three requirements are met, a Soldier is eligible to submit a request to transfer benefits. Soldiers who transfer benefits incur an additional service obligation in accordance with the following rules:

Rule

Years of Service When Request is submitted

Additional Service Obligation

- 1. At least six years but less than 10 years. Four years from the date the request was submitted.
- 2. 10 or more years. Four years or up to Retention Control Point or Mandatory Retirement date from the date the request was submitted, whichever is less.

From 1 August 2009 until 1 August 2013, the below temporary rules for additional service obligation apply. Years of service for the temporary rules is always based on length of service as of 1 August 2009 regardless of when the request to transfer is submitted.

Rule

Years of Service as of 1 Aug 2009

Additional Service Obligation

- 1. 20 or more years. No additional service obligation.
- 2. Approved retirement with a date from 1 September 2009 through 1 June 2010. No additional service obligation.
- 3. 19 but less than 20 years. One year of service from the date the request was submitted.
- 4. 18 but less than 19 years. Two years of service from the date the request was submitted.
- 5. 17 but less than 18 years. Three years of service from the date the request was submitted. Eligible dependents are spouse and dependent children who are enrolled in DEERS and eligible for benefits under DEERS on the date the request to transfer is submitted. Dependents of dual military couples have to be sponsored by one Soldier but registered under both Soldiers.

Submitting a Request to Transfer Benefits

- 1. Using CAC card or DFAS pin, log on to the DoD Transferability of Education Benefits (TEB) web page located at https://www.dmdc.osd.mil/TEB/
- 2. The Soldier's name and Family Members who are eligible for benefits under DEERS will be shown.
- 3. Soldiers must click all boxes to indicate that they have read and understand each statement on the transfer request page. Soldiers who are eligible for MGIB, REAP, or MGIB-SR benefits are required to make an irrevocable decision to convert from one of those education benefit programs to the Post 9/11 GI Bill. Submission of a request to transfer benefits is considered an irrevocable conversion from one of these three programs to the Post 9/11 GI Bill. For those Soldiers who are not eligible for one of these three programs, all statements on the transfer page regarding conversion from these three programs do not apply. However, those Soldiers must still mark those statements.
- 4. To transfer benefits to an eligible dependent, click the edit button on their name line. (If the dependent name is grayed out or the edit button does not work, it means that dependent is not eligible for DEERS benefits and thus is not eligible to receive transferred benefits.)
- a. List the number of months of benefits to transfer to that dependent.
- b. Select the start date you want the dependent to be able to use transferred benefits. You can use either the calendar on the page or type in the start date. Format for date is YYYY-MM-DD. If you type in the date, be sure to use the dashes. When selecting the start date, remember that the VA will not pay benefits to a dependent prior to that date.
- c. Select the end date after which your dependent can no longer use transferred benefits. Select this date carefully. After this date the VA will not pay benefits to a dependent even if the dependent has months of benefits remaining. When selecting this date consider that a spouse can use benefits up to 15 years after you leave active duty and that children can use the benefits up to their twenty-sixth birthday.
- d. After you have filled in the number of months to transfer to the dependent and selected the start and end dates, hit the save button. Make sure revoke is not checked unless it is your intent to revoke benefits transfer.

- e. After the request is submitted, the TEB site will return to the original page with all your eligible dependents. To transfer benefits to another dependent, repeat the above steps. Remember the total months you can transfer to your dependents can be no more than 36 months or the number of months of Post 9/11 GI Bill benefits to which you are entitled, whichever is less.
- 5. After you have completed your request to transfer benefits, in the upper left corner of the TEB site, you will see your name, status submitted, and the date of status will be blank. The TEB site does track the date submitted and the certifying official will see it. You will not receive any confirmation number or any electronic message. Confirmation that your request has been submitted is the status submitted as shown on the TEB site.
- 6. To track the status of your request, you will have to return to the TEB page and monitor the status.
- 7. After the request is submitted, it will enter a queue of submitted requests. Currently, the certification site does not allow certification officials to retrieve a specific request. System upgrades are being made and it is expected that certification officials will be able to process specific requests by the last week of July. In the meantime, requests are being processed as quickly as possible within current system limitations. After a request is approved, the status of your request will change to approved and the date of status will be the date you submitted your request.
- 8. Once your request is approved, your dependent has to submit a request for a certificate of eligibility to the VA. They must submit a VA Form 22-1990e. The VA Form 22-1990e is not on the VA's VONAPP site. They expect to have the VA Form 22-1990e on the VONAPP page by 17 July 2009. Once it is on the VONAPP site, it can be completed and submitted to the VA electronically. The link to the VA VONAPP website is at http://vabenefits.vba.va.gov/vonapp/main.asp. A hard copy of the VA Form 22-1990e is at http://www.vba.va.gov/pubs/forms/VBA-22-1990e-ARE.pdf. This form has to be mailed in and it recommends additional information be submitted with the form. The recommended additional information is not required. The TEB site will automatically transfer the data to the VA which is
- 9. After the dependent receives the VA certificate of eligibility, it must be presented to the school. The school will have to complete a VA Form 22-1999 which will be sent to the VA. If the school is participating in the Yellow Ribbon Program and your dependent has received Yellow Ribbon Program funds from the school, the school needs to indicate that on the VA Form 22-1999 prior to sending to the VA.
- 10. Tuition funds will be sent direct from the VA to the school. Children using transferred benefits will receive the monthly living stipend and the books and supplies stipend. Spouses using transferred benefits will only receive the monthly living stipend and the books and supplies stipend if they use the benefits after you separate from active duty.

Post 9/11 GI Bill Estimator

This estimator tool is very important. Soldiers and veterans alike need to be reminded that once they elect to convert to the Post 9/11 GI Bill (e.g., by filling out a VA-Form 22-1990 OR submitting the TEB (Transferability of Education Benefits) application, they are making an irrevocable decision to convert from their current GI Bill to the Post 9/11 GI Bill. There are numerous instances in which an individual is better off by NOT converting to the Post 9/11 GI Bill.

• Change to Upfront Tuition Assistance (TA) for all GoArmyEd Schools

Effective 1 Oct 09, Army will pay TA directly to all accredited colleges and universities in

GoArmyEd, both Letter of Instruction (LOI) schools and Non-LOI schools. Currently, Active Duty

Soldiers attending Non-LOI schools use www.goarmyed.com to submit their TA reimbursement
requests, but pay their tuition directly to the school. Beginning 1 Oct 09, these Soldiers will

receive TA upfront with the Army paying tuition directly to the school.

Registering in GoArmyEd

Effective 1 April, Department of the Army (ACES) and Army Education Services completely transitioned to the GoArmyEd portal. That means all Soldiers (regardless of rank) must establish an account in GoArmyEd to receive education services. The services include on-duty military programs like GT Improvement, Leadership Development, Army Personnel testing, In- and Out-Processing, and college enrollments.

Soldiers must go to www.goarmyed.com and click on the "New User" tab to establish an account. You will be asked to change your password, and then complete the "Required In-Processing Steps" to finish the process.

If you have problems or decide not to pre-register, you will have to complete these steps the next time you visit one of our centers.

• Troops to Teachers Helps Soldiers Transition to the Classroom

The Troops to Teachers (TTT) program enriches the quality of the American education by helping to place and retain mature, motivated, experienced and dedicated personnel in our nation's classrooms. Thousands of current and former military personnel are discovering new and rewarding careers in teaching, helping to build and sustain our nation's communities. Military members with at least six years of service and a bachelor's degree may be eligible for financial assistance through the Troops to Teachers program. Eligible military members can receive up to a \$5,000 stipend for educational expenses to obtain a teacher's license. Additionally, eligible military members who work in a low-income school for at least three years may receive a \$10,000 bonus. If a military member accepts the \$5,000 stipend they are only eligible to receive a \$5,000 bonus so the maximum financial assistance available through Troops to Teachers is \$10,000. • Buyer Beware "Diploma Mills"

GoArmyEd wants students to be cautious of "Diploma Mills." These are schools that offer certificates, degrees and diplomas for a fee. These schools are not accredited by an accrediting body recognized by the Department of Education. Tuition Assistance is not approved, promotion points are not authorized, and the credentials will not be posted to Official Military Personnel Records (OMPF) from these agencies. Soldiers can confirm the status of a school by checking the list of approved schools in GoArmyEd, contacting the local Army Education Center or the Personnel Administration Center. Furthermore, if it is found that a fraudulent diploma has been entered onto the OMPF the action is punishable administratively under UMCJ.

While only active duty military personnel living on the installation may dropoff items, any government ID cardholder may pick-up items. Examples of products the facility accepts (and offers for pick up)-cleaning products, paints, disinfectants, drain openers, insecticides, automotive fluids, and mothballs.
