The Environmental Division, Directorate of Public Works posted the annual Consumer Confidence Report (CCR) on the internet at www.riley.army.mil. Fort Riley, like other public water suppliers, is required to provide this information based on Safe Drinking Water Act requirements. The CCR is a means to raise consumers' awareness of what is involved in the delivery of safe drinking water, the sources of their drinking water and the importance of source water protection. ## **ASE Registration:**

The National Institute for Automotive Service Excellence (ASE) has been a DANTES-funded program since the early 1990s. The ASE program began as a credit-by-examination initiative that offered American Council on Education (ACE) recommended credit for automotive mechanics interested in obtaining a college degree. Over the years, the program grew in popularity and drew more military candidates interested in obtaining the recognized certification credentials associated with the occupation.

Paper/Pencil ASE exams are conducted twice a year at over 750 locations around the country and are administered by ACT, known for its academic and occupational testing programs. DANTES Test sites also administer these exams; however, you must register well in advance and pay the registration fee of \$36. Active Duty, Reserve and Guard personnel are eligible for three funded ASE tests ONLY AT DANTES Test Sites. The non refundable registration fee is

\$36 and covers the cost of three regular ASE exams. Most regular and recertification ASE exams cost \$30; the Advanced (L1, L2) exams cost \$60. DANTES does not fund any recertification or advanced examinations.

DANTES will no longer fund this program after the May 2011 administration cycle. Test Centers will still be able to administer the ASE tests. Interested military personnel will fill out and submit the appropriate ASE paperwork along with a check, money order or credit card that covers their registration and all examination fees (regular and recertification).

The registration window will be open **until March 15, 2011**. Please stop by the Main Post education center, Bldg., 217 or call (785) 239-6481 and speak with an education counselor for further registration details. The semi-annual Automotive Service Excellence (ASE) certification exam will be administered on May 5, 10, and 12, 2011 at Education Services, Bldg 217. DANTES will fund three \$30 exams for the last time during this test cycle for Active Duty, Reserve and National Guard personnel.

## English as a Second Language (ESL):

Barton Community College is now offering ESL classes for Active Duty Soldiers and Family Members. The class will provide beginning English language learners with an integrated English communication experience. Students will develop skills in speaking, listening, reading and writing. Areas of study and practice will include commonly-used sounds; essential academic and social vocabulary; simple sentence structure; simple paragraphing; conversation; reading aloud; and public speaking. The class will also address cultural differences, coping skills, and study skills.

As student language skills improve, students will work to improve their pronunciation, listening and reading comprehension, understanding of progressive and perfect verb tenses, public speaking effectiveness, sentence variety, and paragraph development. Students will work toward greater fluency in Standard English. Areas of concentration will include accent reduction, vocabulary building, use of phrasal verbs, understanding of active and passive voice, and basic essay skills.

The classes will coincide with the regular Leaders Skills Enhancement Courses (LSEC) schedule cycles. The class will be 45 minutes of lecture with practical exercises followed by a one hour lab and practical exercise. Classes will be in a classroom setting where students and instructors will be able to practice their communication skills. The student will be evaluated on communication development and can continue in additional ESL classes
