U = Unprotected; any number of individuals can be taken, any time of the year (hunting, trapping or fishing license may or may not be required)

The column labeled 'US' lists the USFWS designations:

- E = Federally Endangered
- T = Federally Threatened
- C = Federal Candidate Species
- D = Endemic to NE Region

The column labeled 'Other Regions' lists other ARMI Regions:

- UM = Upper Mississippi
  - LM = Lower Mississippi
  - SE = Southeast
  - RM = Rocky Mountain
  - PNW = Pacific Northwest
  - SW = Southwest
