

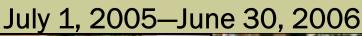

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Statewide Evaluation Activities



"Individuals who received occupational skill training and/or attained a diploma or degree were more likely to have positive outcomes."

In Program Year (PY) 2005, the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services (ODJFS), Office of Research, Assessment and Accountability (ORAA), completed three distinct but interrelated evaluation studies designed to identify and promote methods for continuously improving the activities and services of its workforce investment system. This research effort

included an outcome evaluation, a process evaluation, and an impact study, all of which were conducted by Strategic Research Group (SRG). The results from the studies will be used to improve program performance and to meet federal requirements. Section 136 of the Workforce Investment Act (WIA) mandates that states which receive WIA funds must conduct evaluation studies of

their workforce investment systems. To meet federal requirements, Ohio implemented a comprehensive research approach formulated to measure state workforce investment activities under WIA. The following summaries reflect findings reported in the recently completed studies.

Outcome Evaluation

evidenced by increased
employment and
employment retention
rates. Additionally,
results show that
individuals who
received occupational
skill training and/or
attained a diploma or

degree were more likely to have positive outcomes. The study also reveals that minorities were the demographic group least likely to have successful education and employment outcomes.



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Process Evaluation

The Process Evaluation provides an assessment of the effectiveness and efficiency of Ohio's PY 2002 WIA program through 20 case study sites. It examines a number of key issues, including WIA program governance, customers' awareness and usage of services, and challenges associated with the implementation of a One-Stop Delivery System. It identifies the successes, best practices, and barriers associated with administering the WIA program in Ohio.

In general, the

evaluators found a high level of satisfaction among Ohio's WIA customers. Results from the study show that the availability of helpful and knowledgeable WIA staff assistance was key to obtaining and accessing information. The evaluation results suggest that the most successful local youth programs were those that had an excellent partnership with schools and social service agencies. Successful local WIA programs were also found to have a higher percentage of customers who

received training services.

Several recommendations emerged from the **Process Evaluation** including: 1) the need for the state to provide more timely and accurate technical assistance and policy guidance to the local areas; 2) the need to increase customer awareness of services at the local level by improving marketing strategies; and 3) the need to improve the state's role and responsibilities to the locals through better integration of its WIA program staff.



Impact Evaluation

The Impact Evaluation addresses four primary objectives: 1) determining the impact of the program on exiter human capital and economic measures; 2) assessing the long-term impact the WIA program has on individuals who have exited from the WIA program; 3)

assessing the return on investment from WIA funds; and 4) builds on the results from the Outcome and Process Evaluations. It takes a look at participants who exited the WIA program between January through December 2004, participated in the state's customer

satisfaction survey, and tracks their outcomes 12 to 24 months after program exit. Like the Outcome Evaluation, results show that customers who exited the program tend to not only have high employment rates, but tend to retain employment.

Program Year 2005 Cost Effectiveness Analysis

In PY 2005, Ohio served 36,213 participants at an average cost of \$3,303. As shown below, the state expended \$119,626,612 on core, intensive, and training services for the three WIA population groups. This amount includes obligatory expenses for participants in WIA programs, but does not include local administrative expenses, rapid response, or statewide activities.

Ohio expended an average of \$2,686 per adult, \$3,732 per dislocated worker, and \$3,834 per youth. The state placed 4,313 adults and 2,966 dislocated workers into unsubsidized employment at an average cost per placement of \$10,023. Additionally, the state assisted 8,721 youth obtain skill upgrades, credentials, and diplomas at an average cost per positive outcome of \$5,352.
