The U.S. Department of Labor today announced a \$2,000,000 grant to provide approximately 1,800 jobless workers with partial premium payments for health insurance coverage. "The challenges associated with a job search are enough without worrying about a lack of health insurance if you or a family member fall ill or need medical attention," said Secretary of Labor Hilda L. Solis. "This funding will help eligible North Carolinians pay for health insurance while they seek out new careers that pay family-supporting wages and provide benefits for the long-term."
