March 17, 2010 3:30 – 4:30 pm	Gregg Weltz Division Chief	On March 17, 2010, Gregg Weltz, Chief of the Division of Youth Services, was invited by Aaron Ver of the U.S. Department of Labor, Office of Congressional and Intergovernmental Affairs (OCIA), to attend a meeting with Mayor Robert J. Duffy and Deputy Mayor Patricia K. Maligeri of Rochester, New York. They were accompanied by Ken Brown, a registered Federal lobbyist with the Ferguson Group, LLC. Also in attendance were Elmy A. Bermejo, Director of Intergovernmental Affairs for OCIA, and MaryAnn Donovan, Employment and Training Administration (ETA), Office of Policy Development and Research. The Mayor came to discuss the low graduation rate within the City of Rochester and the need for after school and summer youth employment programs to help with this issue. Mayor Duffy described recent efforts in Rochester to provide summer and after school youth employment opportunities, as well as programming for returning youth offenders, and sought ideas on how he could continue to build on the success of the programs that they had recently implemented, some of which were funded under the Recovery Act. Information about the 15% state-wide activities funds under the Workforce Investment Act (WIA) was provided, as was recently released ETA guidance encouraging states and local areas to partner with the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) Emergency Funding Programs to provide subsidized employment opportunities for youth. In addition, information was shared about the upcoming release of ETA's program evaluation of the 2009 Recovery Act Summer Youth Employment Program implementation.
