Definitions of MH RRTPs

MH RRTP provides residential rehabilitative and clinical care to eligible Veterans who have a wide range of problems, illnesses, or rehabilitative care needs which can be mental health, SUD, co-morbid medical, homelessness, vocational, educational, or social. The term MH RRTP refers to the bed category and includes the following models:

- a. <u>Domiciliary Residential Rehabilitation Treatment Programs (DRRTP).</u> A DRRTP provides a residential level of care for Veteran populations including medical, psychiatric, SUD, PTSD, and homelessness. DRRTPs provide a 24-hours-per-day, 7 days-per-week, (24/7) structured and supportive residential environment as a part of the rehabilitative treatment regime. DRRTPs are larger residential programs with multiple units serving various patient populations.
- b. <u>Domiciliary Care for Homeless Veterans (DCHV).</u> A DCHV provides a residential level of care for a homeless Veteran population. DCHVs provide a 24/7 structured and supportive residential environment as a part of the rehabilitative treatment regime.
- c. <u>Health Maintenance Domiciliary.</u> Health Maintenance Domiciliary beds provide a residential level of care for Veteran populations including medical, psychiatric, SUD, PTSD, and homelessness. Health Maintenance Domiciliary beds provide a structured and supportive residential environment 24/7 as a part of the rehabilitative treatment regime. Health Maintenance Domiciliary beds focus on symptom reduction and stabilization as part of the rehabilitative approach to facilitating community integration.
- d. <u>General Domiciliary (General Dom) or Psychosocial Residential</u>
 <u>Rehabilitation Treatment Programs (PRRTP).</u> These programs provide a residential treatment level of care for a general Veteran population including medical, psychiatric, SUD, PTSD, and homelessness. General Doms and PRRTPs provide a 24/7 structured and supportive residential environment as a part of the rehabilitative treatment regime.
- e <u>Domiciliary PTSD</u> (Dom PTSD) or <u>Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder</u> <u>Residential Rehabilitation Treatment Program (PTSD-RRTP).</u> These programs provide a residential level of care to Veterans with PTSD including Military Sexual Trauma (MST). Both Dom PTSD and PTSD-RRTP provide a 24/7 structured and supportive residential environment as a part of the PTSD rehabilitative treatment regime.
- f. <u>Domiciliary</u> SA (Dom SA) or <u>Substance Abuse Residential</u>
 <u>Rehabilitation Treatment Program (SARRTP).</u> These programs provide a residential level of care to Veterans with Substance Use Disorders. *NOTE:*

SUDs encompass the family of alcohol and other drug-use illnesses that meet diagnostic criteria according to the <u>Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders</u>, Fourth Edition (DSM-IV). Dom SA and SARRTP provide a 24/7 structured and supportive residential environment as a part of the SUD rehabilitative treatment regime.

g. <u>Compensated Work Therapy (CWT)-Transitional Residence (TR).</u> A general CWT-TR is not targeted exclusively for any particular mental health population and provides TR services. General CWT-TR offers therapeutic workbased residential rehabilitation services designed to facilitate successful community reintegration.
