	This laboratory studies staphylococcal, streptccoccal, and enterococcal factors that lead to production of toxic shock syndromes or endocarditis. Toxic shock syndromes by definition require hypotension/shock to be present for diagnosis, and thus, for our studies, we must allow progression to at least that point. The end point is failure of rabbits to exhibit escape behavior combined with inability to right themselves. This is particularly important to assess the protective ability of toxoid vaccines we have developed. At that time the animals are enthanized.

	There have been many published studies indicating pain relieving medications are in fact risk factors for development of toxic shock syndromes. Although the exact mechanism underlying the increased risk is unclear, there is evidence to suggest that the toxins have significant effects on the host nervous system, and thus may synergize with pain relieving medications. It is for this reason that we do not administer such medications in certain experiments.

	The study involving these animals was a non-clinical safety evaluation for an investigational new drug conducted under Good Laboratory Practices (GLP's). The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) and the International conference on Harmonization of Technical Requirements for Registration of Pharmaceuticals for Human Use (ICH) provided the guidelines and the recommendation that such non-clinical work be conducted prior to clinical (human testing). The test was a standardized Acute Dermal Limit Test to assess if the dose of the topical ointment was safe for use in human trials. The dose selected was not expected to cause severe irritation based on responses in similar studies on drugs of the same family. The study involved administration once of the topical drug to the clipped dorsal area of rabbits. Thereafter, observations were made at 2, 4, and 6 hours and minimally daily for 14 days. Observations to include animal health were made and the Laboratory Animal Veterinarian was in the loop pending any adverse effects. Contrary to expectations, a total of 3 rabbits exhibited moderate skin irritation at the drug site that was perceived to be painful given eschar formation. However, despite the appearance, it was noted that the animals exhibited no visible pain as indicated by scratching of the area nor giving special attention to the site.

Animals involved exhibited no other adverse signs. The sites were closely monitored during the natural recovery of the sites. The use of topical ointments or sedating the animals was not judged as being warranted given the transient nature of the condition and interference by topical or parenteral drugs with the natural recovery of the irritated skin.

	The study involving this animal was a pre-IND filing nonclinical pilot safety evaluation requested by the FDA to profile the toxicity of an intended dermal preparation. FDA wished to assess if the agent was absorbed over a large surface area of the body would it elicit any systemic safety sequelae. A small rangefinder study was conducted with I animal per dose in order to determine a dose range for a more definitive study requested by FDA in 2 species (rodent and non-rodent). The pig noted was the high dose animal. Prior studies had shown minimal signs with high dose dermal application except for some flu-like signs (in appetence and malaise). However, with repeated systemic (subcutaneous) dosing the animal became increasingly anorexic and had episodes of subnormal temperature and demonstrated a reluctance to move voluntarily. Veterinary staff provided close observations and supported the animal with special high caloric diet supplements but no therapeutic drugs. At the end of the dose period the animal had reached a state of complete anorexia and lethargy. The professional decision was made to humanely terminate the animal and conduct a gross and histopathological evaluation of tissues.

]	Previous studies using the agent in the intended form of a topical crème had resulted in minimal signs of in appetence

and some lethargy, thus, more extensive signs were somewhat unexpected. However, the dose level required to demonstrate systemic safety was recognized to be significant and, thus, end points in the protocol dictated veterinary intervention to include euthanasia if deemed warranted. During the decline of the animal, veterinary staff closely monitored the animal and felt that the animal was not experiencing any pain in its state of anorexia and lethargy. The animal continued to be well fleshed throughout the period of injections despite being anorexic. Injection sites had slight erythemia but were not painful to the touch nor did the animal exhibit any recognized signs of pain/distress. Following the last injection, the animal could have undergone some therapeutic treatment for the malaise; however, humane euthanasia was elected for the well-being of the animal and to determine if the high systemic dose had resulted in any organ dysfunction. The animal is included as a category D given presumed distress of an untreated flu-like state
