The Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee maintains approval of only two (2) exemptions to the Animal Welfare Act standards. These affect the psychological well-being program of primates. The details are provided below.

Squirrel monkeys on study are not provided manipulanda. The research goal is one of evaluating cortical maps post-lesioning. The investigator indicates that provision of manipulanda confounds experimental data by altering the repair/recovery process. Data include hand and arm functional readouts. The committee has approved exclusion of manipulanda from these monkeys.

New macaque arrivals are not provided Kong toys during their quarantine period. These monkeys have to be trained for cage change operations. The Kong toys interfere with squeeze back function, making the transfer more difficult. Kong toys and other maniplanda are restored as soon as the monkeys learn the cage change procedures.

No other exemptions to animal welfare standards are approved.
