There is one exception to the exercise plan for 12 dogs that has been approved by the IACUC. The dogs normally have access to outdoor dog runs on a daily basis with the exception of weekends and holidays when they are given access time permitting. The dogs are also provided exercise in an outdoor play yard in addition to a minimum of 30 minutes of exercise within the animal housing room at least once daily with the exception of weekends and holidays when they are released time permitting. For the collection of urine and feces, dogs in one particular study are confined in their cage with a stainless steel collection tray placed underneath the cage for 3-6 days. Feces are collected within the cage several times daily, urine is collected and measured daily. The cages provide the minimum amount of floor space required by the Animal Welfare Act and Regulations. During this time the dogs are each given individual human attention for a minimum of 15 minutes daily, and they are able to see other dogs. The dogs remain in their normal housing room to eliminate any potential distress that being moved out of their normal housing room might cause. Each dog has at least one enrichment item (chew-toy, hard ball, etc.) in its run at all times. Non-edible enrichment items are provided for each dog during critical collection periods. Enrichment items are rotated to keep them interesting to the dogs.
