Exports

- Of the 275,843 companies that exported in 2009, 25.5% were manufacturers, 33.9% were wholesalers, 37.6% were classified as other, and 2.9% were unclassified; 185,526 companies exported in both 2009 and 2008, while 90,317 companies only exported in 2009.
- The number of companies that exported to the Europe World Area decreased by 10.1% from 2008 to 2009, while the number of companies exporting to the OPEC World Area increased by 6.5% from 2008 to 2009.
- The percentage of exporting companies that exported to only 1 partner country stayed consistent from 2008 to 2009 (58.1% in 2008, 58.0% in 2009) and the percentage of known value they accounted for slightly increased (4.7% in 2008, 5.0% in 2009).
- The overall decrease in export known value from 2008 to 2009 was affected more by a decrease in multiple location companies' value (decreased 19.9%) than a decrease in single location companies' value (decreased 13.7%).
- Montana (decreased 17.9%), North Dakota (decreased 15.4%), and South Dakota (decreased 16.7%) showed the largest decreases in the number of exporting companies from 2008 to 2009.

Imports

- Of the 179,831 companies that imported in 2009, 19.6% were manufacturers, 45.6% were wholesalers, 33.3% were classified as other, and 1.5% were unclassified; 129,551 companies imported in both 2009 and 2008, while 50,280 companies only imported in 2009.
- The number of companies that imported from Venezuela decreased by 19.3% in 2009 from 2008 and the known value of Venezuela imports decreased by 38.1%.
- The percentage of importing companies that imported from only 1 partner country slightly increased from 2008 to 2009 (60.1% in 2008, 60.8% in 2009) and the percentage of known value they accounted for also slightly increased (4.1% in 2008, 4.4% in 2009).
- The top 250 importing companies accounted for 59.7% of the known import value, while the top 250 exporting companies accounted for almost half (49.4%) of the known export value in 2009.

Companies that both Imported and Exported

- Out of the 275,843 exporting companies and 179,831 importing companies, 78,940 companies both imported and exported in 2009.
- 10,998 U.S. companies both imported from and exported to China (\$186.7 billion in imports; \$45.5 billion in exports) in 2009.
