Global Alliance for Action for Drought Resilience and Growth

In April 2012, USAID, together with over 51 donor and international development partners, led the formation of the *Global Alliance for Action for Drought Resilience and Growth* in response to a call from Heads of State from East Africa's Intergovernmental Authority on Development (IGAD) to end recurrent drought emergencies in the Horn. The *Global Alliance* brings together relief and development actors and resources to take joint action in support of effective country-led plans, with an emphasis on building resilience and promoting economic growth in the Horn of Africa and the Sahel. USAID is serving as the "convener" for the Global Alliance.

The Global Alliance commits to support key priorities to advance the drought resilience agenda, including:



SUPPORT FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF COMMON PROGRAMMING FRAMEWORKS

The Country Programming Papers (CPPs) and the Regional Programming Framework (RPF) are country and region-led strategic documents that articulate a rationale and evidence for priority areas of effort and investment in the Horn. Members of the *Global Alliance* are actively engaged in supporting the development of these frameworks, including through technical support, consultations with governments, and assessment of the new CPPs and the RPF. These common frameworks are essential tools to advance the *Global Alliance*'s commitment to align programs, policies, and funding enabling mutual accountability between development partners and local leadership.

COMMON MONITORING AND EVALUATION FRAMEWORKS/KNOWLEDGE MANAGEMENT

A regional framework will incorporate results and key indicators common across the CPPs. **These indicators will enable countries and development partners to measure success against mutual commitments.** In addition, to promote knowledge management, the *Global Alliance* is committed to sharing best practices and information through the *Global Alliance* website. IGAD CAPACITY BUILDING

The Global Alliance is committed to strong African leadership and is working side-by-side with IGAD and regional organizations to help build capacity and ensure effective implementation of the drought resilience initiative.

Thanks to international, regional, and country-level coordination, the *Global Alliance* is already seeing results in East Africa. Kenya and Ethiopia have plans and structures in place to combat vulnerability and build resilience to the next drought. In addition to the development of technically rigorous CPPs:

- The **Government of Kenya** has established a National Drought Management Authority to lead and coordinate its country plan.
- The **Government of Ethiopia** is implementing new policies that prioritize early livestock interventions ahead of drought, including commercial de-stocking and fodder interventions.
