D.C. School Vouchers: Members voted, 225-195, to revive the District of Columbia's school-voucher program at a cost of \$100 million over five years in deficit spending. A yes vote was to fund scholarships enabling students to transfer from public to private schools in the D.C. area. (HR 471)

Mortgage Foreclosures: Members voted, 252-170, to repeal a two-year-old voluntary program that uses federal subsidies to induce banks to ease the terms of distressed mortgages before they reach foreclosure. A yes vote was to end the Home Affordable Modification Program. (HR 839)

Military Benefits: Members defeated, 185-238, a motion by Democrats to continue the Home Affordable Modification Program (HR 839, above) for active-duty military personnel and Gold Star families. A yes vote was to exempt those individuals from a bill to repeal a program that has fallen far short of expectations.
