## SUMMARY OF THE AMERICAN RECOVERY AND REINVESTMENT BILL

Summary: On February 12, 2009 the House passed the Conference bill for the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act by a vote of 246-183. The Senate passed the conference bill on February 13, 2009 by a vote of 60-38. The President signed the bill on February 17, 2009. A summary of the Interior programs funded in the bill includes:

#### Bureau of Land Management, Management of Lands and Resources \$125 million

Management of Lands and Resources funding for maintenance, rehabilitation, and restoration of facilities, property, trails and lands and for remediation of abandoned mines and wells.

#### Bureau of Land Management, Construction \$180 million

Construction funding for facility construction, reconstruction, decommissioning and repair of roads, bridges, trails, property, and facilities and for energy efficient retrofits of existing facilities.

# Bureau of Land Management, Wildland Fire Management \$15 million

Wildland Fire Management funding for hazardous fuels reduction projects on Federal lands.

Resource Management funding for deferred maintenance, construction, and capital improvement projects on National Wildlife Refuges and National Fish Hatcheries and for high priority habitat restoration projects.

#### Fish and Wildlife Service, Construction

\$115 million

Construction funding for construction, reconstruction, and repair of roads, bridges, property, and facilities and for energy efficient retrofits of existing facilities.

National Park Service, Operation of the National Park System

\$146 million

Operation of the National Park System funding for deferred maintenance of facilities and trails and for other critical repair and rehabilitation projects.

## National Park Service, Historic Preservation Fund

\$15 million

Historic Preservation Fund funding for historic preservation projects at historically black colleges and universities as authorized by the Historic Preservation Fund act of 1996.

## National Park Service, Construction

\$589 million

Construction funding for repair and restoration of roads, construction of facilities, including energy efficient retrofits of existing facilities; equipment replacement; preservation and repair of historical resources within the National Park System; cleanup of abandoned mine sites on park lands; and other critical infrastructure projects.

# U.S. Geological Survey, SIR

\$140 million

Surveys, Investigations, and Research funding for repair, construction and restoration of facilities, equipment replacement and upgrades including stream gages, and seismic and volcanic monitoring systems; national map activities; and other critical deferred maintenance and improvement projects.

#### Bureau of Indian Affairs, Operation of Indian Programs

\$40 million

Operation of Indian Programs funding for workforce training programs and the housing improvement program.

# Bureau of Indian Affairs, Construction

\$450 million

Construction funding for repair and restoration of roads; replacement school construction; school improvements and repairs; and detention center maintenance and repairs.

Bureau of Indian Affairs,	Indian Guaran	<u>iteed Loan Pro</u>	gram
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\$10 million

Indian Guaranteed Loan Program funding providing Federal guarantees for loans to Indian-owned businesses.

# Office of Inspector General

\$15 million

Office of Inspector General funding for oversight and audit of programs, grants, and projects funded in the Act

## Bureau of Reclamation – Water and Related Resources

\$1 billion

For water facilities, including \$50 million for the Central Utah Project Completion Act; \$50 million for California Bay-Delta Restoration Act projects and programs; \$60 million for rural water projects; \$10 million for bureau-wide inspection of canals in urbanized areas; and \$126 million for water reclamation and reuse projects.
