The University of North Texas is one of the largest universities in Texas and one of only nine in the United States enrolling more than 4,000 Hispanic students and more than 4,000 African-American students. In fall 2009, UNT led Texas in the number of Native American students. Diverse: Issues in Higher Education magazine ranked UNT 46th in the nation in the number of degrees awarded to minority students.

In fact, of the more than 36,000 attending UNT, more than 2,000 are international students who represent more than 125 countries.

This blend of cultures and beliefs provides the setting for an education that transcends textbooks and practical curricula. An open-minded, worldly perspective becomes increasingly important as technology makes communication between people, organizations and nations more instantaneous and seamless.

To nurture different cultures, interests and perspectives, UNT staff advises and assists approximately 400 registered student organizations on campus.

UNT's exceptional faculty also represents a broad diversity of backgrounds; one in four is an ethnic minority, and 38 percent are women. Like our students, the faculty brings a rich variety of experiences and perspectives to UNT, providing the components of a truly comprehensive education.



INSTITUTIONAL EQUITY AND DIVERSITY is available to all groups on campus. It provides assistance to those with sometimes unique perspectives and advocates an environment where different viewpoints are expressed respectfully. For example:

CAFÉ DIVERSITY is a monthly campus dialogue event, open to everyone, in which diversity is discussed in a setting that honors all opinions. Topics focus on a wide range of issues and often are sparked by current events. This forum engages students in an interactive learning experience.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT is a longstanding tradition at UNT. Equity and Diversity is committed to promoting strong partnerships with the Denton community and North Texas region, and toexploring similar opportunities around the world. Equity and Diversity aims to link faculty, staff and students to communities, thereby enhancing student learning and promoting civic engagement.

Our programs continue to grow and reach out to our expanding campus community. On behalf of the university, Equity and Diversity gratefully and proudly acknowledges those who share its vision and

contribute time, treasure and talent to its mission: providing a spark and a comprehensive education for those who will shape our world. These are some of the divisions current initiatives that will benefit from private support:

THE UNT MULTICULTURAL CENTER serves as a place where students and community members celebrate the variety and distinctiveness of the diversity on campus and throughout the geographical region. It is a place where we can learn from each other in an environment that welcomes all. We focus on five aspects of diversity: ethnicity, gender, religion, sexual orientation and disabilities.

SCHOLARSHIPS are more than financial assistance to our students who, along with their families, have made substantial sacrifices to earn a college education. Scholarships also provide incentive for success and show that others believe in their abilities and dreams. Equity and Diversity houses three scholarships open to all students, and all honoring diversity champions:

The A. Tennyson Miller and Joe L. Atkins 50th Anniversary of Desegregation Scholarship, named for two of the university's pioneering African-American students.

The Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual, Transgender and Ally Scholarship in Honor of Mary Finley and Dan Emenheiser recognizes two UNT staff members who co-founded UNTs Ally program.

The Legacy Scholarship was initiated by several African-American UNT alumni. The Legacy Scholarship will be made available to students when the fund reaches endowment level.

EVENTS AND PROGRAMS promoting inclusion continue to grow at UNT, providing learning opportunities for our campus and community. These include speakers such as Maya Angelou, Lisa Ling and Dolores Huerta. Equity and Diversity also is increasing opportunities for dialogue and peer mentoring. In 2011, we are bringing back the UNT Equity and Diversity Conference, the premier conference of its kind in the North Texas region.
