

 - Cultural Drivers?






Leading Economic Indicator


- Traditional data sources are 2 or more months behind the real-time data sources

- Are we likely to see tax revenue growth for the state?








Analysts: 2006 thru 2009 Economic Cycle









Analysts: 2009 thru 2011 Economic Cycle













Analysts' Job Openings (TX) w/ JOLT Information Industry data

Compare Real-time Data to Other Data Sources


- Bureau of Labor Statistics

- Credibility of Real-time data??






JOLT Data for **Information Industry** (000s; 2006 thru Present)

(000s) Of Job Openings











BI Job Openings Trending Upward!


E.g., IT Project Mgt Takes Off
