•Tracked gas and electric usage through ENERGY STAR's Portfolio Manager and saved \$3697.60 at Crumley Hall and \$7047.04 at West Hall.





The Career Center is a one-stop-shop for students and alumni to meet with advisors and get help with finding jobs on and off campus. The Career Center also helps with writing resumes and cover letters, interview techniques, and so much more.

In 2011–12, Career Center...



•Continued the tremendous growth of the Take Flight Job Shadowing Program where 46 companies hosted 139 students during Spring Break, a 113% increase over the 1st year.



•Expanded trainings for Student Employees and Supervisors including three for Student Employees and five for Supervisors.



Recruited over 650 companies through Job/Career Fairs, Career Events, and On-Campus Interviewing. Included in this were the largest Career Fair in UNT history, and the largest Career Fair for the College of Engineering.



Offered workshops specifically tailored for graduate students for the first time on five separate topics which drew in 298 students.

By participating in service programs, students have the opportunity to gain skills, make connections and make a difference. ·Had more than 10,000 students participate in volunteer or leadership programs.




Counseling and Testing Services strives to support the academic success and general well-being of UNT students through professional counseling, career counseling, group counseling, animal-assisted therapy, consultation, mental-health screenings, educational programs and selfhelp resources as well as referral services. In 2011-12, Counseling & Testing Services...



- •Started a new web check in system that allowed the office to gather more detailed information about students seeking services in order for psychologists to better serve their individual needs.
- •Increased group offerings 77% from the previous year while also increasing number of counseling appointments attended by 10.94% and the number of crisis and mandatory assessment appointments by over 20%.
- ·Hosted 2,212 attendees at Eagle's Refuge, a stress free zone for students to relax and rest during the finals weeks of each long semester.
- •Provided 5,681 national and state tests for those seeking to further their education and career goals.
- •Served as a training practicum site and provided supervision to 19 doctoral students in Counseling Psychology.





The Dean of Students Office fosters the development of leadership, civility, accountability, and responsibility in the University of North Texas student. The office endeavors to create a culture of care for students and staff by providing exemplary programs and services designed to enhance students' academic and personal success.

In 2011–12, Dean of Students...

•Took the lead with the new student complaint policy and assisted 209 students through the new procedures.



·Assisted 138 students through CARE Team referrals and 375 students through the Seeking Options and Solutions (SOS) Program.





•Conducted Active Shooter Presentations as a training and precautionary measure on main campus and at the Health Science Center.



•Finalized the creation of the Student Emergency Fund to assist students who have been through catastrophic situations that have threatened their ability to stay enrolled in classes.





Dining Services serves all of our students by offering freshly made meals in five dining halls and six locations throughout campus. Recent improvements include updated dining hall menus, creation of an international—themed sandwich truck and renovations to Bruce Hall's dining hall have begun.

·Increased Year-over-year retail sales by 22% by serving great value and great food with a smile



•Re-opened 'Bruceateria' to great reviews. Renovation included: open service lines for faster service, made from Scratch pizza/pasta and an all vegan hot entrée line.





•Partnered with the office of Sustainability to produce the 3rd annual Earth day celebration which fed over 7000 students sustainable whole food featured Scrappy's Ice Cream made right here on campus



·Increased Non-traditional (commuter) Meal plan sales by 35% over previous year

In 2011-12, The Office of Greek Life...



Developed the inaugural Greek Preview Day for incoming students interested in fraternity/sorority membership. the 112 students that attended, 88 enrolled and 50 joined a fraternity or sorority.



•Fully implemented the Greek Ambassador Program in which tours of Greek Housing are now offered, as well as public speaking engagements for departments/organizations who request information on the Greek community.



•Collaborated with UNT Risk Management to implement an organized, consistent strategy for fire drills and risk management inspections of Greek houses.



Collaborated with the Center for Leadership & Service to create an Alternative Spring Break (ASB) in New Orleans. In 2012, the community raised nearly \$1,300 which was donated to the ASB site, Common Ground.





Living on campus is an excellent way for students to enhance their experience at the University of North Texas. Being a member of a 'REAL' living learning community can help strengthen personal growth and academic success. Students have the opportunity to develop leadership skills, attend events related to the wing's theme, and interact more closely with faculty and university staff members.

In 2011–12, Housing & Residence Life...



•Completed a new laundry bid that will provide students with free usage of laundry machines for residents.



- •Had 5,473 residents living in halls, 612 enrolled in living-learning communities, and 5 faculty in residence.
- Put on 1,255 programs with 21,671 residents in attendance.



 Retained freshman living on campus at a rate of 79.1%, which is 5.84% higher than the overall retention rate.









Through Orientation and Transition Programs, resources and services are provided to help students establish and attain their educational Beginning with first-year students, the office serves as a central location to help students connect with their peers, faculty, staff, and parents. These connections help guide and direct students throughout their educational experience at UNT and facilitate their success.

In 2011-12, Orientation & Trasition Programs...



- ·10,300 freshman and transfer students attended orientation sessions.
- •1,330 students, parents, and guests attended a summer send-off party in August, increasing participation by 20.69%.
- ·Class Cause supposed students in raising \$6,750 to bring Stop Hunger Now, an international hunger relief agency to campus, packaging 27,666 meals, wiping out 1 day of hunger.
- •The Transfer Center partnered with Transfer Admissions for Community College visits, providing outreach and student perspective to thousands of potential UNT transfer students in the DFW area.





Organizing intramurals, adventure trips and providing an awardwinning facility, Recreational Sports works hard to keep everyone at UNT fit and healthy. Becoming more "green," the Recreation Center offers cardio machines that generate electricity for the building.

In 2011–12, Recreational Sports...



·Had 69 students in 7 sport clubs who competed in national tournaments through the UNT Sports Club Program.

•Surveyed students and found that they regarded the recreational facilities as very important them, and 92% stated that the UNT recreational facilities were excellent or very good.





•Extended hours of operation during spring 2012 to meet the requests of student input.





•Expanded services to Discovery Park by installing a walking trail and outdoor basketball court.

•Served 74% of the first time in college student population.







One of the goals of the Student Activities Center is to help students get involved on campus, in an effort to maximize their collegiate experience. 


• Advised the student organization, Dance Marathon, which raised over \$2,500 for the Children's Miracle Network Hospitals.


In 2011–12, Student Legal Services...

are confidential, convenient and economical.


