Region's Transportation-Air Quality Balance OK'd

Planners to continue projects to reduce congestion, improve environment

uly 22, 2013 (Arlington, Texas) – The Dallas-Fort Worth area's updated long-range transportation plan and its plan for shortrange improvements through 2016 comply with federal air quality regulations, the US Department of Transportation announced Friday.

Projects in both plans may continue toward implementation.

Approved by the Regional Transportation Council in June, Mobility 2035 – 2013 Update includes \$98.7 billion in transportation improvements to be made through 2035. The plan continues the deferral of more than \$40 billion in project recommendations until after 2035 because of the region's funding shortfall; however, some projects were moved up on the priority list.

The following projects were changed from deferred to recommended: portions of State Highway 114 (between SH 121 and Loop 12), Loop 12 (between Spur 408 and Interstate Highway 35E), I-635 (between US

Highway 75 and I-30) and I-35E (between US 67 and I-20). The 2013 -2016 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) may also proceed, according to USDOT. The TIP is a multiyear list of projects in the Dallas-Fort Worth area approved for federal, state and local funding.

The region's long- and short-range transportation plans must comply with federal air quality regulations. Ten Dallas-Fort Worth area counties are designated nonattainment for the pollutant ozone. Collin, Dallas, Denton, Ellis, Johnson, Kaufman, Parker, Rockwall, Tarrant and Wise counties are classified as a moderate ozone nonattainment area. Planners are making strides in the effort to improve air quality. RTC policies have helped the Dallas-Fort Worth area improve air quality by reducing nitrogen oxides and volatile organic compounds, precursors to ozone formation, by approximately 5 tons and 3 tons per day.





BLAST OFF!

Construction Starts on the Long-Awaited 35Express Project in Denton and Dallas Counties

fter 15 years of planning and coordination to expand one of the state's most congested highways, the Texas Department of Transportation today broke ground on the Interstate 35E (I-35E) corridor project. TxDOT and its partner, AGL Constructors, broke ground at Copperas Branch Park in Highland Village. The Texas A&M Transportation Institute estimates the I-35E project will save motorists approximately 1.7 million hours in travel time per year.

"This project represents a true partnership, not only between AGL and TxDOT, but also between TxDOT, the region, Denton County and the cities along this corridor," said Phil Wilson, TxDOT executive director.

Dubbed 35Express and located in one of the region's fastest-growing areas, the 28-mile expansion will enlarge the interstate's footprint from US 380 in Denton County to I-635 in Dallas County. Portions of the highway currently rank 33rd and 98th on TxDOT's list of 100 most congested roadways. Up to 210,000 vehicles per day travel the highway.

The 35Express project runs through eight cities in Denton and Dallas counties, including Denton, Corinth, Lake Dallas, Hickory Creek, Highland Village, Lewisville, Carrollton and Farmers Branch. The \$4.8 billion project is being constructed in two phases, the first of which will cost approximately \$1.4 billion in federal, state and local dollars as well as toll fees collected from SH 121. The second phase will be constructed when funding becomes available.

"This is an exciting time for Denton county residents," said Denton County Judge Mary Horn. "The I-35E expansion represents the beginning of the one project that links every major roadway



The first phase of construction is scheduled for later this month and includes the addition of north and southbound general purpose lanes, reversible managed lanes and the expansion, reconditioning or reconstruction of multiple bridges. Phase I construction is expected to be completed by early 2017.

Roadways like FM 1171, FM 2181, FM 407, FM 2499 are all being constructed, expanded and/or refurbished as a result of the incredible partnership we've had with our federal. state and regional partners. The I-35E project will not only improve mobility within the county, but also within the region as well."

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE PROJECT INCLUDE:

- Construction of a new southbound bridge across Lake Lewisville and the addition of frontage roads and a shared path for pedestrians and cyclists
- Widening of the bridges at Post Oak Road and Corinth Parkway
- Reconstruction of the bridges at Garden Ridge Boulevard and FM 407
- Additional direct connect ramps at the I-35E Sam Rayburn Tollway interchange
- Reconstruction of the Belt Line Road interchange


