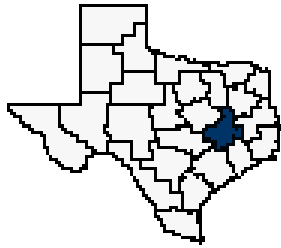




DISTRICT PROFILE

MAJOR PROJECTS UNDERWAY:

- SH 6 entrance/exit ramps in Brazos Co. -- improving the entrance/exit ramps -- \$9.6 million
- FM 60 Widening in Burleson Co. -- construct four-lane highway at new location around City of Snook -- \$10.5 million
- SH 105 Brazos River Bridge replacement in Brazos, Grimes and Washington -- construct 2.5 miles of new bridges at Navasota River and Coles Creek -- 23.7 million

PLANNED MAJOR PROJECTS:

- Grade Separation of SH 30 and FM 244 in Grimes Co. -- construct grade separation where SH 30 goes over FM 244 -- Est. cost \$6.2 million (Let in July 2014)
- Rehab existing roadway of SH 90 in Grimes Co. -- Rehab SH 90 from the BNSF Railroad overpass to the south City Limits of Bedia -- Est. cost \$8 million (Let in Aug 2014)

Letting for FY 13: The Bryan District let 32 projects for construction worth a total of \$93,240,469 in Fiscal Year 2013.
