The San Antonio District plans, designs, builds, operates and maintains the state transportation system in 12 counties. In addition to maintaining assets in the harsh south-central climate, the district focuses on mobility projects to keep motorists moving through the vital corridors intersecting in the district.

MAJOR PROJECTS UNDERWAY:

- Wurzbach Parkway Build new roadway (5.019 miles) in three segments – \$147 million
- I-35 near SAMMC Add one lane in each direction and operational improvements – \$74.1 million
- Loop 1604 in northwest San Antonio Expand to an expressway section with overpasses – \$82 million

PLANNED MAJOR PROJECTS:

- Loop 1604 from FM 1957 to FM 471 Expand to four-lane expressway – 116.8 million
- I-10 from FM 3351 to Fair Oaks Parkway – Build overpass, reconfigure frontage roads – \$26 million
- I-410 at Hwy 151 Construct two new direct connectors – \$75 million
- US Hwy. 90 between Loop 1604 and I-410 – Improve frontage roads, intersections and ramps – \$23 million

MAINTENANCE: The district spends \$152 million on contracted maintenance work annually, while keeping \$43 million in maintenance and operations in-house. In addition to spending money abating graffiti on urban highway signs, a significant portion of the budget is dedicated to resurfacing the four interstate highways and seal-coating rural FM roads.

CORRIDORS: The San Antonio District features multiple interstate highways (I-10, I-35, I-37 and I-410), US highways (81, 90, 181 and 281) and major state highways (Loop 1604, Highways 16 and 46).

SAFETY: From pavement marking and texturing to installing cable barriers, safety projects abound. The district also works with local agencies to combat wrong-way driving in the urban areas by strategically installing LED-lit signs and radars. Evidenced by participation in statewide awareness campaigns, the district strives to reduce the number of crashes from the lofty 2013 totals of 213 reported crashes resulting in more than 230 fatalities.
