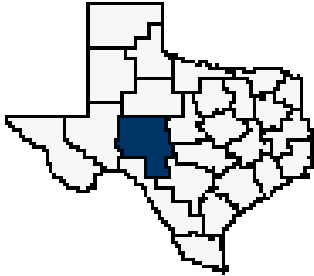




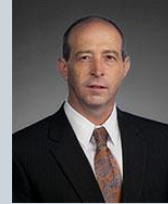
DISTRICT PROFILE

MAJOR PROJECTS UNDERWAY:

- Reconstruction of US 67/US 277 interchange in San Angelo – \$5.3 million
- Expansion of SH 158 in Glasscock County to a 4-lane undivided highway from the Midland County Line to US 87 – \$55 million
- Addition of passing lanes on US 67 from the Tom Green/Irion county line to Irion/Reagan county line – \$32 million (July 2015)
- US 67 passing lanes project in Reagan County from Big Lake to the Irion County line – \$5.1 million

MAINTENANCE: A large portion of the district's \$25 million maintenance budget was spent in Reagan, Glasscock and Irion counties on "Energy Sector Roads." Activities include adding shoulders, maintaining the road edges and preserving the pavement.

CORRIDORS: The San Angelo District has eight projects totaling over \$73 million under contract on the Ports-to-Plains Corridor, including the expansion of SH 158 to four lanes in Glasscock and Sterling counties and US 87 from the San Angelo city limits to the Howard County line.

SAFETY: Passing lanes were added to portions of US 277 from Sonora to San Angelo in 2013. A \$3.6 million safety project recently widened segments of RM 335, RM 336 and RM 337 in Real County. Additionally, many roads will have rumble strips added to the centerline and the shoulder in 2016.
