THE COOPERATIVE INCLUSION PLAN (CIP): A COORDINATED APPROACH TO EDUCATION AND ACCESS

artnerships take center stage again. With the support of North Texas Legislators, transportation agencies and several contractor's associations have joined efforts to assist disadvantaged, minority, women, small businesses and historically underu-



tilized businesses (D/M/W/SBEs and HUBs) in highway construction. The

goal is to coordinate efforts to more effectively communicate and train these groups to increase opportunities to do business with the state. This partnership has created a consolidated structure, referred to as the Cooperative Inclusion Plan (CIP), that helps D/M/W/SBEs and HUBs navigate the world of doing business with the public sector.

With one of the most robust economies in the nation, the Dallas-Fort Worth region is actively working to meet the corresponding transportation demand projecting to invest billions of dollars into development and construction over the next 10 years. A common goal with all the partners involved in the CIP initiative is to increase contracting opportunities and provide a greater diversification of highway construction.

The CIP is a comprehensive approach addressing the lack of D/M/W/SBEs and HUBs in highway contracting by providing education and access.

We do this by focusing on four goals:

The CIP focuses on five key areas to attain these four goals:

EDUCATION – develop greater understanding of key requirements for the highway industry.

ACCESS – provide D/M/W/SBE and HUB firms with greater access to key industry decision makers. Connect current and potential highway contractors to qualified subcontractors.

AVAILABILITY – expand pool of firms ready, willing and able to perform highway construction work.

CAPACITY – help strengthen the skill set and business acumen of interested firms.

UTILIZATION – expand the participation of firms in TxDOT and NTTA procurements to increase potential use of these firms to perform highway work.

A CONTINUING VENTURE

Several outreach initiatives have been conducted over the past year and outreach efforts continue as all the partners have active roles in providing practical training, education and networking opportunities. 




BASICS OF HOW MANAGED LANES ARE CONFIGURED






