DISTRICT PROFILE

The Brownwood District plans, designs, builds, operates and maintains the state transportation system in its nine counties. The district primarily conducts asset preservation and safety projects that are vital in rural areas of the state. The Brownwood District experiences generally warm, dry weather, with extended drought conditions, along with occasional spells of icy, winter weather. The wide-ranging weather patterns create challenges for maintenance crews and designers to maintain district assets and assure the safety of the traveling public.

The district has 864 On-System bridges and 343 off-system bridges, for a total of 1,207 bridges.

MAJOR PROJECTS UNDER WAY:

- I-20 in Eastland County: construct new safety rest areas — \$19.9 million
- FM 2524 (Austin Avenue) in Brown
 County: rebuild roadway \$4.4 million
- SH 71 in McCulloch County: add passing lanes, replace bridges \$14.9 million
- SH 6 in Eastland & Comanche County: reconstruct roadway — \$6.2 million and \$4 million
- FM 2214 in Eastland County: widen and resurface roadway — \$6.1 million

PLANNED MAJOR PROJECTS:

- US 84 Brown County: replace railroad underpass — \$10.5 million (September 2015)
- District-wide sealcoat: resurface about 160 miles of roadway — \$6.6 million (November 2015)
- US 180 Stephens County: reconstruct urban roadway \$8.5 million (May 2016)
- FM 45 San Saba County: reconstruct existing two-lane highway — \$3.9 million (May 2016)

MAINTENANCE: Each year, the district spends approximately \$6 million on sealcoating projects and several million rehabilitating I-20 and other major corridors.

CORRIDORS: The Brownwood District's priority corridor efforts focus on I-20, US 183, US 84, US 377, US 67 and US 190.
