The district has 1,120 On-System bridges and 643 off-system bridges, for a total of 1863 bridges.

MAJOR PROJECTS UNDERWAY:

- SH 6: improve entrance/exit ramps in Brazos County \$9.6 million
- FM 60 Widening in Burleson County: construct a four-lane highway at new location around City of Snook – \$10.5 million
- SH 105 Brazos River bridge replacement in Brazos, Grimes, and Washington counties: construct 2.5 miles of new bridges at Navasota River and Coles Creek – \$23.7 million

PLANNED MAJOR PROJECTS:

- Grade separation of SH 30 and FM 244 in Grimes County: construct grade separation where SH 30 goes over FM 244 – estimated cost \$6.2 million (anticipated to begin August 2015)
- SH 249 extension in Grimes County: design build project with Houston District
 estimated cost \$100 million (anticipated to begin in 2017)

Letting for FY 14: The Bryan District let 27 projects for construction worth a total of \$112,042,113 in Fiscal Year 2014.
