MAINTENANCE: The Childress District has an operating budget of \$13.4 million and a contract budget of \$3.2 million. Annually, we spend \$920,000 on mowing, \$1 million on seal coat, \$400,000 on crack seal and \$950,876 on striping.

CORRIDORS: The Childress District's priority corridor effort is the rural portion of I-40, US 287, US 83 and US 82.

SAFETY: The Childress District has several projects scheduled to rehab and widen the existing roadway in Wheeler County which has been affected by the energy sector growth. These roads will provide a wide and safer roadway for the traveling public.
