MAINTENANCE: We spend \$11 million annually on seal coating projects and in-house operations. We also spend several million each year rehabilitating I-35 pavement.

CORRIDORS: The Laredo District's priority corridor effort is Loop 20/Future I-69; US 83 to US 277 Ports to Plains.

SAFETY: Safety projects total \$3.3 million to include traffic signal upgrade, rail upgrades, and texturing shoulders.

BRIDGES: The district has 873 on-system bridges and 183 off-system bridges, for a total of 1,056 bridges.
