Head Coach Dan McCarney

Dan McCarney knows how to build football programs. He was a part of a historic turnaround at Iowa State, and now you can add North Texas to that list. McCarney has turned around North Texas and taken the program to heights that were unthinkable when he arrived in 2011.

On their way to the 2014 Heart of Dallas Bowl Championship, the Mean Green won nine games in 2013, tied for the second most in school history and just the sixth time in 100 years North Texas has won nine games. The season culminated with North Texas winning the 2014 Heart of Dallas Bowl 36-14 over UNLV on January 1.

In 2014 McCarney powered North Texas to a 43-6 win over rival SMU, just the fifth win for NT in 34 games against the Mustangs. North Texas posted 77 points in a game in 2014, the fourth-highest total in a game in school history. 2014 also saw one of McCarney's first recruits at North Texas, offensive lineman Cyril Lemon, earn his fourth straight all-conference honor as he was named to the Conference USA first-team.

Lemon was the only player in the nation to start 49 straight games and earn all-conference honors in four straight years. McCarney led the Mean Green to a 6-2 record in the inaugural season in Conference USA, tying for second place and the second most conference wins in school history. Along the way, the Mean Green broke offensive, defensive, special teams and attendance records. The Mean Green achieved the



biggest single season turnaround since 1982-83. The North Texas offense set a new school record for total offense in a single season, topping the 5,000-yard mark for the first time. North Texas rushed for over 300-yards three times in 2013, which is the most in a season since 1959.

The North Texas defense allowed the fewest points per game since 2002, and tied for the second most sacks in school history. McCarney is establishing a record of dominance at Apogee Stadium as North Texas has a home record of 16-7 at Apogee Stadium since 2011. The Mean Green went 5-1 at home in 2013, tying for the second most wins in school history. The three seasons before 2011, the Mean Green went just 1-16 at home.

McCarney has won 22 games at North Texas, which already ranks in the top-10 all-time as he enters the 2015 season eighth in coaching wins. McCarney reached 18 wins faster at North Texas than any coach since Rod Rust in 1967-69 after his first three seasons. He has brought out the best individually at North Texas as the Mean Green had 12 players earn 14 spots on the C-USA all-conference team in 2013, the second most in school history. Brelan Chancellor became just the second player in league history to earn first-team all-conference honors as a kick and punt returner, and was the only player in the nation to rank in the top 10 in punt and kick returns in 2013.

The North Texas resurgence was fueled by all three phases: offense, defense and special teams. Under McCarney, the Mean Green ranked in the top 10 in the nation in 2013 in fourth down conversion defense (fifth), blocked kicks (first), blocked punts (first), blocked punts allowed (first), fumbles recovered (fourth), sacks allowed (seventh), punt returns (fifth), red zone defense (second), scoring defense (eighth), sacks (seventh) and turnovers (fourth).

With more than 30 years of college coaching experience, including 13 years as a head coach at Iowa State University, McCarney is an established leader. He came to North Texas after serving as the assistant head coach at the University of Florida where he had been since 2008. He helped win a national championship at Florida.

McCarney led Iowa State to five bowl games from 2000-05 and was named the Big 12 Conference Coach of the Year in 2004 when his team earned a Big 12 North co-championship. In 119 years of football at Iowa State, only 17 teams have won seven or more games in a season and McCarney coached five of those.

McCarney began his coaching career at the University of Iowa, where he was an assistant under Fry for 11 years. He continued his career as the defensive coordinator at the University of Wisconsin under Alvarez, directing some of the best defensive teams in that schools history. In his 11 years with Fry at Iowa, their teams went to eight bowl games after not having a winning season the previous 19 years. At Wisconsin, McCarney helped turn a team that had won 10 games in five years into a Big 10 Conference championship and Rose Bowl appearance in his fourth year.

McCarney took over as head coach at Iowa State in 1995, assuming responsibility of a program that had enjoyed just three winning seasons in the 16 years prior to his arrival. The year before McCarney became head coach at Iowa State, the Cyclones suffered through an 0-10-1 record. His rebuilding process at Iowa State took five years, but in his sixth season, he became the first head coach in the previous 94 years at Iowa State to win nine games in a season and gave the Cyclones their first-ever bowl victory and first bowl appearance in 23 years.

McCarney led Iowa State to five bowl games from 2000-05 and was named the Big 12 Conference Coach of the Year in 2004 when his team earned a Big 12 North co-championship. In 119 years of football at Iowa State, only 17 teams have won seven or more games in a season and McCarney coached five of those.

His 2008 Florida team finished with a 13-1 record and won the BCS National Championship behind a defense that ranked fourth in the nation in scoring defense and ninth nationally in total defense.

In all, McCarney has coached in 21 bowl games in 36 years as a collegiate coach, five of which are current BCS bowls. He has coached 22 players that have been drafted by the NFL, including nine that have gone in the first three rounds.

McCarney is a 1975 graduate of the University of Iowa where he was a three-year letterman on the offensive line and a team captain in 1974. He is married to his wife Margy and has three children, Jillian, Melanie and Shane.

Mike Canales Associate Head Coach Off. Coordinator/Quarterbacks Sixth Year

Mike Canales enters his sixth year as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach of the Mean Green.

The Mean Green offense has combined to average more points in consecutive seasons (2013-14) since 1968-69. NT scored 27.2 points a game in 2014, along with the second-highest total in school history in 2013, 31.6 points a game, made this the highest scoring stretch in school history since 1968-69. In 2014 Canales oversaw a Mean Green offense that was the best in the nation in red-

zone scoring. In 2014, North Texas scored 94.3 percent of the time in the red-zone to lead the nation.

The leadership of Canales took the North Texas offense to record breaking heights in the 2013. The Mean Green offense scored a total of 414 points, the second most in school history and the most since 1951. North Texas averaged 31.8 points a game, topping the 30-point mark for only the third time in school history.

The North Texas offense scored over 30 points in seven games this season, the most since returning to FBS football in 1995 and it marked only the fifth time in school history the Mean Green has had a season of scoring 30 points or more in seven games.

Quarterback Derek Thompson won the Heart Dallas Bowl MVP award and permanently etched his name into the record books after leading the Mean Green to a nine-win season. Under Canales, Thompson finished his career with 7,457 passing yards, 42 touchdown passes and his senior season he was No. 2 all-time at NT in passing yards (2,896), completions, (251), completion percentage (64.4), and total offense with 3,053 yards.

The Mean Green ground game also was record breaking in 2013. North Texas rushed for over 300-yards three times in 2013, which is the most in a single season since 1959. NT had 2,208 rushing yards for the season, which are the 13th most rushing yards in a single season in school history. During the 2012 season, Thompson threw for a career-high 2,649 yards, which ranks fourth all-time in a single season. Thompson broke the school record for single-game completion percent at No. 14 Kansas State when he completed 25-of-28 passes.

The Mean Green offense churned out over 4,000 yards for the sixth straight year, which is a school record and the fourth straight under Canales. The 4,751 total yards of offense is the fourth most in school history. The Mean Green rushed for over 2,000 yards for third time in the last four seasons under Canales.

In 2011, Canales oversaw the growth of starting quarterback Thompson. He threw for 1,759 yards, which is the fifth most passing yards in a single season at North Texas since 1995. The Mean Green offense closed the season by scoring 59 points, the most points scored in a game since the 2009 season.

Canales guided a North Texas offense that featured its third-straight season of producing a 1,000-yard rusher in Lance Dunbar, who also rushed for a single-game school record 313 yards. Dunbar also became only the sixth player in NCAA history to have 4,000 yards rushing and 1,000 yards receiving in a career.

He was offensive coordinator at the University of Arizona for three years, coached wide receivers for the New York Jets of the National Football League and was the quarterback coach at North Carolina State where he helped develop Phillip Rivers who is currently an All-Pro player for the San Diego Chargers of the NFL.

Under his leadership, South Florida quarterback Matt Grothe became the Big East Conference career leader in total offense. He also was part of three bowl games at USF, helping lead the Bulls to the Sun, St. Petersburg, and International bowls.

While the passing game coordinator at North Carolina State, his offense finished in the top 10 nationally in passing offense and competed in two postseason bowl games. Rivers was a two-time All-Atlantic Coast Conference player and Heisman Trophy candidate under Canales' watch. The Wolfpack made two bowl games with Canales, the Champ Sports and Gator Bowl.

Canales began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Brigham Young University where he learned from legendary offensive coach Norm Chow. At BYU the Cougars went to the Citrus and Freedom Bowl with Canales. He went on to be the offensive coordinator at Snow Junior College where he had a top 10 nationally-ranked offensive unit in seven of his eight years. He coached quarterbacks at Pacific in 1995 before being hired at South Florida in 1996.



Chris Cosh Def. Coordinator/Linebackers First Year

Cosh begins his first season at North Texas as the defensive coordinator. Cosh comes to North Texas with a wealth of experience having served as a defensive coordinator for 16 of his 30 seasons in coaching, including time at Kansas State, Maryland, South Carolina, Michigan State and Illinois. Cosh spent the 2014 season as the defensive line coach at the University of Buffalo.

Cosh, 55, was the defensive coordinator at South Florida in 2012 and in his one season Big East defenders

in Tampa he helped produce two All-Big East defenders.

From 2009-11, Cosh was the defensive coordinator at Kansas State, where he helped rebuild the Wildcat defense culminating with a Cotton Bowl appearance in 2011. The Wildcats defense was ranked 37th in the nation in 2011 and produced three All-Big 12 performers, including Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year Arthur Brown. The Wildcats finished the season with a 10-3 record.

In 2010 Cosh guided the Wildcat defense and saw true freshman Ty Zimmerman earn freshman All-America honors after recording 74 tackles, three interceptions, three PBUs and two fumble recoveries.

In 2009 under Cosh, K-State's defense made tremendous strides, from 117th nationally in total defense in 2008 to No. 39 in 2009. The 2009 Wildcat defense yielded just 105.4 yards per game on the ground, which ranked 16th nationally, and surrendered 339.9 total yards per contest.

As defensive coordinator at Maryland, the Terrapins (7-5) ended the 2008 regular season 35th nationally in scoring defense (21.4 ppg) and were led by All-ACC performers Alex Wujciak at linebacker and Jeremy Navarre on the defensive line.

In 2007, the Terrapin defense was highlighted by first-team All-ACC performers Erin Henderson and Dre Moore. Henderson led the league in tackles from his weakside linebacker spot, while Moore, a defensive tackle, went on to become a fourth-round draft choice of Tampa Bay in the 2008 NFL Draft.. Cosh's defense ended the year at No. 24 nationally in scoring defense (21.5 ppg) and No. 33 in pass defense.

In 2006, Cosh was responsible for a unit that contributed to the school's first nine-win season since 2003 and a victory in the Champs Sports Bowl. The Terps defense held the opposition to an average of 21.8 points per game. Under Cosh's leadership, the defense marked breakout performances by cornerback Josh Wilson and Henderson, who each earned All-ACC honors. Wilson went on to become a second-round choice of the Seattle Seahawks in the 2007 NFL Draft.

Prior to his stint at Maryland, Cosh made his first stop at Kansas State for two seasons, 2004-05, under head coach Bill Snyder as linebackers coach. The Wildcat defense ranked 30th nationally in 2005 allowing an average of 128.9 rushing yards per game. Junior linebacker Brandon Archer was an honorable mention All-Big 12 selection in 2005, an accolade which came a year after Cosh helped coach the newcomer to second-team honors in his first year as a starter.

While at South Carolina, he helped produce some of the Southeastern Conference's top linebackers, including Kalimba Edwards (two-time first team allleague, Butkus and Lombardi Awards finalist in 2001). His resume as a position coach also includes tutoring New York Jets' first-round pick and Pro Bowler John Abraham (1999) and freshman All-American Lance Laury (2002). During his time in Columbia, S.C., the Gamecocks won back-to-back bowl games for the first time in school history.

In addition to serving under coaching legends Snyder and Holtz, Cosh was the defensive coordinator at Michigan State under former Miami Dolphins and current Alabama head coach Nick Saban. In his lone season (1998) in East Lansing, Mich., the Spartans upset No. 1 Ohio State and knocked off Notre Dame. Cosh's unit helped spark those wins with the 10th-ranked pass defense in the nation.

A former linebacker who earned his bachelor's degree in physical education from Virginia Tech in 1983, Cosh got his start coaching in Blacksburg, Va., where he was a student assistant during the 1983 season. He then made five different stops (Wisconsin-Oshkosh, Southeast Missouri State, UNLV and two tours at Minnesota) before settling in at Illinois.





Mike Grant Wide Receivers/Recruiting Coordinator Fifth Year

Mike Grant is in his fifth-year with North Texas. Grant is in his third season as wide receivers coach and second as the recruiting coordinator.

In 2014 Grant oversaw the emergence of Carlos Harris into one of the top receivers in Conference USA. Harris led North Texas in receptions with 70, which is the ninthmost in school history. Harris had 863 yards, which ranked 11th most in school

history.

Grant was instrumental in the development of Brelan Chancellor and Darnell Smith at the wide receiver spot in 2013 as both players received all-C-USA honors. Chancellor had a record breaking year and was named a second-team wide receiver while Smith was an honorable mention player.

Chancellor had the most receiving yards by a NT wide out since 2008 while Smith had the most receptions by a wide receiver since 2008. Grant also continued the development of Harris in 2013. In just his second season, Harris was the third leading receiver with 47 grabs in 2013. Freshman Darvin Kidsy had 16 catches in his first season and was the fifth leading receiver in 2013.

Against Idaho to begin the season, NT had a school record 12 players with at least one catch in the game. Prior to becoming the wide receivers coach, Grant spent two seasons as the Mean Green running backs coach.

In 2012, Grant's running backs rushed for over 2,000 yards for the third time in the last four seasons. Having to replace the all-time leading rusher in Lance Dunbar going into the 2012 season, North Texas had three players rush for over 500 yards for the first time in school history.

Brandin Byrd and Jeremy Brown each had a rushing TD of over 50 yards in the win over South Alabama, the first time since 2010 that the Mean Green has had two different running backs have a rushing TD and more than 40 yards in a game.

Freshman Antoinne Jimmerson was the first running back to have a 100-yard receiving game since Lance Dunbar in 2011. He was the first running back with two receiving touchdowns in a game since 2002.

In his first season with the Mean Green, Grant oversaw a rushing attack that tied the school record for most yards in a game and had 19 rushing touchdowns, the second most in seven seasons at North Texas.

North Texas rushed for 464 yards against Middle Tennessee, tying the school record from 1952. In that game, Lance Dunbar broke the single-game school record with 313 yards rushing and became the all-time leading rusher in school history.

North Texas also had two running backs, Dunbar and James Hamilton, rush for 100 yards in the same game, marking the first time the Mean Green has had two backs go for over 100 yards in a game since 2003.

Grant spent 2007 as wide receivers coach at Southern Miss before moving to Western Michigan. Grant worked with head coach Dan McCarney at Iowa State from 1998-2006. At Iowa State, Grant spent time coaching wide receivers and running backs, as well as two years as a defensive assistant.

He played quarterback at Nebraska from 1988-92 and was a member of teams that earned three Orange Bowl invitations as well a Fiesta and Citrus Bowl appearance. He has either played or coached in 13 bowl games and was a member of a staff that won two national championships.

As an assistant coach, his teams participated in the Fiesta Bowl (1996), Orange Bowl (1994, 97), Insight.com Bowl (2000), Independence Bowl (2001, 2004), the Humanitarian Bowl (2002) and the EV1.net Bowl (2005).

Grant graduated from Nebraska in 1993 with a bachelor's degree in communication studies, in 1995 with a bachelor's degree in journalism with an emphasis in advertising and has currently completed the course work for his master's degree in mass communication.

Grant and his wife Nina, have a daughter, Mireia.



LaMarcus Hicks Cornerbacks Second Year

LaMarcus Hicks enters his second season with North Texas as cornerbacks coach.

Hicks in his first-season with the Mean Green had the cornerbacks in record-breaking territory in 2014.

North Texas had seven different defensive backs with an interception in 2014, which

was a school record for most DB's in a single season with at least one pick. Five of those seven were cornerbacks coached by Hicks. Two Mean Green cornerbacks had interceptions returned for touchdowns.

Cornerback James Jones was named to the C-USA second-team in 2014 as he was the second leading tackler and led the team with nine PBUs.

Hicks, a defensive back with Iowa State who played professionally with the Detroit Lions, comes to North Texas after spending last season at Concordia University as the defensive backs coach. Hicks played for McCarney at Iowa State for two seasons and earned first-team All-Big 12 honors in 2005 while leading the conference in interceptions. He earned Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week twice that season.

Hicks spent 2011 and 2012 at Truman High School in Michigan as the defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach. In his first season at Truman in 2011, he helped the Cougars improve 15 points per game in scoring defense. In 2012, Truman went 9-2 and won their second playoff game in school history while allowing only 11.2 points per game.

Hicks began coaching in 2010 at Rhodes College as wide receivers coach. Three players at the position were selected as All-SCAC.

Prior to coaching, Hicks played professionally for the Detroit Lions at defensive back. He spent two seasons with the Lions.

Hicks received his Bachelor's degree from ISU in 2006. A native of Clarksdale, Mississippi, he and his wife Ashley are the parents of two sets of twins, Ashton, Auston, Landon, and Layton.





Kevin Patrick Defensive Line Second Year

Kevin Patrick begins his second season at North Texas as the defensive line coach.

In his first season, Patrick helped the Mean Green defensive line produce 33 sacks, tied for the fifth most in school history. North Texas had a school-record 10 sacks in a game and defensive end Tillman Johnson recorded a freshman school-record 3.0 sacks in a game. Johnson finished with a freshman record 5.0 sacks on the season.

In addition to the development of Johnson, Patrick molded Chad Polk, an undersized defensive end, into an all-conference player in 2014. Polk led North Texas in sacks with 5.5 in 2014 despite missing the final two games of the season with an injury.

Patrick, who spent six seasons at South Florida, is one of the nation's top recruiters and has produced three NFL draft picks, including first-rounder Jason Pierre-Paul who was the 15th overall pick in the 2010 NFL Draft.

Patrick followed McCarney as the defensive line coach at USF after McCarney went to Florida in 2008. While at South Florida, Patrick developed some of the top defensive lineman in the country. Pierre-Paul was a first-team All-American selection by Pro Football Weekly in 2009.

Pierre-Paul was also named first-team all-conference by the BIG EAST coaches, ESPN, Rivals.com and the Sporting News along with second-team honors by Phil Steele.

In addition to his work with Pierre Paul, Patrick's defensive line unit included current Dallas Cowboys defensive lineman George Selvie and Houston Texans defensive tackle Terrell McClain. Under Patrick's leadership, Selvie earned All-BIG EAST Second Team honors and was a seventh round draft pick by the St. Louis Rams in 2010.

In 2007, McCarney coached Selvie in his sophomore season to a first-team All-American honor and Patrick coached Selvie in his junior season to another All-American season in 2008. McClain was a third round draft pick in 2011 by the Carolina Panthers after earning first-team All-BIG EAST honors his senior year at South Florida.

In 2011, Patrick's tackles contributed to USF finishing second nationally in tackles for loss and fourth in sacks, while only allowing 107.3 rushing yards per game (15th NCAA).

USF's defensive ends posted 21.5 of the Bulls' 25 sacks on the season in 2009, along with 37 tackles for loss. The defensive line anchored a defensive unit that finished second in the BIG EAST in scoring defense in 2009 and third in total defense led by Pierre-Paul. Patrick flourished during his first season back with the Bulls.

He helped defensive end George Selvie repeat as a first team All-American and assisted a defensive unit that ranked No. 10 nationally in total defense. Patrick also reeled in a pair of national awards on the recruiting trail. Rivals named him one of the top 25 recruiters in America and the top recruiter in the BIG EAST in 2009.

The acclaim came after four-star recruits Ryne Giddens, Jacquain Williams, Jason Pierre-Paul and Julius Forte inked with USF on National Signing Day. During his playing days, Patrick was an All-American defensive end at the University of Miami from 1989-93.

He was a major contributor on the Hurricane team that claimed two National Championships with wins over Nebraska in the 1992 Orange Bowl and over Alabama in the 1990 Sugar Bowl. Patrick also played in the Cotton and Fiesta Bowls during his career. He is one of two individuals in the USF program that has earned BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year honors. Patrick claimed his in 1993, while two-time All-American George Selvie earned that honor in 2007.

Patrick earned All-America honors and team MVP accolades in 1993, when he collected 10 sacks. During his career, he tallied 174 tackles and 23 sacks, which ranks fifth in program history. He graduated from Miami in 1994 with a degree in business administration.

Patrick and his wife Rachel have two daughters - Grace and Belle.



Tommy Perry Running Backs/Special Teams Third Year

Tommy Perry begins his third season at North Texas as the running backs coach and special teams coordinator.

After a total transformation of the Mean Green special teams unit when he arrived in 2013, Perry continued to get results from the NT special teams in 2014. Placekicker Trevor Moore earned freshman All-America honors after hitting 15-for-17 in field goals and he was a perfect 37-for-37 in

PATs. Moore's field-goal percentage of 88.2 was the best in school history and his 37-for-37 in PATs was tied for the most without a miss in a single season.

Darvin Kidsy had the fifth longest punt return in school history when he took a 75yard punt back for a touchdown. He finished the season with 233 punt return yards, 11th most in school history and the second-highest total since 1988.

Perry's kickoff return defense was fifth in the nation in 2014, holding its opponents to only 16.4 yards a return. Punter Eric Keena finished the season with the second-highest punting average in C-USA at 44.8 yards a kick, which was the third-highest in school history. Keena was named honorable-mention C-USA.

The stable of NT running backs continued to be productive under Perry. Antoinne Jimmerson notched his first 100-yard rushing game as did freshman Jeffrey Wilson.

In his first season Perry completely transformed the Mean Green special teams unit, turning into one of the best in the nation.

North Texas led the nation with eight blocked kicks in 2013, including five blocked punts which also led the nation. Of those five blocked punts, three resulted in touchdowns. Perry's impact on special teams was also felt on the return game.

Prior to Perry's arrival, NT had combined for only 142 punt return yards since 2008. In 2013 Brelan Chancellor broke the school record with 386 punt return yards. He returned a 65-yard punt for a touchdown against Rice, becoming the first player to return a punt for a score since 2004 for NT. Chancellor averaged 16.1 yards a punt return in 2013, the highest total in a season since 1982.

Perry also reformed the Mean Green kickoff returns. Chancellor averaged 27.6 yards per kick return, including a 99-yard touchdown return against No. 9 Georgia. Chancellor ended the 2013 season as the only player in the nation to rank in the top-10 in kick returns and punt returns.

Perry also molded freshman punter Blake Macek into one of most effective punters in C-USA. Macek was named to the Conference USA All-Freshman team in 2013 after averaging 41.1 yards a kick, the highest freshman average in school history. 40 percent of Macek's punts were downed inside the 20-yard line, which ranked 15th in the nation. He had 14 punts of over 50-yards and 27 kicks downed inside the 20-yard line.

The North Texas running backs also thrived under Perry in 2013. Brandin Byrd had his first 1,000-yard rushing season and two of the top-10 longest rushes in school history in 2013. NT as a team rushed for 31 touchdowns in 2013, the second most in school history and most since 1951.

In 2012, the first season at the FBS level for South Alabama, Perry coached placekicker Michel Chapuseaux, who set a school record for scoring with 84 points. Chapuseaux hit 20 field goals last season, the second most in Sun Belt Conference history. South Alabama had four running backs with over 200 yards rushing last season.

In 2011, Perry coached placekicker Jordan Means, who connected on 13-of-15 field goals and was South Alabama's first All-America after he was honored by the Beyond Sports College Network.

Perry began his coaching career as an assistant strength & conditioning coach at Texas in 2004, also serving as an academic advisor for the Longhorns. He became a linebacker and strength coach at Texas A&M-Commerce later that year, moving over to coach running backs and handle kickoff return duties in 2005 for the Lions. Three of his backs earned all-Lone Star Conference honors that year, including one who was named the Offensive Back of the Year after rushing for more than 1,000 yards in 10 games.

Perry, who earned his master's degree in health & human performance from Texas A&M-Commerce 2005, is married to the former Angela Painter. The couple has two daughters, Joanna Rose and Jude. Perry is the grandson of 1957 Heisman Trophy winner John David Crow.





Nick Quartaro Assistant Head Coach/TE's Fourth Year

Nick Quartaro is in his fifth year as assistant head coach and enters his three year as the tight ends coach after spending the previous two seasons coaching the wide receivers.

Quartaro brings over 30 years of college coaching experience, including seven years as a head coach, to the Mean Green.

Last season, Quartaro saw the rise of Marcus Smith as a key weapon at the tight end position. Smith caught 15 passes but six with six touchdown recentions.

were for touchdowns. He led the team with six touchdown receptions.

In 2013, Quartaro used a deep rotation at the tight end spot to get pass catching production from Drew Miller along with some of the best blocking in Daniel Prior, Tanner Smith, and Marcus Smith.

Miller caught the go-ahead touchdown in the Heart of Dallas Bowl win over UNLV in the third quarter. Miller finished as the fourth leading receiver for NT in 2013.

In 2012, Quartaro helped groom walk-on wide receiver Darnell Smith into the second-leading receiver on the team. Smith finished with career highs in catches, yards, and touchdowns. The top two receivers for the Mean Green in 2012, Ivan Delgado and Smith, were both walk-ons who Quartaro coached the last two seasons.

When Brelan Chancellor went down with an injury late in 2012, true freshman Carlos Harris stepped in and ended the season as the fourth-leading receiver. In 2011, Quartaro helped develop the two leading wide receivers in Chancellor and Chris Bynes. Both had career-high marks in catches, yards, and touch-downs last season and Chancellor was named honorable mention all-conference.

Quartaro also helped in the growth of walk-on Delgado, who finished the season as the fourth-leading receiver for the Mean Green. Quartaro developed an entirely new lineup at wide receiver composed of Delgado, Bynes, Chancellor, Michael Outlaw and Breece Johnson.

Prior to joining North Texas, Quartaro was the associate head coach and offensive coordinator at Kansas from 2002-06, where he helped the Jayhawks earn two bowl game appearances. During his time at Kansas, 19 offensive players earned Big 12 All-Conference accolades.

The 2005 Jayhawk offense set a school record for bowl-game total yards with 538 against Houston in Fort Worth Bowl, and in 2006 running back Jon Cornish led the Big 12 in rushing while setting a school record for yards in a season with 1,457.

Quartaro was with McCarney at Iowa State from 1998-2001 as the assistant head coach and wide receivers coach and was instrumental in helping the Cyclones achieve back-to-back appearances in bowl games his last two seasons and the best combined record (16-7) in 23 years. His influence was felt in ISU's 9-3 record, top-25 ranking and victory over Pittsburgh in the 2000 Insight.com Bowl.

Quartaro was named head coach at Fordham University in 1994 and spent four years building a winning program. In 1997, Quartaro's last season, the Rams finished with their first-ever winning record in the Patriot League, a 4-2 mark, good for third place.

Prior to his appointment at Fordham, Quartaro had a five-year tenure as part of the original staff of Bill Snyder at Kansas State. Elevated to assistant head coach in his second year and associate head coach in his third season, Quartaro helped K-State to its first bowl game in the Snyder era in the 1993 Copper Bowl. He also had assignments as tight ends and special teams coach for the Wildcats.

Quartaro served as head coach at Drake University for three years (1986-88) and guided the Bulldogs to a 7-3 mark in his third and final year. He also worked five years (1981-85) at Northwestern under former NFL head coach Dennis Green, assisting with the secondary, the defensive line and coordinating the special teams where he coached future 14-year NFL punter John Kidd and special-teams standout Steve Tasker of the Buffalo Bills.

Quartaro and his wife, Stephanie, have two grown children, Andria and Tony.



Mike Simmonds Offensive Line Fourth Year

Mike Simmonds is in his fifth year at North Texas as the offensive line coach.

The North Texas offensive line under Simmonds continued to put up big rushing totals in 2014. The Mean Green rushed for over 200-yards on three different occasions and NT has run for over 300-yards now seven times in the last four seasons.

The Mean Green ran for 21 touchdowns in 2014, which is tied for the eighth most in

school history.

Simmonds also coached Cyril Lemon, who will go down as one of the best lineman in school history, to his fourth straight all-conference honor in 2014. Lemon, who started all 49 games he played in at NT, the second-most in school history, was a first-team all-C-USA pick in 2014. Lemon was the only player in the nation to earn four straight all-conference honors and start 49 straight games.

Simmonds trademark physical style once again paved the way for record breaking success for North Texas in the 2013 season. The Mean Green rushed for over 300-yards three times in 2013, which is the most in a single season since 1959. NT has finished the season with 2,349 rushing yards for the season, which were the eighth most rushing yards in a single season in school history.

Under Simmonds, the Mean Green offensive line once again was one of the best in the nation in protecting the quarterback. The Mean Green offensive line for the second straight season ranked in the top-10 in the nation for fewest sacks allowed. NT allowed only 11 sacks in 2013, which ranked seventh in the nation. Since 2012, the North Texas offensive line has allowed the fewest sacks in the nation with just 17.

Running back Brandin Byrd rushed for over 1,000 yards for the first time in his career in 2013 led by all-conference lineman Cyril Lemon and Mason Y'Barbo. Lemon was named first-team all-C-USA while Y'Barbo earned second-team honors.

In 2012, Simmonds's offensive line helped pave the way for the school's third 2,000-yard rushing season in the last four years.

In addition, the Mean Green offensive line led the nation in allowing the fewest sacks in 2012 with only six sacks given up. Last season, the North Texas offensive line gave up no sacks in nine of 12 games.

The Mean Green had three running backs rush for over 500 yards for the first time in school history. The Mean Green rushed for 2,102 yards on the year, which was the 15th most in school history and the third-most since 2004.

Along with the rushing totals, Simmonds helped produce three all-conference selections on the offensive line. Center Aaron Fortenberry, guards Cyril Lemon and Mason Y'Barbo each earned all-conference honors. Fortenberry was a first-team all-conference pick while Lemon was selected for the second straight season. In three seasons, Simmonds has had seven all-conference honorees.

In 2011, Simmonds's offensive line paved the way for Lance Dunbar's record breaking year that saw the running back become the all-time leading rusher and set a school record for rushing yards in a game with 313.

The offensive line also produced two all-conference player in Matt Tomlinson and Cyril Lemon. Lemon was the only true freshman in the league to be on one of the three all-conference teams in the Sun Belt. He is the first freshman offensive lineman to earn all-conference honors at North Texas since 2000.

Lemon is just the second freshman offensive lineman to earn all-conference honors in Sun Belt history. Tomlinson was a first-team all-conference pick, the first of his career.

Simmonds and his wife, Jamie (Whiting) have three daughters, Amanda, Lauren and Emily.





Perry Carter Safeties Second Year

Perry Carter begins his second season with North Texas as the coach of the safeties for the Mean Green defense. In his first year, the Mean Green secondary and safeties made big strides. Lairamie Lee was third on the team in tackles and interceptions.

Sheldon Wade finished fifth in tackles while freshman Kishawn McClain emerged as a star in the making.

McClain made three starts in 2014 and was named to the Conference USA All-Freshman team. He had one interception and was the leading freshman tackler for NT, and sixth overall with 39.

Prior to North Texas, Carter spent eight seasons with the Houston Texans as a coach and four years as assistant defensive backs coach, where he worked closely with Texans' defensive backs coach Vance Joseph to help develop Houston's secondary. Since 2011, Houston ranked third in the NFL in pass defense (207.7 yards per game) and led the NFL in completion percentage (52.5).

In 2011, Houston ranked third in pass defense, giving up 189.7 yards per game, after finishing 30th in 2010 with 267.5 yards per game. The Texans had the NFL's lowest pass completion percentage allowed (51.9), ranked second with 6.17 yards per attempt allowed and had the second-lowest opponent passer rating at 69.0.

Carter also worked with the defensive backs in his five previous seasons with the Texans, including his four seasons as a defensive assistant. He originally joined the Texans staff through the NFL's Minority Coaching Fellowship program during the 2006 training camp.

Carter's coaching career began in 2004 as the secondary coach at Texas A&M-Commerce. He worked in private business in 2005, then returned to coaching with NFL Europe's Hamburg Sea Devils as a defensive backs/defensive assistant in the summer of 2006. Carter also worked with the special teams in Hamburg.

The 42-year-old Carter, a native of McComb, Miss., earned four letters playing cornerback at Southern Mississippi from 1990-94. Carter was drafted by the Arizona Cardinals in the fourth round (107th pick overall) of the 1994 NFL Draft, and played for the Kansas City Chiefs in 1995 and the Oakland Raiders from 1996-98.

Carter also played five seasons in the Canadian Football League with the Edmonton Eskimos (2000-01), Montreal Alouettes (2002) and British Columbia Lions (2003-04).



Scotty Conley Director of Football Operations Seventh Year

Scotty Conley is in his seventh season with North Texas and is in charge of football operations.

Conley has 39 years of coaching experience in various levels of college football, including nine years as a head coach at both Trinity Valley and Texas A&M Commerce. He has several administrative responsibilities for the

Mean Green football program including travel, scheduling, budgets and recruiting.

Conley has nine years of head coaching experience, which includes a national championship, and he was named the National Junior College Coach of the Year at Trinity Valley.

He has served several years working with the American Football Coaches Association since 1990.

His high school coaching career started at Whitewright in 1971 and Mt. Vernon from 1972-73. From 1974-79 he coached at Plano Senior high school and lead them to the 1977 Texas 4A State Championship.

Conley began his college coaching career at Texas A&M in 1980 where he became the running backs coach and developed three future NFL draft picks. From 1982-1985 he coached linebackers at the University of Texas under which time the Longhorns were the 1983 SWC Champions and went to four bowl games.

After one year coaching outside linebackers at Kansas, Conley went back to developing running backs at Tennessee. From there he coached at Rice, Arkansas and Howard Payne before becoming the head coach at Trinity Valley.

In 2000, he became the U.S. Naval Academy special teams coordinator and also worked with the defensive ends. Conley became head coach again with Texas A&M Commerce where he coached from 2004-2008 and led his team to the LSC North Division Co-Champs in 2007. Under his tutelage the Lions produced three All-Americans and 47 All-Conference performers.

Conley played football at Texas A&M in 1966 where he lettered as a member of the freshman team and went to school from 1966-68. He received his bachelor's degree in business administration at Texas A&M University-Commerce in 1970 and his master's degree in secondary and higher education in 1973.

2015 Conference USA Lineup

The 2015 alignment will feature seven teams in the East Division and six teams in the West Division. Charlotte, FIU, Florida Atlantic, Marshall, Middle Tennessee, Old Dominion and WKU comprise the East Division, while Louisiana Tech, North Texas, Rice, Southern Miss, UTEP and UTSA make up the West Division.

Each school in the West Division will play every team in its division once for five games, while playing three cross-over opponents from the opposite division. Three schools in the East Division will play every team in its division once for six games, while playing two cross-over opponents from the opposite division.

Four schools in the East Division will play five opponents in its division once for five games, while playing three cross-over opponents from the opposite division. East Division schools playing five division games were randomly selected by a computer scheduling application and two intra-division matchups in the East will not take place this season (Charlotte-WKU and Middle Tennessee-Old Dominion).

The 2015 schedule has 13 playing weeks, which provides for one open date for each team. The last two seasons were 14-week schedules, providing two bye weeks per school. The 2015 schedule is again a one-year model, with Charlotte replacing UAB in the East Division.

A schedule of televised games will be released at a later date. Conference USA's national television partners are Fox Sports Media Group, CBS Sports Network and American Sports Network for regular season games. The league's 11th annual Championship Game, pitting the champions of the East and West Divisions, is scheduled for Saturday, December 5 and will be televised by ESPN or ESPN 2.







DENTON - It was a perfectly-executed third-quarter fake punt that ignited the Southern Miss offense in the second half, but it was a game-long inability by the North Texas defense to get off the field that sent the Mean Green to its third-straight loss.

The Golden Eagles converted seven of their first 11 third-down chances, fueling a 506-yard total-offense onslaught in a 30-20 win over North Texas Saturday night at Apogee Stadium, a loss that drops the Mean Green to 0-3 in league play for the first time under head coach Dan McCarney.

"We've struggled all year on defense," McCarney said after his team slipped to 2-5 on the season. "We're not even close to playing Mean Green defense. We don't do that, we're not going to win games."
