MEAN GREEN BACK ON THE ROAD FOR TWO STRAIGHT STARTING WITH IOWA \rightarrow After two losses to begin the season, North Texas returns to the road for the first of twostraight as they visit the Iowa Hawkeyes. The Mean Green is playing only its second-ever road game against a Big 10 school, the first coming last season at Indiana. Iowa comes into the game at 3-0 for the first time since 2009 after a 27-24 win over Pittsburgh. The two teams are meeting for the first time in series history, and Iowa is only the second Big 10 team NT has faced. The Mean Green is 1-1 against Indiana.

→ Quarterback Andrew McNulty threw for a career-high 303 yards against Rice. It was his third 200-yard passing game of his career and first 300-yard passing game. McNulty threw for the most yards in a game by an NT quarterback since Derek Thompson tossed for 349 yards against Idaho in 2013. It marked the 37th time in school history a QB has thrown for more than 300-yards in school history.

→ North Texas is looking to end a seven-game road losing streak and avoid their first 0-3 start to a year since 2011, Dan McCarney's first season. NT hasn't won a non-conference road game since winning at Ball State in 2009. The Mean Green has dropped 12 straight non-conference road games and since 2001 is 1-37 on the road in non-conference games.

 \rightarrow Carlos Harris leads Conference USA in receiving yards a game at 116.5. He ranks 12th in the nation after his eight catch, 193 yard performance against Rice. He had a career-high two TD grabs in the game, the most by any NT player in a game since 2012.

→ The Mean Green lost the turnover battle against Rice and is now a -4 for the season. Under Dan McCarney, NT has won the turnover battle in 27 games, and won 18 of those. When losing the turnover battle under McCarney, the Mean Green is just 1-15. 35 percent of the points allowed by NT have been off of turnovers.

→ Safety Kishawn McClain had a career-high 16 tackles against Rice and he leads C-USA in tackles a game. The 16 tackles were the most tackles by a defensive back since Ryan Downing in 2011. It was the most by any sophomore on the defensive side of the ball since Cody Spencer in 2001.

→ Dan McCarney has 22 career victories as the head coach at North Texas, which puts him in eighth place all-time at NT. He needs just one more win to tie Theron Fouts for seventh place. The SMU game was McCarney's 50th game at North Texas. He is only the seventh coach in school history to reach that mark and just the third since Hayden Fry.

→ NT converted a season-high 61.5 percent on 3rd down against Rice, just the second time since 2013 that NT has converted over 50 percent of its third-downs. QB Andrew McNulty is 14-for-21 passing on 3rd down this season, and 12 of those 14 completions have gone for a first-down. NT is converting 56 percent of 3rd downs that are five yards or less, but only 45 percent on 3rd down when six or more yards are needed.

 $\mathbf{0}$ - North Texas needs a win to avoid its first winless month of September since 2008. Iowa is going after its first 4-0 start to the year since 2009.

17 - The two teams have combined for 17 sacks on the season. North Texas is 15th in the country averaging 3.0 sacks a game, while Iowa is tied for seventh nationally as they average 3.67 sacks per contest. Both teams have allowed four sacks, through three games for Iowa and two for North Texas.

20 - North Texas is the only team in the nation to rank in the top-20 in red-zone offense and defense. The Mean Green is perfect on offense inside the red-zone while the defense is ranked 14th in the country. Iowa ranks 68th in the nation in red-zone defense while the Hawkeyes on offense are tied for 34th in the country, scoring on 10 of the 11 trips inside the red-zone this season.

21:10 - The Dan McCarney has seen time of possession be a staple of success. After two games North Texas is holding the ball for just an average of 21:10, which is last in FBS football at 127th. Iowa is averaging 32:51 in time of possession this season, which is 22nd in the nation.

50 - In a game where field position matters, both North Texas and Iowa feature two of the best punters in the nation. Iowa's Dillon Kidd is averaging 49.8 yards a punt, which would be the third-highest total in the nation, but Kidd is one punt away from qualifying for the statistics. Eric Keena for North Texas is averaging 43.6 yards a punt, which is 30th in the nation. Five of Kidd's punts have been for 50 yards or more while two of Keena's five punts have gone for over 50.

51 - The Iowa defense has been very stingy against the run this season, allowing just 51.0 yards per game, which is tops in the Big 10 and tied for fifth in the nation. The Hawkeyes are allowing only 1.87 yards a carry. When NT has had success, it has been running the ball in the Dan McCarney era. When rushing for more than 200-yards, the Mean Green is 12-2 under McCarney.

MEAN GREEN NOTES

A Homecoming For Mac

North Texas head coach Dan McCarney is making a return home as the Mean Green face the Iowa Hawkeyes. McCarney was a three-year letterman for the Hawkeys from 1972-74 as an offensive lineman, and he was the team captain in 1974. McCarney then became part of the Iowa coaching staff in 1977, as he was a graduate assistant in '77 and '78. When Hayden Fry left North Texas and took over the Iowa job in 1979, he made McCarney his defensive line coach. The pair teamed up to go to the Rose Bowl twice, and eight straight bowl games from '81-'88 before McCarney left for Wisconsin after the '89 season. Fry left a permanent mark on both programs, as he led North Texas to its best two-year stretch in 1977 and '78, going 10-1 and 9-2 before taking the Iowa job. He remains fifth at NT in alltime coaching wins with 40, while he is the all-time leader at Iowa.

A Homecoming For Mac Part II

While head coach Dan McCarney is returning to his roots at Iowa, quarterback Andrew McNulty is returning home to Iowa City where he was a star at Iowa City High School. McNulty threw for 1,438 yards and 12 touchdowns as a senior and added 1,137 yards and 14 touchdowns on the ground. He as named first-team all-state by the Iowa Newspapers Association, IowaPreps.com, and the Cedar Rapids Gazette, he helped lead Iowa City to a 36-0 regular season record. His father, Jim, played with Dan McCarney at Iowa.

Coach to Cure MD

The AFCA will hold its eighth annual Coach to Cure MD effort with the games of September 26. More than 100 FBS schools will be wearing a Coach to Cure MD patch to raise awareness and funding for Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy research. Both North Texas and Iowa coaching staffs will be wearing patches this week.

Walkons Making A Difference

Since he arrived, North Texas head coach Dan McCarney has built one of the nations most productive walkon programs. 34 players have been put on scholarship since 2011. Four players have been named all-conference: WR Darnell Smith (2013), center Kaydon Kirby (2013, Lombardi- and Rimington-Award nominee in 2015), DB Kenny Buyers (2013), punter Blake Macek (2013). Defensive lineman Brandon McCoy was the winner of the Armed Forces Merit Award in 2013 and, since 2011, walkons have made a total of 146 starts in four seasons. They have combined to rush for 1.686 vards and 19 TDs. The wide receivers have combined for 2,985 receiving yards and 13 touchdowns. In 2012, the top two receivers were walkons and three of the top-five were walkons. On defense since 2011, walkons have accounted for 400 tackles.

100th Season Of Football

2015 is the 100th season of North Texas football. The Mean Green enter the year needing eight wins to reach 500 victories in school history. Head coach Dan McCarney has 22 victories at NT, which ranks eighth all-time. With two more wins, he will pass Theron Fouts. If NT wins eight games, not only would that be the 500th victory, but Mc-Carney would also move into sixth place for coaching wins at NT.

Award Candidates

Three North Texas players came out of the summer on five national award watch lists heading into the 2015 season. Junior center Kaydon Kirby, who has started 25 straight games as a former walkon, was named to the Rimington and Lombardi Award watch lists. WR Carlos Harris is the first NT player to be named to the Paul Hornung Award watch list and just the third Mean Green player to earn a Biletnikoff Award nomination. Not to be outdone, placekicker Trevor Moore was one of just 30 kickers nationwide and one of just two from C-USA to be named to the Lou Groza Award watch list.

Eight Is Enough

The Mean Green schedule is pretty daunting considering eight of the 12 opponents were bowl eligible in 2014 and five were bowl champions. NT has to face Marshall, Louisiana Tech and Tennessee on the road, all of which won their bowl games. The Mean Green still faces Iowa on the road (lost to Tennessee in a bowl game) and has Rice, WKU and UTEP at home. MTSU was bowl eligible in 2014, and NT faces the Blue Raiders on the road in November.

Three Named First-Team C-USA

Wide receiver Carlos Harris, center Kaydon Kirby and placekicker Trevor Moore were tabbed to the 2015 Conference USA preseason first-team. Harris and Moore were both C-USA honorable mention in 2014, and Moore was also named to the C-USA All-Freshman team. Kirby was a 2013 C-USA All-Freshman pick.

No Rest In 2015

North Texas had a bye week in the opening week of college football, but, following that open week, it faces a dozen weeks of football. NT plays 12-straight weeks without a break, which is tied for the third longest in the nation. Only two programs in the nation, Colorado and Hawai'i, will play 13 straight weeks without a bye in 2015.

Racking Up The Yards Each Play Against Rice, North Texas averaged 7.7 yards per play, averaging 8.7 yards per pass attempt and 6.5 yards per rushing attempt. It's the most yards per play North Texas has averaged since averaging 9.6 yards per play in last year's 77-3 win over Nicholls State. It's also the most yards per play North Texas has averaged against an FBS opponent under head coach Dan McCarney and the most

head coach Dan McCarney and the most yards per play since averaging 8.7 yards per play on Nov. 27, 2010 against Kansas State.

One For The Record Books

Andrew McNulty and Carlos Harris hooked up for the third longest passing play in school history against Rice, a 93 pass and catch. When adding in rushing plays, it ranks as the sixth longest play in school history and only the fourth passing play of 90 yards or longer.

Targeting Harris

The fifth-most targeted player among all receivers nationally last season, Carlos Harris leads Conference USA in receiving yards a game at 116.5. Harris moved into fifth place at North Texas with 149 career receptions after grabbing eight catches against Rice. He needs 51 more catches to become just the second player in school history with 200. Harris also moved into the top-10 all-time with 1.912 career receiving yards.

Still Perfect Inside The 20

After scoring on 94.3 percent of red-zone opportunities in 2014, best in the nation, North Texas is one of 22 teams with a perfect 100 percent conversion in the red zone this year scoring on all four trips. North Texas has one touchdown and three fields from inside the red-zone. Meanwhile the Mean Green defense ranks 14th in the red-zone defense this season, allowing teams to score just 66.7 percent of the time.

One Final Act For The Jimmy Show

Antoinne Jimmerson moved into 14th place all-time in career rushing, carrying for 13 times against Rice for 94 yards and giving him 1,713 career rushing yards. He scored his 23rd career touchdown against SMU and moved into seventh place all-time. He needs just 287 more yards to become the 11th running back in school history to reach 2,000 career yards.

One Of The Biggest

True freshman offensive lineman Jordan Murray checks in at 6-9 and 359 pounds. He made his first start of his career against Rice, he's the first true freshman offensive lineman to start a game since Cyril Lemon in 2011. He also happens to be one of the biggest players in FBS football. He is tied for thirdtallest player in the nation at 6-9, trailing two 6-10 players, but is the biggest player in the nation when it comes to being 6-9 or taller and 359 pounds.

Ground And Pound

The Mean Green rushed for over 200 yards on three different occasions in 2014, and NT has run for over 300 yards seven times in the last four seasons. The Mean Green ran for 21 touchdowns in 2014, which tied for the eighth most in school history. In the four years under Dan McCarney, NT has run for 8,118 yards, the second most (2001-04) in a four-year stretch since 1981.

The Magic Numbers

Under head coach Dan McCarney, when scores 30 points or more, North Texas is a perfect 16-0. When leading after three quarters, NT is 19-2 under McCarney. North Texas is 9-0 when allowing 10 points or less under McCarney, but, dating back to 1988, that streak is 37-straight wins when holding opponents to 10 points or less.

Rebuilding Up Front

The Mean Green offensive line, which featured a veteran group in 2014, entered 2015 with the possibility of only 33 combined starts among the five. The unit saw true freshman Jordan Murray and Creighton Barr see action against SMU, along with Ryan Rentfro and redshirt freshman Chris Miles. Kaydon Kirby has 27 straight starts while guard Sam Rice, who sat out 2014 after transferring, made his first start.

The Red-Zone Wall

One of the statistically worst red-zone defenses in the nation this past season (108th in red-zone scoring defense, 127th in redzone touchdown scoring defense), North Texas ranks 14th nationally in red zone defense, holding opponents to scores on just 60 percent of red zone opportunities and a combined 17 points on five trips to the red zone. SMU made three trips inside the North Texas five-yard line and can away with only three points. The Mean Green defense forced a fumble at the one, stopped SMU on downs, then held the Ponies to a field goal.

Among The Nation's Tops In Stops

Kishawn McClain (12.5 tackles per game) and Blake Bean (11.0 tackles per game) are the top two tacklers in Conference USA. North Texas is one of three teams with two players among the nation's top-12 tacklers (Louisville, Tulsa) and is one of two teams with the top two tacklers in its league (Tulsa, AAC). McClain ranks second nationally among defensive backs and seventh nationally among all players averaging 12.5 tackles per game, while Bean is tied for 12th averaging 11.0 tackles per game.

Bringing The Heat

North Texas leads Conference USA and is tied for 15th nationally averaging 3.0 sacks per game. Jarrian Roberts ranks second in Conference USA averaging 1.25 sacks per game. And despite playing just two games, his 2.5 total sacks ranks fourth in the league. His 1.25 sacks per game also ranks 14th nationally. Roberts is tied for the Conference USA lead and is tied for 11th nationally averaging 2.0 tackles for loss per game. His 4.0 total tackles for loss is also tied for fourth in the league. He posted a career-high 4.0 tackles for a loss against Rice and 2.5 sacks.

Home Defense System

North Texas allowed an average of just 17.5 points a game at home in 2014. Over the last four seasons since Apogee Stadium opened, the Mean Green defense has allowed fewer than 20 points a game in three-of-four seasons and three-consecutive years. The four previous seasons, 2007-10, the Mean Green allowed over 30 points a game in three of four seasons.

Freshman All-America

Placekicker Trevor Moore earned freshman All-America honors after hitting 15-of-17 in field goals and he was a perfect 37-for-37 in PATs. He has made 41 straight PATs, leaving him 20 away from tying the school record Moore ranks 11th nationally among active kickers with a field goal percentage of 81.8. Moore was a Lou Groza Award nominee.

That Kid Is One Of A Kind

Darvin Kidsy was one of six players in FBS to return a punt and a kickoff for a touchdown in 2014. He's one of three active players who completed the feat in 2014. The other five players are Marcus Murphy (Missouri), Tyreek Hill (Oklahoma State), William Likely (Maryland), Isaiah McKenzie (Georgia) and Kaelin Clay (Utah). It marked the second-straight season NT had a player return both a punt and kickoff for a TD, as Brelan Chancellor accomplished the feat in 2013.

Special Forces

Entering his third season, special teams coach Tommy Perry has compleity remade the Mean Green units into perhaps the best in the nation. In 2013, the Mean Green special teams ranked first in the nation in blocked kicks, blocked punts, and block punts allowed. Last season, NT led the nation again in blocked punts allowed (zero) and blocked kicks allowed. In 2014, the Mean Green was fifth in the nation in kick-return defense.

Can't Touch This

Dan McCarney has emphasized special teams since his arrival in 2011 and the North Texas punt team has delivered. North Texas has not had a single punt blocked in the Dan McCarney era. The last NT punt that was blocked was in 2010 by Rice, a streak that is currently at 61 games. That streak is the fourth longest in the nation.

Defense and Special Teams Getting Offensive Since 2011 under Dan McCarney, NT has scored 21 times on defense or special teams. The Mean Green has 19 touchdowns and two safeties. The Mean Green has four blocked punts that resulted in TDs, two punt returns, one kickoff return, six interception returns for TD, and six fumble returns for a touchdown. Dating back to the 2010 season, the Mean Green has scored 21 touchdowns from either the defense or special teams, which ranks 16th in the nation. North Texas is one of only four non-Power-5 teams in the nation with 21 or more TDs since 2010. Only Houston (26), Boise State (24) and Fresno State (23) rank ahead of NT of schools from a non-Power-5 league. Oregon leads the nation since 2010 with 32.

Dan McCarney knows how to build football programs. He was a part of a historic turnaround at Iowa State, and now you can add North Texas to that list. McCarney has turned around North Texas and taken the program to heights that were unthinkable when he arrived in 2011.

On their way to the 2014 Heart of Dallas Bowl Championship, the Mean Green won nine games in 2013, tied for the second most in school history and just the sixth time in 100 years North Texas has won nine games. The season culminated with North Texas winning the 2014 Heart of Dallas Bowl 36-14 over UNLV on January 1.

In 2014 McCarney powered North Texas to a 43-6 win over rival SMU, just the fifth win for NT in 34 games against the Mustangs. North Texas posted 77 points in a game in 2014, the fourth-highest total in a game in school history. 2014 also saw one of McCarney's first recruits at North Texas, offensive lineman Cyril Lemon, earn his fourth straight all-conference honor as he was named to the Conference USA first-team.

Lemon was the only player in the nation to start 49 straight games and earn all-conference honors in four straight years.

McCarney led the Mean Green to a 6-2 record in the inaugural season in Conference USA, tying for second place and the second most conference wins in school history. Along the way, the Mean Green broke offensive, defensive, special teams and attendance records.

The Mean Green achieved the biggest single season turnaround since 1982-83. The North Texas offense set a new school record for total offense in a single season, topping the 5,000-

yard mark for the first time. North Texas rushed for over 300-yards three times in 2013, which is the most in a season since 1959.

The North Texas defense allowed the fewest points per game since 2002, and tied for the second most sacks in school history.

McCarney is establishing a record of dominance at Apogee Stadium as North Texas has a home record of 16-7 at Apogee Stadium since 2011. The Mean Green went 5-1 at home in 2013, tying for the



second most wins in school history. The three seasons before 2011, the Mean Green went just 1-16 at home.

McCarney has won 22 games at North Texas, which already ranks in the top-10 all-time as he enters the 2015 season eighth in coaching wins. McCarney reached 18 wins faster at North Texas than any coach since Rod Rust in 1967-69 after his first three seasons.

He has brought out the best individually at North Texas as the Mean Green had 12 players earn 14 spots on the C-USA all-conference team in 2013, the second most in school history. Brelan Chancellor became just the second player in league history to earn first-team all-conference honors as a kick and punt returner, and was the only player in the nation to rank in the top 10 in punt and kick returns in 2013.

The North Texas resurgence was fueled by all three phases: offense, defense and special teams. Under McCarney, the Mean Green ranked in the top 10 in the nation in 2013 in fourth down conversion defense (fifth), blocked kicks (first), blocked punts (first), blocked punts allowed (first), fumbles recovered (fourth), sacks allowed (seventh), punt returns (fifth), red zone defense (second), scoring defense (eighth), sacks (seventh) and turnovers (fourth).

With more than 30 years of college coaching experience, including 13 years as a head coach at Iowa State University, McCarney is an established leader. He came to North Texas after serving as the assistant head coach at the University of Florida where he had been since 2008. He helped win a national championship at Florida.

McCarney began his coaching career at the University of Iowa, where he was an assistant under Fry for 11 years. He continued his career as the defensive coordinator at the University of Wisconsin under Alvarez, directing some of the best defensive teams in that schools history. At Wisconsin, McCarney helped turn a team that had won 10 games in five years into a Big 10 Conference championship and Rose Bowl appearance in his fourth year.

McCarney took over as head coach at Iowa State in 1995, assuming responsibility of a program that had enjoyed just three winning seasons in the 16 years prior to his arrival. McCarney led Iowa State to five bowl games from 2000-05 and was named the Big 12 Conference Coach of the Year in 2004 when his team earned a Big 12 North co-championship.

DALLAS - An inconsistent North Texas offense, which had rolled up and down the field a year ago against SMU, coughed and sputtered and struggled in Saturday night's season opener, losing two fumbles, throwing two interceptions, and failing to generate scoring chances or to take advantage of opportunities presented to it in a 31-13 loss to the Mustangs at Gerald J. Ford Stadium.

The North Texas defense generated three first-half turnovers of its own, stopped SMU three times inside the Mean Green five-yard line, and kept SMU quarterback Matt Davis under control for three quarters, but wore down and surrendered 21-straight points in a decisive fourth quarter.

"They outplayed us in the second half," North Texas coach Dan McCarney said. "They made the plays, we didn't. You turn the ball over four times, you're rarely going to win football games. That was the difference in the game."

DENTON - North Texas put up some impressive first-half numbers in the first home game of the season Saturday. Quarterback Andrew McNulty completed 65 percent of his passes for 171 yards, the ground game rushed for 98 yards and averaged 7.5 yards per carry, the offense converted five-of-seven third downs, and the defense recorded three sacks. It should have added up to a nice lead in the Conference USA opener against Rice.And it was all undone by turnovers.

Two critical, crippling lost fumbles - one on a punt return and one that cut short a Mean Green drive deep in Rice territory - led to 10 first-half Rice points, and a third-quarter tipped-ball interception led to another Rice touchdown, sending North Texas to a 38-24 loss at Apogee Stadium.

"The thing we built this program on, the foundation that is so important to winning, is turnover margin and taking care of the football," North Texas head coach Dan Mc-Carney said. "When you're minus three on the day against a good team, you're going to have trouble winning."




