WHAT'S UP?

→ Marshall, UTEP Remain Unbeaten

Marshall and UTEP continued their undefeated seasons as the Herd improved to 5-0 following another dominant performance, this time at the expense of Cornell (73-47). UTEP has enjoyed its time at home, where the Miners are a perfect 5-0 and will host regional rival New Mexico on Wednesday, Dec. 2, in the friendly confines of the Don Haskins Center.

→ Pouring It In

C-USA has seen nearly 30 players score 20+ points already this season. Two players in particular have been on offensive onslaughts as Middle Tennessee's Brea Edwards and Charlotte's Alexis Alexander have both dropped 30 apiece. Furthermore, Edwards is the only player in the league with more than two 20+ point performances after notching her fourth with 29 against Austin Peay.

→ WKU in National Rankings

Defending league champion WKU received votes on the AP Top 25 for the fourth week in a row after defeating No. 16 Louisville at E.A. Diddle Arena on Nov. 21 followed by a sweep of the CGI Great Alaskan Shootout in Anchorage, Alaska.

C-USA schools have been on FOX Sports national television three times thus far this season, and all three appearances have yielded fruit beginning with North Texas' trip to No. 17 Oklahoma that saw the Mean Green pull off a stunning upset on FOX College Sports. WKU followed suit on FCS with a victory over No. 16 Louisville before Middle Tennessee knocked off Ole Miss (for the third consecutive time in the past year) on FOX Sports regional networks on Nov. 22.

→ Middle Tennessee Upends Ole Miss in 3rd Matchup Between Coach & Son

Middle Tennessee took down Ole Miss for the third time in a calendar year Sunday on FOX Sports as Blue Raider head coach Rick Insell defeated his son, Rebel skipper Matt Insell, 84-75.

What Ole Miss head coach Matt Insell had to say: "People can say [Olivia] Jones, [Brea] Edwards, whatever they want... but the engine of that team is [Ty] Petty," Matt Insell explained. "If Petty plays well, Middle Tennessee plays well. I think the coaches in C-USA have it all wrong, because the best player in the league is Petty. And tonight, Petty kicked our butt every way it can be kicked."

→ North Texas First-Year Head Coach Jalie Mitchell Picks Up First Win at No. 17 Oklahoma

North Texas women's basketball netted its first win of the season in exhilarating fashion on the road against No. 17 Oklahoma, 61-57. It was only the second loss at home for Oklahoma since the 2013-14 season. For coach Mitchell, it was her first career win as the leader of a program after accepting the gig with the Mean Green in April.

→ A Winning Tradition: C-USA Women's Basketball

National titles are in C-USA's DNA. Louisiana Tech sports three national championships (1981, 1982 and 1988), while Old Dominion carries a trio of its own (1979, 1980 and 1985). In summation, current C-USA programs hold a combined six national titles since 1979, winning all six in a span of less than a decade. C-USA is home to 50 NCAA Tournament berths and 52 WNIT squads between its 14 members. Of the member institutions in C-USA, 13 have won at least one conference championship in their respective histories. Old Dominion leads the charge, boasting a league-best 22 tournament crowns to go with 21 regular-season titles, while Louisiana Tech is second with 16 tournament titles and 20 regular-season trophies.

TELEVISION

Conference USA women's basketball is set for prime television exposure again in 2015-16 as 47 (subject to change) regular-season games and the entire C-USA Women's Basketball Championship have been selected for television broadcasts across the country. The national television slate is highlighted by eight Fox Sports Network games, including seven C-USA matchups, and five games on the American Sports Network (ASN), while Charlotte and Middle Tennessee have been picked up locally in the Murfreesboro area (ch. 10) and the Charlotte area (Time Warner Cable ch. 22). WKU will also see five home matchups televised nationally by the Hilltopper Sports Satellite Network on FOX College Sports.

PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE USA

Following a dominant regular season and deep WNIT run, the Middle Tennessee Blue Raiders were selected as the Conference USA women's basketball preseason favorite to win the league's regular-season crown in 2015-16, according to the league's coaches.

Veteran head coach Rick Insell, who has compiled a 29-5 C-USA record in his first two years in the league, will guide a unit led by C-USA Preseason Player of the Year Olivia Jones. Jones, an all-conference first-team selection a year ago, averaged nearly 20 points per game and broke seven Middle Tennessee sophomore records. Now a junior, Jones needs merely 40 points to join the Blue Raider 1,000 point club.

Last season's C-USA Newcomer of the Year, Jennie Simms, a preseason All-C-USA selection, will lead Old Dominion, which placed second in the preseason poll with four first-place votes following its exciting run in the 2015 C-USA Championship. Simms emerged as one of the dominant guards in the league and led ODU in points (19.3 ppg) and rebounds (8.1) on top of first-team all-conference honors.

Placing third in the tight preseason poll was defending C-USA champion and NCAA participant WKU, which also received four first-place votes. Leading the Lady Toppers will be preseason All-C-USA selection Kendall Noble, who was the 2015 C-USA Defensive Player of the Year. The local product out of Hazard, Kentucky, finished the 2014-15 crusade with the most steals in WKU single-season history (105), a mark that ranked 14th in the nation.

Southern Miss senior Jerontay Clemons earned preseason All-C-USA honors after a plucky all-around performance a season ago. Clemons produced a team-best 62 steals and scored in the double-digits during 24 outings for the 25-11 Golden Eagles.

UTEP senior Cameasha Turner represents the Miners on the preseason squad. The 5-9 guard completed a breakthrough season with the orange and blue to earn second-team all-conference honors and was a C-USA All-Defensive team honoree. Turner was the only C-USA student-athlete to finish in the top 10 in three-point field goal percentage (.387), points (15 per game) and steals (2.1 per game) during the 2014-15 season.

A versatile swing guard for Charlotte, Lefty Webster earned preseason all-conference honors on the heels of a resilient finish to her sophomore season, where she closed the year with double-digit scoring performances in her last 10 games. A threat on both ends of the floor, the junior averaged over two steals per game to go along with 14 points per game and nearly six boards per contest.

Louisiana Tech wing Brandi Wingate was named the C-USA Sixth Player of the Year last season and earned a nod on the preseason squad. The accurate senior shot 55 percent from the field along with 78 percent from the free throw line.

Rounding out the preseason team was Marshall senior Leah Scott. The Detroit finished in the C-USA top five in defensive rebounds (5.4) and was eighth in the league in scoring (15.4 points per game).
