WHAT'S UP?

→WKU at Marshall on ASN

WKU will look to bounce back from its loss to top dog UTEP when it heads East to Huntington, West Virginia, for a date with Marshall. The Herd handed UTEP its first loss of the C-USA season back on Feb. 4. Tipoff is set for Sunday at 12 p.m. CST/1 p.m. EST on the American Sports Network.

→UTEP's Turner, WKU's Noble Honored on CoSIDA Division I Academic All-District Squads

UTEP's Cameasha Turner was named to the District VII first team after notching a 4.0 in criminal justice. Turner has been a key cog in on an elite UTEP squad this season and has started all 20 games she has played in this year. She paces the team in minutes played (30.3) mpg) and is second on the team in scoring (12.7 ppg). WKU's Kendall Noble, who has a 3.61 in biology and was named to the District II first team, has put together a fabulous all-around campaign. The junior recorded the 10th tripledouble in league history and first in program history against Charlotte with 17 points, 11 rebounds and 11 assists. She also recently cataloged a season-high 31 points against North Texas, and in doing so, joined the 1,000 point club in the WKU record books.

→UTEP Continues Historic Pace

Following its loss at Marshall, UTEP found itself in a pivotal matchup on the road at fellow frontrunner WKU. The Miners rallied from 13 points down, marking the third-largest comefrom-behind road victory in program history. UTEP also snapped the Lady Toppers' 15-game home win streak. It was the second 15-game or longer home win streak that UTEP has snapped this season (17 games, New Mexico St.). Speaking of home win streaks, the Miners now have a solid one of their own, sitting at 13 consecutive victories in the Don Haskins Center. Furthermore, UTEP clinched its third 20-win season in four years and sixth in program history (all under head coach Keitha Adams).

→ Edwards Still Bringing the Rain

Middle Tennessee's Brea Edwards ranks in the top 10 nationally in multiple three-point shooting categories. Edwards has made 69 treys on the season and is knocking down 3.14 per game, good for eighth and ninth in the nation, respectively. On top of that, Edwards has been deadly accurate, connecting at a clip of nearly 45 percent from range. In her last game against LA Tech, Edwards scored a career-high 31 points and connected on six 3-pointer in the win.

→ Inside the Numbers

3.18 - The amount of steals per game by UTEP starting guard Starr Breedlove. The mark is good for eighth in the nation. She had a game-high six takeaways in the Miners' seasonshifting win over WKU to vault into first place.

1.5 - The amount of games that separate the top three programs atop the C-USA standings. UTEP is first with a 11-1 league mark, while Middle Tennesseee is 10-2 and WKU is 9-2. UTEP will host Florida Atlantic this weekend, while Middle Tennessee will duel Southern Miss. WKU will face Marshall on Sunday on ASN.

Conference USA women's basketball is set for prime television exposure again in 2015-16 as 47 (subject to change) regular-season games and the entire C-USA Women's Basketball Championship have been selected for television broadcasts across the country. The national television slate is highlighted by eight Fox Sports Network games, including seven C-USA matchups, and five games on the American Sports Network (ASN), while Charlotte and Middle Tennessee have been picked up locally in the Murfreesboro area (ch. 10) and the Charlotte area (Time Warner Cable ch. 22). WKU will also see five home matchups televised nationally by the Hilltopper Sports Satellite Network on FOX College Sports.




