WHAT'S UP?

→ WKU at UTEP on FOX College Sports

A clash of titans will occur on Saturday, Feb. 6, when 18-1 (9-0, C-USA) UTEP will hit the road to play 17-3 (8-1, C-USA) WKU on national television. The league's two top teams will duke it out on FOX College Sports with tipoff set for 2 p.m. CST.

→ Edwards Named USBWA National Player of the Week

The U.S. Basketball Writers Association has selected Middle Tennessee guard Brea Edwards as the Ann Meyers Drysdale Women's National Player of the Week for games ending the week of Sunday, Jan. 31. Edwards, a 5-10 senior guard from Rockford, Ill., averaged 23 points and 9.5 rebounds in wins over Marshall and WKU, the latter of which saw the senior score 29 points and grab 12 rebounds to help snap the Hilltoppers' 14-game win streak. She also connected on 8-of-11 three point attempts and shot 60 percent from the field in completing 12-of-20 attempts in the two games combined.

→ Bringing the Rain

Middle Tennessee's Brea Edwards and Florida Atlantic's Kat Wright are in the top 15 in multiple three-point categories. Edwards is knocking down 3.25 treys per game and has made 65 on the season, good for sixth and eighth in the nation, respectively. Wright is in the same ballpark as the junior from California has paced the top three-point team in C-USA with three 3-pointers per game (13th nationally) and has nailed 60 on the year (16th nationally). On top of that, Edwards and Wright have been deadly accurate, connecting at clips of 45.1 and 43.8 percent, respectively. Each of those marks are in the nation's top 10.

→ (RV) UTEP Off To Historical C-USA Start

With each win, UTEP creeps a little closer to C-USA history as its 9-0 start in league play is now tied for fifth (Marquette, 1997-98) for best C-USA start. Houston and the 2007-08 iteration of UTEP hold the record with 16-0 conference seasons. The 2011-12 UTEP squad is third on the list after starting 15-0 in conference action.

→ Inside the Numbers

14 - The amount of games in a row that WKU had won before being defeated by Middle Tennessee on Saturday. The Blue Raiders cooled off the previously red-hot Lady Toppers that had not lost a game since Dec. 2

behind the heroic efforts of senior guard Brea Edwards, who earned C-USA Player of the Week honors after drilling five 3-pointers on seven attempts to push her season total up to 65.

7 - The amount of schools in the nation with one or fewer losses, including 18-1 UTEP, the lead dog in C-USA. UTEP is off to its best overall start in program history and is riding a 10-game unbeaten streak. The Miners have been dominant for most of the season with a +12.7 margin, the highest in C-USA, and have only trailed in the fourth quarter four times in 19 contests. UTEP is 11th nationally in steals per game (11.7) and force a league-leading 21.58 turnovers per game, also good for 11th in the country.

WKU's Kendall Noble has been on a tear unlike any in recent history. The junior recorded the 10th triple-double in league history and first in program history against Charlotte with 17 points, 11 rebounds and 11 assists. She also recently cataloged a season-high 31 points against North Texas, and in doing so, joined the 1,000 point club in the WKU record books. Noble's 31-point onslaught is the second-highest total in league play (Kelsey Criner, North Texas - 34 at Rice).

TELEVISION

Conference USA women's basketball is set for prime television exposure again in 2015-16 as 47 (subject to change) regular-season games and the entire C-USA Women's Basketball Championship have been selected for television broadcasts across the country. The national television slate is highlighted by eight Fox Sports Network games, including seven C-USA matchups, and five games on the American Sports Network (ASN), while Charlotte and Middle Tennessee have been picked up locally in the Murfreesboro area (ch. 10) and the Charlotte area (Time Warner Cable ch. 22). WKU will also see five home matchups televised nationally by the Hilltopper Sports Satellite Network on FOX College Sports.

→ Jenkins Named USBWA National Freshman of the Week

The U.S. Basketball Writers Association has selected Southern Miss center Caitlin Jenkins as the Women's National Freshman of the Week for games ending the week of Sunday, Jan. 3. The USBWA's weekly honor will be handed out each Tuesday through Feb. 23 this season.

Jenkins, a 6-3 center from Shreveport, Louisiana, averaged a double-double of 22.5 points and 15.0 rebounds, and poured in 29 points and grabbed 15 rebounds against Louisiana Tech in the C-USA opener.

→ C-USA Championship

The 2016 Conference USA Men's and Women's Basketball Championships return to Birmingham, Alabama, March 8-12. Host UAB will welcome teams from the other C-USA member institutions for five full days of competitive basketball action.

Birmingham will host its third C-USA men's tournament, holding that role last season and in 1999. All 14 C-USA women's basketball teams will qualify for the tournament with the first two games on Tuesday, March 8, at Bartow Arena. The second round and quarterfinals will be also be played at Bartow Arena on Wednesday, March 9, and Thursday, March 10. Each game in the first three rounds will be televised nationally on the American Sports Network. The four teams with the best regular-season records in conference play will be seeded 1-4 and will earn a bye to

advance directly to Thursday's quarterfinals.

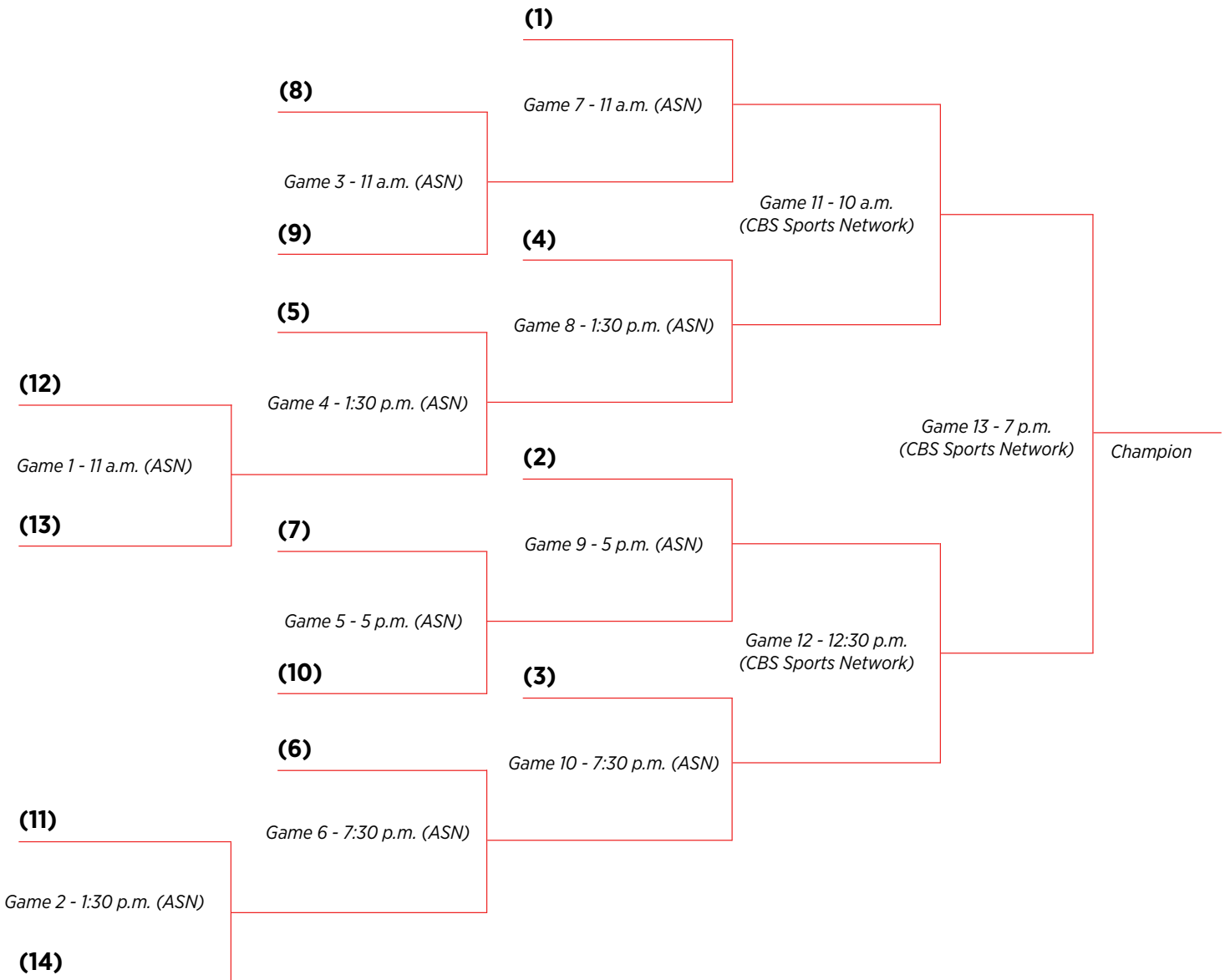
