

WHAT'S UP?

→ FOX Sports, ASN Coverage

For the third week in a row, FOX Sports will nationally televise a C-USA women's basketball contest. Florida Atlantic will head to Hattiesburg, Mississippi, for a meeting with Southern Miss on Thursday, Jan. 14, at 9 p.m. EST/8 p.m. CST. The upstart Owls will pit their top three-point offense (.370) against the Golden Eagles' top three-point defense (.280). UTSA will make the trip west to El Paso for a matchup with UTEP, a game that can be seen on the American Sports Network. Tip is set for 3 p.m. EST/2 p.m. CST on Sunday, Jan. 17.

→ Florida Atlantic Makes It Rain

In its win over Marshall on Jan. 7, Florida Atlantic knocked down 17 three-pointers at a 58 percent clip. The mark ranks second in C-USA single-game history to a March 5, 2014, performance when the Owls knocked down 20 against UTEP. Florida Atlantic is second in C-USA in three-point percentage (.370) on a league-leading 381 attempts. The second-most attempted treys in the conference is 308 by Marshall. Furthermore, the Owls have made a whopping 141 from beyond the arc, which is good for first in C-USA and 11th in the nation. Charlotte is second in C-USA in three-point conversions with 97, a mark that is 50 connections behind Florida Atlantic.

→<u>UTEP in Polls Fifth Consecutive</u> Week

UTEP continued its stay in the polls, receiving votes in the latest AP Top-25 Poll for the fifth consecutive week. The Miners have been dominant, dropping only one contest thus far on the road to Long Beach State. and is the lone 4-0 team in the league. It is one of three C-USA squads to appear in the polls this season and the lone C-USA team in the latest poll. UTEP is ninth nationally in turnovers forced per game (22.0).

Middle Tennessee rising star Brea Edwards is third nationally in three-pointers per game (3.36) and 15th in three-point percentage (.456).

→ Smooth Operators in the Queen City

C-USA has some exceptionally good offensive units, but Charlotte has stood out in the offensive efficiency department. The Niners are 19th nationally in FG percentage (.457) and boast the 32nd-ranked offense in the country (76.2 points per game). Charlotte is first in C-USA in each of those categories as well.

→ Insell Sixth on List of Winningest Active Coaches

Middle Tennessee skipper Rick Insell boasts a .758 win percentage in 343 total games. A mark that is also eighth on the NCAA lists. His company in the top eight includes names like Pat Summitt, Geno Auriemma and Kim Mulkey.

→ Jenkins Named USBWA National Freshman of the Week

The U.S. Basketball Writers Association selected Southern Miss center Caitlin Jenkins as the Women's National Freshman of the Week for games ending the week of Sunday, Jan. 3. Jenkins, a 6-3 center from Shreveport, Louisiana, averaged a double-double of 22.5 points and 15.0 rebounds, and poured in 29 points and grabbed 15 rebounds against Louisiana Tech in the C-USA opener.

→ Old Dominion Hits 1,000 Wins

In what is no small feat, the Lady Monarchs of Old Dominion topped the 1,000-win mark with a 19-point victory against Howard. ODU is only the fourth team in NCAA women's basketball history to be granted entry into the exclusive club, where they join fellow C-USA program Louisiana Tech.



Conference USA women's basketball is set for prime television exposure again in 2015-16 as 47 (subject to change) regular-season games and the entire C-USA Women's Basketball Championship have been selected for television broadcasts across the country. The national television slate is highlighted by eight Fox Sports Network games, including seven C-USA matchups, and five games on the American Sports Network (ASN), while Charlotte and Middle Tennessee have been picked up locally in the Murfreesboro area (ch. 10) and the Charlotte area (Time Warner Cable ch. 22). WKU will also see five home matchups televised nationally by the Hilltopper Sports Satellite Network on FOX College Sports.

The 2016 Conference USA Men's and Women's Basketball Championships return to Birmingham, Alabama, March 8-12. Host UAB will welcome teams from the other C-USA member institutions for five full days of competitive basketball action.

Birmingham will host its third C-USA men's tournament, holding that role last season and in 1999. All 14 C-USA women's basketball teams will qualify for the tournament with the first two games on Tuesday, March 8, at Bartow Arena. The second round and quarterfinals will be also be played at Bartow Arena on Wednesday, March 9, and Thursday, March 10. Each game in the first three rounds will be televised nationally on the American Sports Network. 





