WHAT'S UP?

→ UTSA at UTEP on ASN Coverage

UTSA will make the trip west to El Paso for a matchup with UTEP, a game that can be seen on the American Sports Network. Tip is set for 3 p.m. EST/2 p.m. CST on Sunday, Jan. 17.

→ UTEP in Polls Fifth Consecutive Week

UTEP continued its stay in the polls, receiving votes in the latest AP Top-25 Poll for the fifth consecutive week. The Miners have been dominant, dropping only one contest thus far on the road to Long Beach State. and is the lone 4-0 team in the league. It is one of three C-USA squads to appear in the polls this season and the lone C-USA team in the latest poll. UTEP is ninth nationally in turnovers forced per game (22.0).

→ Survivors

WKU has not dropped a game since a Dec. 2 trip to Ole Miss. Since then, the Lady Tops have won 10 consecutive games. Two of the past three, though, have not come comfortably. WKU escaped Miami with a two-point win over FIU before slipping past Rice by three points on Thursday night.

Middle Tennessee rising star Brea Edwards is third nationally in three-pointers per game (3.27) and 19th in three-point percentage (.438).

→ Smooth Operators in the Queen City

C-USA has some exceptionally good offensive units, but Charlotte has stood out in the offensive efficiency department. The Niners are 19th nationally in FG percentage (.457) and boast the 35th-ranked offense in the country (75.6 points per game). Charlotte is first in C-USA in each of those categories as well.

→ Jenkins Named USBWA National Freshman of the Week

The U.S. Basketball Writers Association selected Southern Miss center Caitlin Jenkins

as the Women's National Freshman of the Week for games ending the week of Sunday, Jan. 3. Jenkins, a 6-3 center from Shreveport, Louisiana, averaged a double-double of 22.5 points and 15.0 rebounds, and poured in 29 points and grabbed 15 rebounds against Louisiana Tech in the C-USA opener.

→ Old Dominion Hits 1,000 Wins

In what is no small feat, the Lady Monarchs of Old Dominion topped the 1,000-win mark with a 19-point victory against Howard. ODU is only the fourth team in NCAA women's basketball history to be granted entry into the exclusive club, where they join fellow C-USA program Louisiana Tech.

→ A Winning Tradition: C-USA Women's Basketball

National titles are in C-USA's DNA. Louisiana Tech sports three national championships (1981, 1982 and 1988), while Old Dominion carries a trio of its own (1979, 1980 and 1985). In summation, current C-USA programs hold a combined six national titles since 1979, winning all six in a span of less than a decade. C-USA is home to 50 NCAA Tournament berths and 52 WNIT squads between its 14 members. Of the member institutions in C-USA, 13 have won at least one conference championship in their respective histories. Old Dominion leads the charge, boasting a league-best 22 tournament crowns to go with 21 regular-season titles, while Louisiana Tech is second with 16 tournament titles and 20 regular-season trophies.

TELEVISION

Conference USA women's basketball is set for prime television exposure again in 2015-16 as 47 (subject to change) regular-season games and the entire C-USA Women's Basketball Championship have been selected for television broadcasts across the country. The national television slate is highlighted by eight Fox Sports Network games, including seven C-USA matchups, and five games on the American Sports Network (ASN), while Charlotte and Middle Tennessee have been picked up locally in the Murfreesboro area (ch. 10) and the Charlotte area (Time Warner Cable ch. 22). WKU will also see five home matchups televised nationally by the Hilltopper Sports Satellite Network on FOX College Sports.

→ Jenkins Named USBWA National Freshman of the Week

The U.S. Basketball Writers Association has selected Southern Miss center Caitlin Jenkins as the Women's National Freshman of the Week for games ending the week of Sunday, Jan. 3. The USBWA's weekly honor will be handed out each Tuesday through Feb. 23 this season.

Jenkins, a 6-3 center from Shreveport, Louisiana, averaged a double-double of 22.5 points and 15.0 rebounds, and poured in 29 points and grabbed 15 rebounds against Louisiana Tech in the C-USA opener.

→ C-USA Championship



The 2016 Conference USA Men's and Women's Basketball Championships return to Birmingham, Alabama, March 8-12. Host UAB will welcome teams from the other C-USA member institutions for five full days of competitive basketball action.

Birmingham will host its third C-USA men's tournament, holding that role last season and in 1999. All 14 C-USA women's basketball teams will qualify for the tournament with the first two games on Tuesday, March 8, at Bartow Arena. The second round and quarterfinals will be also be played at Bartow Arena on Wednesday, March 9, and Thursday, March 10. Each game in the first three rounds will be televised nationally on the American Sports Network. The four teams with the best regular-season records in conference play will be seeded 1-4 and will earn a bye to advance directly to Thursday's quarterfinals.

Semifinal action for the tournament will move over to the Birmingham Jefferson Convention Complex (BJCC), where the final four squads will duke it out on the CBS Sports Network on Friday, March 11. The championship will then be played on Saturday, March 12, at 7 p.m. CST on CBS Sports Network.
