WHAT'S UP?

→ Old Dominion at WKU Coverage

One of the league's hottest teams in WKU, which has won 11 consecutive games, will play host to one of the preseason favorites coming off a buzzer-beater victory on the road at Middle Tennessee in Old Dominion. The game will be available nationally to those with FOX College Sports Atlantic on Thursday, Jan. 21, at 12 p.m. EST.

→ UTEP in Polls Sixth Consecutive Week; WKU Rejoins for First Time Since November

UTEP continued its stay in the polls, receiving votes in the latest AP Top-25 Poll for the sixth consecutive week. The Miners have been dominant, dropping only one contest thus far on the road to Long Beach State. UTEP is joined this week by WKU, which returns to the polls for the first time since Nov. 30. UTEP and WKU are the only undefeated squads in C-USA at 5-0 in league play.

→ 1,004 for Noble

WKU's Kendall Noble cataloged 31 points against North Texas on Saturday, and in doing so, joined the 1,000 point club in the WKU record books. Noble's 31-point onslaught is the second-highest total in league play (Kelsey Criner, North Texas - 34 at Rice). Furthermore, Noble drained four 3-pointers in the game, which tied her career-best single-game mark.

→ Inside the Numbers

3 and 1 - The scoring offense and defense ranks for WKU in C-USA games. The Lady Toppers score 70.0 points per game and only give up 57.0 on the backend. Florida Atlantic is first in scoring in league games (75.0), while Old Dominion is second in defense since since league play began on Jan. 1 (57.8).

18 and 12.6 - The point-rebound split of Southern Miss freshman and three-time C-USA Freshman of the Week Caitlin Jenkins thus far in conference play. The Shreveport, Louisiana, product is averaging a double-double in league play, leading the league in boards while sitting fifth in points per game.

+13 - The average scoring margin for WKU thus far in league play (a 5-0 start). The defending champs have quietly kept pace with UTEP, which is also 5-0 in C-USA. The Lady Toppers are 14-2 overall, while UTEP (which is averaging a +8 scoring margin in C-USA) is 14-1.

→ A Winning Tradition: C-USA Women's Basketball

National titles are in C-USA's DNA. Louisiana Tech sports three national championships (1981, 1982 and 1988), while Old Dominion carries a trio of its own (1979, 1980 and 1985). In summation, current C-USA programs hold a combined six national titles since 1979, winning all six in a span of less than a decade. C-USA is home to 50 NCAA Tournament berths and 52 WNIT squads between its 14 members. Of the member institutions in C-USA, 13 have won at least one conference championship in their respective histories. Old Dominion leads the charge, boasting a league-best 22 tournament crowns to go with 21 regular-season titles, while Louisiana Tech is second with 16 tournament titles and 20 regular-season trophies.

TELEVISION

Conference USA women's basketball is set for prime television exposure again in 2015-16 as 47 (subject to change) regular-season games and the entire C-USA Women's Basketball Championship have been selected for television broadcasts across the country. The national television slate is highlighted by eight Fox Sports Network games, including seven C-USA matchups, and five games on the American Sports Network (ASN), while Charlotte and Middle Tennessee have been picked up locally in the Murfreesboro area (ch. 10) and the Charlotte area (Time Warner Cable ch. 22). WKU will also see five home matchups televised nationally by the Hilltopper Sports Satellite Network on FOX College Sports.

→ Jenkins Named USBWA National Freshman of the Week

The U.S. Basketball Writers Association has selected Southern Miss center Caitlin Jenkins as the Women's National Freshman of the Week for games ending the week of Sunday, Jan. 3. The USBWA's weekly honor will be handed out each Tuesday through Feb. 23 this season.

Jenkins, a 6-3 center from Shreveport, Louisiana, averaged a double-double of 22.5 points and 15.0 rebounds, and poured in 29 points and grabbed 15 rebounds against Louisiana Tech in the C-USA opener.

→ C-USA Championship

The 2016 Conference USA Men's and Women's Basketball Championships return to Birmingham, Alabama, March 8-12. Host UAB will welcome teams from the other C-USA member institutions for five full days of competitive basketball action.

Birmingham will host its third C-USA men's tournament, holding that role last season and in 1999. All 14 C-USA women's basketball teams will qualify for the tournament with the first two games on Tuesday, March 8, at Bartow Arena. The second round and quarterfinals will be also be played at Bartow Arena on Wednesday, March 9, and Thursday, March 10. Each game in the first three rounds will be televised nationally on the American Sports Network. The four teams with the best regular-season records in conference play will be seeded 1-4 and will earn a bye to

advance directly to Thursday's quarterfinals.

Semifinal action for the tournament will move over to the Birmingham Jefferson Convention Complex (BJCC), where the final four squads will duke it out on the CBS Sports Network on Friday, March 11. The championship will then be played on Saturday, March 12, at 7 p.m. CST on CBS Sports Network.
