## PLAGIARISM vs COPYRIGHT INFRINGEMENT

## **PLAGIARISM**

- "Academic dishonesty"
- Not a legal matter; handled by the University
- Failing to give credit to others for their ideas, i.e., passing others' work and/or ideas off as your own
- Keywords = **CITATION**, **IDEAS**

## **COPYRIGHT INFRINGEMENT**

- Legal matter Governed by "fair use" provisions of the US federal copyright law ( <a href="http://www.copyright.gov/">http://www.copyright.gov/</a>)
- Only the **expression** of ideas is protected; ideas themselves are not copyrightable
- Fail to obtain permission when using material beyond "fair use"
- Keywords = PERMISSION, EXPRESSION OF IDEAS
