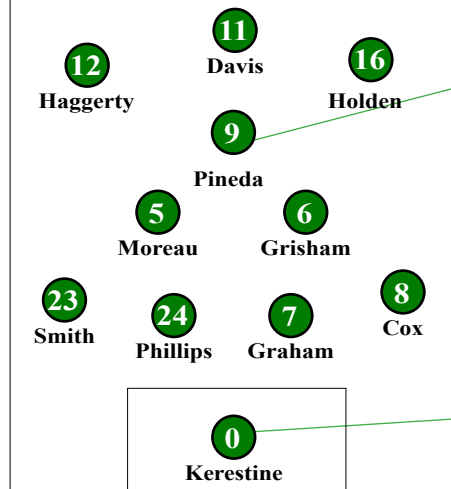

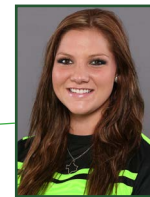

**MEAN GREEN STORYLINES**

- North Texas remained in first place in the conference standings with its tie against Rice. The Mean Green is in first place with 13 points, Charlotte is in second with 12 points and Rice is tied for third with 10.
- North Texas is receiving national attention. The Mean Green is receiving votes in the NSCAA/Continental Tire National Poll for the fourth time this season and for a second consecutive week. The Mean Green is also ranked in the top 10 nationally in goals against average, save percentage and shutout percentage.
- North Texas holds an 8-0 series mark against Florida Atlantic and leads the series against FIU, 12-3-2. NT defeated FIU, 4-1, in last year's conference tournament.
- Jackie Kerestine recorded a career-high 11 saves against Rice. The 11 saves is also ties for the fifth most in school history.
- Jackie Kerestine is ranked nationally in goals against average (12th) and save percentage (6th).
- Jackie Kerestine received C-USA Player of the Week honors for the second straight week after recording two more shutouts against UTEP and UTSA.
- Karla Pineda received C-USA Offensive Player of the Week honors after her performance against UTEP and UTSA. She was involved in all three goals, including scoring two.
- Karla Pineda scored the gamewinner against UTEP, converting a penalty kick in overtime. It was Pineda's first made PK this season and the team's first of the year.
- Karla Pineda was named an honorable mention to TopDrawerSoccer.com's Team of the Week.
- The Mean Green normally doesn't lose at home but the reverse is true this year. North Texas is 4-0-1 on the road with four shutouts.
- North Texas finished its non-conference schedule with a 6-3 mark, losing three of its last four games before conference play. The Mean Green gave up six goals in nine games, including a combined four goals in the two overtime losses.
- The Mean Green has lost three games at home this season (a 2-1 overtime loss to No. 15 OU; a 2-1 overtime loss to Gonzaga and a 1-0 loss to TCU). The last time North Texas lost three games at home was 2008. North Texas has lost three games at home to TCU.
- Molly Grisham scored the game-winning

goal against Vanderbilt with a curling shot that went into the upper 90 of the goal in the 68th minute. The goal gave North Texas a 1-0 victory against the SEC opponent.

- Molly Grisham was named Conference USA Co-Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 8 for her game-winning goal vs. Vandy. She shares the honor with Rice's Nia Stallings who scored the game-winning goal against Vanderbilt.
- Karla Pineda scored the game-winning goal against Lamar. The team's corner kick specialist, she scored directly off the corner kick, the ball curling into the upper 90 of the goal.
- Rachel Holden started the season with two game-winning goals and was named Conference USA Offensive Player of the Week on Aug. 25. She also started her freshman campaign by being named Offensive POW.
- NT was tabbed by the league's coaches to finish second in its second year in Conference USA. Charlotte was picked first.
- In 2013, the Mean Green earned the league's No. 2 seed and a trip to the C-USA title game.
- In 2013, Kelsey Hodges was named C-USA Defensive Player of the Year, while Rachel Holden was named offensive player of the year and freshman of the year.
- Since the program's birth in 1995, the Mean Green has never had a losing season. North Texas' 19-year combined record stands at 274-109-24 - a .701 winning percentage.
- The ultimate goal of the program, North Texas has advanced to the NCAA Tournament three times - 2004, 2005 and 2012. Only five Division I schools in the state of Texas (of 20) have more NCAA Tournament appearances. In C-USA, only Charlotte has more tourney bids.
- Rachel Holden returns for her sophomore season after scoring 12 goals in her freshman debut. She has garnered a few preseason accolades, including C-USA's Preseason Offensive Player of the Year honoree and being named to TopDrawerSoccer.com's Top 100 player rankings and Top 20 C-USA rankings.
- Junior Amber Haggerty was named TopDrawerSoccer.com's Top 20 player rankings in Conference USA.
- Junior goalkeeper Jackie Kerestine and junior midfielder Lindsey Hulstein were both named captains of the 2014 team.
- Since the Mean Green Soccer Complex opened in 2006 North Texas is a gaudy 68-10-6 (84 percent) at home.

**MEAN GREEN QUICK SHOTS**

- North Texas is outshooting its opponents, 285-163. The 285 shots leads the conference.
- North Texas has allowed seven goals this season. The seven goals is the lowest among C-USA schools.
- North Texas has allowed one goal in conference play (vs. Rice).
- North Texas recorded its first tie of the season with the game against Rice.
- Defensively, North Texas leads the conference with the lowest goals against average, save percentage and the most shutouts.
- North Texas won its first overtime game in 2014 with the victory against UTEP.
- Jackie Kerestine and Karla Pineda are the fourth and fifth Mean Green players to earn C-USA player of the week honors. Kerestine received defensive honors for the second straight week.
- Jackie Moreau headed in her first goal of the season against UTSA.
- The Mean Green's goal in the second minute of the game against UTSA was NT's earliest goal of the season.
- Kaylah Hunter and Kelci Slaughter scored their first goals of the season against Southern Miss. They are the second and third freshmen to score goals this season.
- Rachel Holden scored her third goal of the season against Southern Miss. It was her first goal since scoring two goals in the opening week of play.
- Karla Pineda has scored two goals directly off corner kicks this season and has scored four total goals off set pieces.
- North Texas has picked up wins against an SEC school (Vanderbilt) and a Pac-12 School (Oregon State). The Mean Green is also 3-0 against the Southland Conference and 1-0 vs. a SWAC school. NT is 0-2 against the Big XII Conference and 0-1 against the West Coast Conference.
- In the opening three week of the season, North Texas picked up two player of the week honors (Rachel Holden and Molly Grisham).
- Chelsea Soto scored her first career goal against Abilene Christian. She is the first freshman on the team to score a goal.

**8** - In all, Hedlund has led North Texas to eight conference championships, including five regular season titles, and three trips to the NCAA Tournament (2004, 2005, 2012).

**21** - Hedlund enters the 2014 season ranked 21st among active Division I coaches nationwide with a .701 win percentage, and his 250 wins rank him tied for 24th.

**25** - With the win in the 2012 Sun Belt Tournament final, John Hedlund became just the 25th coach in NCAA Division I history to reach the 250 win plateau.

**64** - Hedlund has produced 61 all-conference players since 1999, including last year's C-USA Offensive and Defensive Player of the Year honorees. He has won three Sun Belt Coach of the Year awards, the latest in 2011.
