### **MEAN GREEN STORYLINES**

- For the second time in school history, North Texas will play Texas Tech in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament. The two teams will have a rematch of the 2012 NCAA Tournament game when the Red Raiders defeated the Mean Green, 2-0.
- Texas Tech will face a familiar North Texas lineup on Friday. Seven seniors from the current Mean Green team played in the NCAA game against Texas Tech in 2012 as freshman. Six of the seven (Jackie Kerestine, Tess Graham, Lindsey Hulstein, Jackie Moreau, Amber Haggerty, Karla Pineda) were starters in that game. Molly Grisham came off the bench.
- The Mean Green is receiving votes in the NSCAA national poll for the seventh straight week. North Texas received 14 votes in the Nov. 12 poll.
- The third time was a charm for the Mean Green. North Texas won its first C-USA tournament championship on Sunday after falling in the title games in 2014 and 2013.
- North Texas won its fourth conference tournament title and is advancing to the NCAA Tournament for the fourth time. Altogether, North Texas has now won 11 conference championships.
- The winning formula for the Mean Green during the conference tournament was to score an early goal and then let the defense preserve the win.
   North Texas was able to replicate this formula three straight times, en route to the title.
- Amber Haggerty scored the game-winning goal in the title game against Marshall. The forward scored the game-winning goal in the 2012 Sun Belt title game against FIU and sent the Mean Green to the NCAA Tournament. The 2012 season was the last time that North Texas won a conference tournament and advanced to the NCAA Tournament.
- The Mean Green won the conference tournament behind three 1-0 victories. North Texas defeated No. 8 WKU off a **Molly Grisham** header right before half. **Rachel Holden** scored the game-winning goal in the 27th minute against No. 5 Middle Tennessee. **Amber Haggerty** scored off her own rebound in the 15th minute against Marshall.
- With the three shutouts in the conference tournament, North Texas set a team school record with 16 shutouts. The 2015 team eclipsed the 2014 team which set the record with 14. Jackie Kerestine set her own school record for individual shutouts in a single season with 15.
- Jackie Kerestine, Rachel Holden, Tess Graham and Amber Haggerty were all named to the C-USA All-Tournament Team. Jackie was also named Defensive MVP, while Rachel was named Offensive MVP.
- Jackie Kerestine has set nearly every goalkeeping record at North Texas. The one record that has eluded her is single-season saves in a season. With her three saves against Marshall, Kerestine extends her season saves total to 114, moving into third place on the single-season list. She needs four more saves to tie the record and five to break the record.

- Karla Pineda is lethal on set pieces. The Mean Green is always dangerous on corner kicks, thanks to Karla. She earned the assist on Molly Grisham's goal against WKU with her corner kick. The assist was her ninth, tying her for sixth on the Mean Green's single-season list. She stands in second on NT's career list with 33.
- The victory over WKU was a historical one for the Mean Green. With the win, the 2015 North Texas team set a school record for wins in a season with 17. The 2015 team is the first Mean Green squad to eclipse the 16-win mark. The 2014 team and three other teams have hit 16 wins but have stopped there. With wins over Middle Tennessee and Marshall, North Texas is now at 19 wins.
- North Texas was honored by Conference USA with six all-conference performers, highlighted by Rachel Holden, who was named Co-Offensive Player of the Year, and Karla Pineda, who was named Midfielder of the Year. Goalkeeper Jackie Kerestine joined Holden and Pineda on the first-team squad. Tess Graham and Molly Grisham, the senior defenders that anchor the backline, were both named to the third team. Taylor Torres was named to the all-freshman team.
- The Mean Green's hopes of going undefeated in conference play were dashed when Louisiana Tech defeated North Texas, 1-0. The Mean Green was shutout for the first time since tying Marshall, 0-0, on Sept. 25. The Techsters snapped the Mean Green's eight-game winning streak, its longest streak of the season.
- The Mean Green won its 10th conference championship when it defeated Rice, 2-1, on Oct. 25. The win gave North Texas an 8-0-1 conference mark and the regular-season conference championship. North Texas has now won back-to-back regular-season conference championships.
- The Mean Green has won back-to-back regular season titles for the third time in school history. North Texas has accomplished the feat in 2004-05 and 2011-12.
- With its 8-1-1 conference record, the Mean Green secured a No. 1 seed for the conference tournament. This is the second straight year that North Texas has entered the tournament as the No. 1 seed.
- The Mean Green honored its eight seniors on Senior Day, Sunday, Oct. 25 against Rice. According to CollegeSoccer360.com, the North Texas seniors are the 12th winningest senior class in the nation. The seniors have posted a record of 64-20-5 in the last four years, including four conference championships and an NCAA Tournament appearance.
- Not one player on the Mean Green roster has ever lost a home game in conference play. NT is 32-0-2 in league play since its last home conference loss on Halloween of 2008 a span of seven full seasons.
- Rachel Holden was named Conference USA Offensive Player of the Week for the first time this season on Oct. 19. She posted two game-winning goals against Middle Tennessee and UAB.
- Jackie Kerestine was named Conference USA Goalkeeper of the Week for the fifth time this season on Oct 12.

### MEAN GREEN QUICK SHOTS

- The Mean Green is 0-3 in NCAA Tournament games. North Texas has lost to Texas Tech, SMU and Texas in post-season games. North Texas has also never scored in an NCAA game.
- The Mean Green's four trips to the NCAA tournament is the most of any other program at North Texas.
- North Texas is 4-4-1 in the series history with Texas Tech. The Mean Green has not faced the Red Raiders since the 2012 NCAA Tournament loss. The last time that North Texas defeated Texas Tech was a 2-1 overtime victory at home in 2009.
- North Texas has set a school record with 19 wins this season. The 19-win total is the most among all 64 teams participating in the NCAA Tournament.
- John Hedlund won his 299th career game against Marshall. If the team wins on Friday against Texas Tech, he would become the 19th active Division I head women's soccer coach to achieve 300 wins. He would also become the 20th coach all-time in Division I women's soccer to hit the 300-win plateau.
- North Texas was ranked 36th in the November 9th's NCAA RPI Rankings. The 36th ranking is a jump of 12 from the week before. The 36 is a program best.
- North Texas is back on the winning track with three straight wins. North Texas posted a season-high eight-game winning streak before falling to Louisiana Tech in its final regular-season game. The eight-game winning streak spanned 40 days. Altogether, North Texas has won 11 of its last 12 games.
- North Texas has given up nine goals this season. The Mean Green allowed four goals in conference play.
- Rachel Holden scored her team-leading 12th goal of the season against Middle Tennessee. The 12 goals ties her total from her freshman year. The junior has posted six game-winning goals. Four of them have come against conference opponents and one during the tournamnet.
- The Mean Green won its first overtime game this season with the 1-0 against Charlotte. NT is 1-1-1 in overtime games this season.
- Amber Haggerty is the third player this season to record a mult-goal game.
- North Texas opened its conference season with a tie for the second time in the last three years. The Mean Green has posted at least one tie in a season in the last eight years.

### **MEAN GREEN STORYLINES**

- Karla Pineda converted her third penalty kick against ODU. She scored the Mean Green's fastest goal of the season at 1:43. She is fourth in career penalty kicks made with six.
- For the second year in a row, North Texas came so close to defeating a Top 25 team. North Texas fell to No. 5 Texas A&M, 2-1, after taking a 1-0 lead at the start of the second period. The Mean Green lost to No. 15 Oklahoma, 2-1, in double overtime last year after taking a 1-0 lead in the 82nd minute.
- Karla Pineda scored the game-winning goals in back-to-back games for the Mean Green. She scored the gamewinner off a set piece against TCU and then converted the penalty kick against Oral Roberts.
- Jackie Kerestine gave up two goals against No. 5 Texas A&M, the first goals she has given up since Kansas scored two on August 30. She made a careerhigh 15 saves against the Aggies, the second most in school history.
- In her first start of the season, **Anna Flobeck** gave North Texas a 1-0 lead against No.5 Texas A&M at the start of the second half when she knocked in a goal off a pass from Karla Pineda.
- North Texas scored a season-high six goals against Lamar, the most since scoring nine on Texas Southern in 2013. North Texas recorded 39 shots on goal, tying for the fourth-most shots in a single game in school history.
- The Mean Green started off the 2015 season by winning its first two games and capturing the Las Vegas Invitational Tournament.
- Rachel Holden, Olivia Bagby and Jackie Kerestine were all named to the all-tournament team. Kerestine was also named the tournament's Most Outstanding Defensive Player and the overall MVP.
- Olivia Bagby scored the Mean Green's first goal of the 2015 season. She came off the bench against Southern Utah and gave North Texas an early 1-0 lead off an assist by freshman Taylor Torres.
- Jackie Kerestine was named Conference USA's Goalkeeper of the Week on Aug 24. Kerestine was named Defensive Player of the Week four times last year and was the first recipient of the new goalkeeper of the week award.
- Jackie Kerestine was named to the TopDrawerSoccer.com's Team of the Week as an honorable mention on Aug. 24.
- The Mean Green is bringing most of its squad back from a 2014 record-breaking season, when the team tied a program record with 16 wins, set a single-season record with 14 shutouts and claimed its ninth conference championship with the regular-season title.
- Three North Texas soccer players were named to the preseason All-Conference USA team. Senior goalkeeper **Jackie Kerestine**, senior midfielder **Karla Pineda** and junior forward **Rachel Holden** were all selected by the league's coaches for the preseason team.
- North Texas was selected to finish second in Conference USA after finishing as runner-up in the

- conference tournament last year. The Mean Green won the regular-season title in 2014. Rice took the top spot after winning the conference tournament.
- North Texas is receiving national attention. The Mean Green received votes in the NSCAA/Continental Tire National Preseason Poll. It received votes seven times last season and five consecutive weeks in a stretch.
- After a breakout junior season, Karla Pineda was ranked in TopDrawerSoccer's Preseason Top 100 Players. Pineda led the team in goals, assists and points last year and was named first-team all-conference and second-team all-region.
- In the history of the Mean Green soccer program, North Texas has advanced to four straight conference finals in the combined two leagues (Sun Belt and Conference USA). All together, North Texas has advanced to 11 finals appearances.
- North Texas won the Conference USA regular season title outright in 2014. It was the program's ninth conference championship and sixth regular season title. It was the Mean Green's first conference championship in Conference USA.

### MEAN GREEN QUICK SHOTS

- The Mean Green posted season highs against Texas A&M with 23 fouls and six yellow cards. That is the most fouls issued against North Texas since recording 28 fouls and being issued six yellows in a 2-1 loss to Oklahoma State in 2013. The OSU game featured a combined 52 fouls, 9 yellow cards and 2 red cards.
- The Mean Green lost its first game on the road when it fell to No. 5 Texas A&M in College Station. North Texas is now 4-1 on the road.
- Anna Flobeck and Kelci Slaughter started their first games of the season against Texas A&M. It was Slaughter's first career start.
- Until beating TCU on Sept. 13, North Texas had not recorded a win against a Big 12 team since defeating Oklahoma, 5-0, on Sept. 15, 2013. The Mean Green also defeated TCU that year.
- Brooke Bradley made her first appearance in goal this season when she played seven minutes against Abilene Christian.
- North Texas lost its home opener for the first time in school history. The Mean Green tied Oral Roberts to open the 2012 season at home.



### HEAD COACH JOHN HEDLUND

### 299-114-26 (71.O PERCENT) 21ST SEASON

- In all, Hedlund has led North Texas to 11 conference championships, including seven regular season titles, and four trips to the NCAA Tournament (2004, 2005, 2012, 2015).

- Hedlund enters the 2015 season ranked 21st among **L** active Division I coaches nationwide with a .703 win percentage, and his 250 wins rank him tied for 24th.

 $25^{\text{-}}$  With the win in the 2012 Sun Belt Tournament final, John Hedlund became just the 25th coach in NCAA Division I history to reach the 250-win plataeu.

67- Hedlund has produced 73 all-conference players since 1999, including this year's Co-Offensive Player of the Year Rachel Holden and Midfielder of the Year Karla Pineda.
