Why UNT is Becoming Smoke-Free

To minimize the dangers of secondhand smoke.

To protect the health and welfare of everyone on UNT's campus.

To maintain a healthy and pleasant environment for all.

The Details

The policy will be in effect Jan. 1, 2013.

The policy applies to all UNT students, faculty, staff, visitors, and contractors and subcontractors.

The policy applies to all UNT-owned or leased property (both indoor and outdoor).

The Process for Developing the Policy

APRIL 2012: A statistically valid survey of students, faculty and staff was conducted to evaluate support for a smoke-free environment. About three-fourths of those surveyed favored a smoke-free environment.

MAY 2012: President Rawlins announced plans to implement a Smoke-Free Campus Policy in January 2013.

SUMMER/FALL 2012: Committee of students, faculty and staff drafted the Smoke-Free Campus Policy.

FALL 2012: President's Cabinet reviewed and approved the policy.

FALL 2012: UNT System Office of General Counsel reviewed and approved the policy for legal sufficiency.

What is Prohibited



Smoking is prohibited on UNT property (indoors and outdoors) and in UNT-owned vehicles.

What is Prohibited



The use of smokeless tobacco and electronic cigarettes is prohibited in buildings. It is allowed only outdoors, 25 feet or more from a building entrance.

What is Prohibited



The sale and distribution of tobacco products are prohibited on campus.

Tobacco-Free Zone Signs

Tobacco-Free Zones prohibit all tobacco use in and around applicable buildings due to CPRIT (Cancer Prevention and Research **Institute of Texas)** grant requirements. **Life Sciences** Complex is the only **Tobacco-Free Zone** so far.

Be aware of the policy.

How the Policy Will Be Enforced

Voluntary Compliance and Enforcement

 If you are a smoker, don't smoke on the UNT campus.

 If you are a smoker, you may smoke in your personal vehicle provided that the windows are closed and waste products are disposed of properly.

How the Policy Will Be Enforced

Voluntary Compliance and Enforcement

 If you see a violation, respectfully inform the person of UNT's Smoke-Free Campus Policy and ask that they comply.

 If you witness repeat violations, you should contact Human Resources or Student Affairs so that the violations can be considered in accordance with established administrative/disciplinary policies and procedures.
