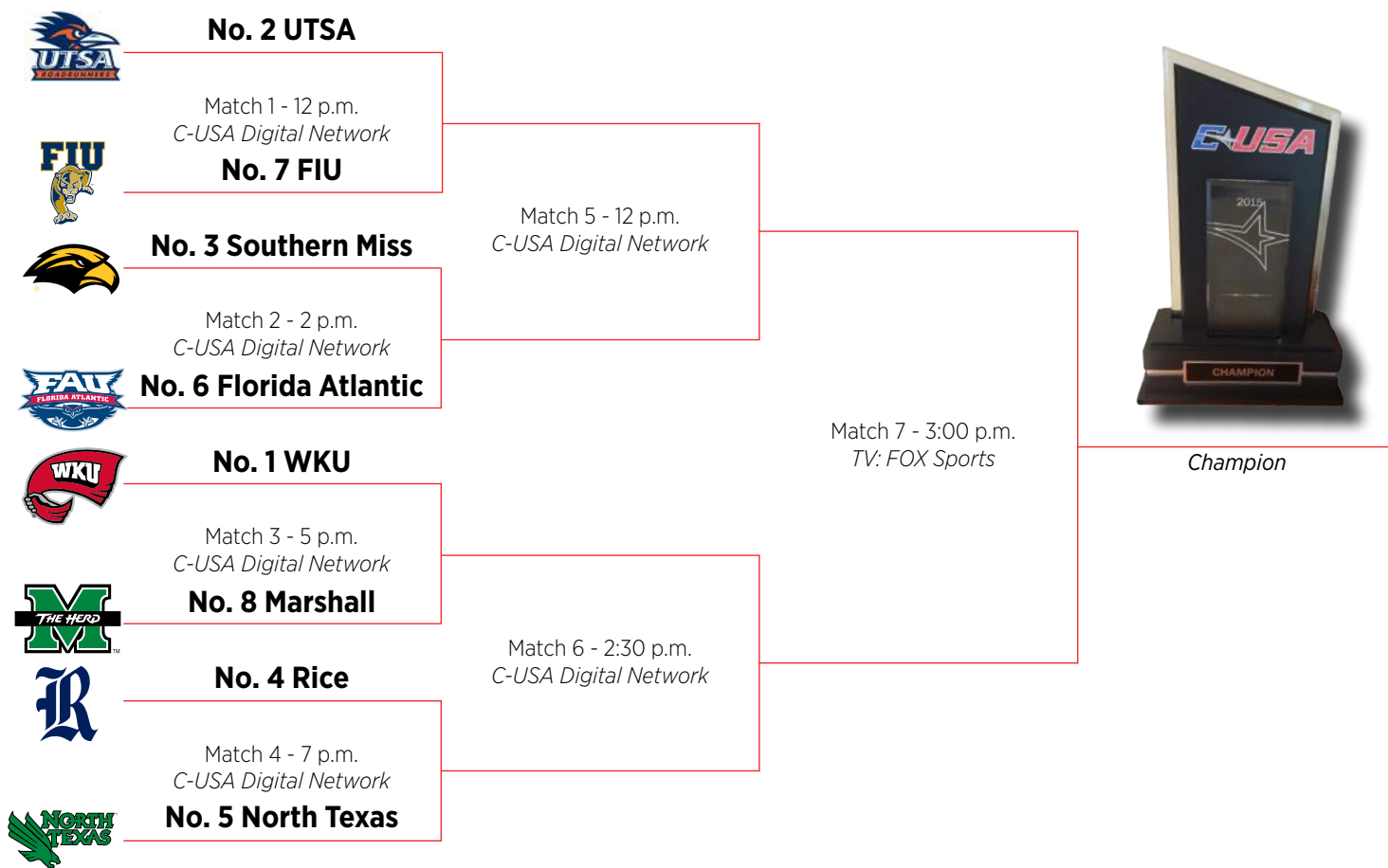

### CONVOCATION CENTER - SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS

The 2015 Conference USA Volleyball Championships will be played in the Convocation Center on the campus of UTSA in San Antonio, Texas. The event will be the Roadrunner Athletic Department's first opportunity to host a C-USA Championship in any sport since joining the membership in 2013.

### parking info

Visitors attending all UTSA home games at the Convocation Center will be able to park in any open UNMARKED spaces in Lot 5. Parking Lot 5 encompasses the parking area in front of both the Convocation Center and the UTSA Recreation & Wellness Center. Visitors that are unable to find available parking in Lot 5 are encouraged to park in the South Parking Garage, which is located directly to the southeast of the Convocation Center. When returning to their parked vehicles in the South Parking Garage, visitors must visit the cashier's booth in northwest corner of the garage with the parking card they received at the gate upon entering the garage. ## competitive highlights

### TOP 25 UPSETS

Conference USA finished the 2015 regular season with a 6-5 record against AVCA Top 25/Receiving Votes opponents including upsets over: No. 5 Wisconsin (WKU), No. 12 Oregon (UTSA), No. 23 Colorado (Rice), RV LSU (Rice), RV Oklahoma (North Texas), and RV Lipscomb (Florida Atlantic).

### IN THE POLLS

From the season's start to finish, C-USA has had a team in the AVCA Top 25 Poll each week. WKU has ranked as high as No. 20 in 2015, and currently ranks 21st in the nation heading into postseason play. Currently, five C-USA squads rank in the top 100 of the NCAA RPI (WKU, Rice, UTSA, Florida Atlantic and North Texas).

### NATIONAL AWARDS

For the sixth-consecutive season, C-USA has had a student-athlete earn an AVCA National Player of the Week Award, as Rice's Madison McDaniel earned the honor on Nov. 3. Additionally in 2015, Carnae Dillard was named National Player of the Week by ESPNW on Nov. 11, exactly one year from the date she received the AVCA honor in 2014.

### THE NATIONAL PICTURE

C-USA boasted six squads in the top 20 toughest schedules in the NCAA, yet still amassed a 102-79 non-conference record overall as a league. The 102 victories is 4th-most among all conferences, trailing only the Big Ten, SEC and ACC.

## [2015 POSTSEASON AWARDS]

### 2015 #CUSAVB INDIVIDUAL AWARDS

LEAGUE ANNOUNCES THIS YEAR'S SUPERLATIVE AWARDS  
Nov. 18, 2015

IRVING, Texas - Conference USA has named the 2015 C-USA Volleyball individual superlative award winners, as selected by a vote of the league's 13 head coaches. Regular-season champion WKU earned the most representation with three awards, while North Texas and Southern Miss rounded out the list with one honor apiece.

For the second-consecutive season, North Texas' **Carnae Dillard** was selected as Conference USA Player of the Year. Dillard, one of the most prolific offensive threats in league history, becomes the sixth repeat winner in C-USA history. The Mean Green senior outside hitter is not only the program's all-time kills leader, but also ranks third on the C-USA all-time list and is the league's third-highest career scorer in history (first in both categories among active membership).

Dillard, with 651 kills (5.43/set) on 1,679 attacks (13.99/set) and 706.5 points, currently leads the nation this season in six offensive categories and is second in another (points per set - 5.89). Additionally, the two-time national player of the week is the NCAA's active career leader in three offensive categories (kills - 2291, kills per set - 4.75, attacks - 5974). The San Antonio, Texas-native will wrap up her impressive career in this week's Conference USA Volleyball Championships, fittingly to be played in her hometown at host UTSA.

After placing a league-most six student-athletes on all-conference squads, Conference USA regular season champion WKU also takes home three of the five postseason individual awards. In 2015, head coach **Travis Hudson** became one of three active league coaches to surpass the 500-career win milestone en route to a 28-3 (15-1 C-USA) record and the No. 21 spot in the latest AVCA Top 25 Coaches Poll. Hudson's Coach of the Year campaign included win on the road at then-No.5 Wisconsin on the season's opening weekend.

Two student-athletes join Hudson in the awards lineup, **Jessica Lucas** and rookie **Rachel Anderson**. Lucas, a three-time C-USA setter of the week during the season, ranks 18th nationally with 1,192 total assists this season and her 11.06 assist per set average is good for 29th in the NCAA. The sophomore setter orchestrated an extremely efficient Hilltopper offense that hit an outstanding .294, tied for 6th in the nation with USC, the AVCA's No. 1-ranked team in the land.

Freshman-sensation Anderson found herself inserted into a star-studded starting lineup in Bowling Green from the get-go. The WKU youngster stepped into her collegiate debut at No. 5 Wisconsin, smashing home a cool nine kills on .412 hitting. The middle hitter's impressive .316 hitting percentage not only ranks second among league freshman, but is in the top ten of all C-USA student-athletes as well.

Southern Miss' **Mary Pursell**, one of two returning faces to the postseason awards slate, takes home Libero of the Year honors for the second-consecutive season. The three-time C-USA defensive player of the week this season leads the league in both total digs (640) and digs per set (4.85). The senior made sure to leave a legacy behind in Hattiesburg, as she set the program's single-season digs record in 2015 en route to landing herself at No. 2 all-time on the Southern Miss career list. Pursell looked cool and calm all season long, leading the Golden Eagles to a league-best 9-3 record in a league-most 12 five-set matches and the team's third straight C-USA Championships appearance.

Two-time Conference USA regular season champion WKU (28-3) comes into the Conference USA Tournament on a five-match winning streak with all five victories coming in straight-sets. Earlier this season, the Lady Toppers won 17 consecutive matches beginning with a sweep over Big Ten-foe Northwestern on Friday, Sept. 11, and ending with a five-set loss at Rice Saturday, Oct. 31.



WKU leads Conference USA and ranks in the top 10 nationally in both hitting percentage and opponent hitting. The Lady Toppers finished the regular season ranked 7th in the nation with a .294 team-hitting percentage and 10th in the country with a .147 opponent hitting clip.



WKU has been included in the AVCA Coaches Poll for 8 weeks this season, peaking at No. 20 on Aug. 31. The Lady Toppers come into this weekend with a No. 21 national ranking. WKU is among the leaders in the nation with 28 victories on the year, 19 coming in straight-sets. The Lady Toppers most notable victory came at then-fifth-ranked Wisconsin to start the year. The victory over the Badgers marked WKU's most high profile victory in program history.

The Owls then snapped No. 22 WKU's 17-match win streak with a thrilling five-set victory over the Lady Toppers on Oct. 31.



Sophomore setter Madison McDaniel, who transferred from Arizona St., has had a breakout season for the Owls. McDaniel has been named the C-USA Setter of the Week five times and was selected the Sports Imports/American Volleyball Coaches Association Division I National Player of the Week on Nov. 3. McDaniel ranks first among all C-USA setters with 11.09 assists per set and an 11.36 APS during C-USA play.



The Owls have played in 11 five-set matches this season, going 7-4 in such instances. Rice played a school record 15 five-set matches in 2006. Rice, who recorded their second consecutive 20-win season under head coach Genny Volpe, ranks third in the nation in both total team assists and total team kills.

- North Texas has shown that it can compete with any team in C-USA. The Mean Green split the season series with Rice, the tournament's third-seeded team, and went to a closely contested five sets with C-USA frontrunner WKU. North Texas knocked off UTSA in three sets from its home court last week.
- Dillard was named espnW's National Player of the Week on November 11 after breaking the program's all-time kills record (2,291), a number that also continues to lead all active D-I volleyball players. It was her second career national weekly honor.

### coach's corner

“ We have an incredibly difficult road ahead of us starting with WKU. But we are obviously feeling pretty good after the comeback at Middle Tennessee. We know that we were struggling for the last few weeks of the season, but there seems to be a new calm over the team and we just can't wait to get on the court and get after it and see what happens. Its tournament time, everyone just has to play hard because we know how good WKU is and we are going to give them our best shot. ”

### notables

- ➔ Ally Kiecover, who was named to the All-Conference USA first team on Tuesday, has been one of the key contributors for the Marshall offense. The junior from Grand Rapids, Mich. finished the conference schedule with a hitting percentage of .416, good for first in C-USA. Overall, Kiecover had a hitting efficiency of .405, which places her second all-time in a single season in Marshall history. Kiecover was first on the team in blocks with 74, while was second in kills with 320.
- ➔ The junior libero, Allie Kellerman, enters the conference tournament after setting a new single-season record in digs with 538 in the win over Middle Tennessee. This wasn't the first time Kellerman placed herself in the Herd record book this season either, as she had the second and ninth best matches in Marshall history for digs on Sept. 12 against Davidson with 36 and on Oct. 30 at UAB with 32. Through conference play, Kellerman ranked third in digs per set with 4.36.
- ➔ The Herd enters the conference tournament after an improbable comeback at Middle Tennessee. Marshall was down 0-2 in the match, and fell behind in the third set, but rallied behind the Herd's impressive offensive attack from Ally Kiecover and Cassie Weaver to stun the Blue Raiders in five sets and to clinch the final seed in the tournament. Marshall is led by head coach Mitch Jacobs, who earned his 100th Conference USA win in San Antonio earlier this year, as Marshall became the first school to hand the roadrunners its first conference loss on its own home floor.

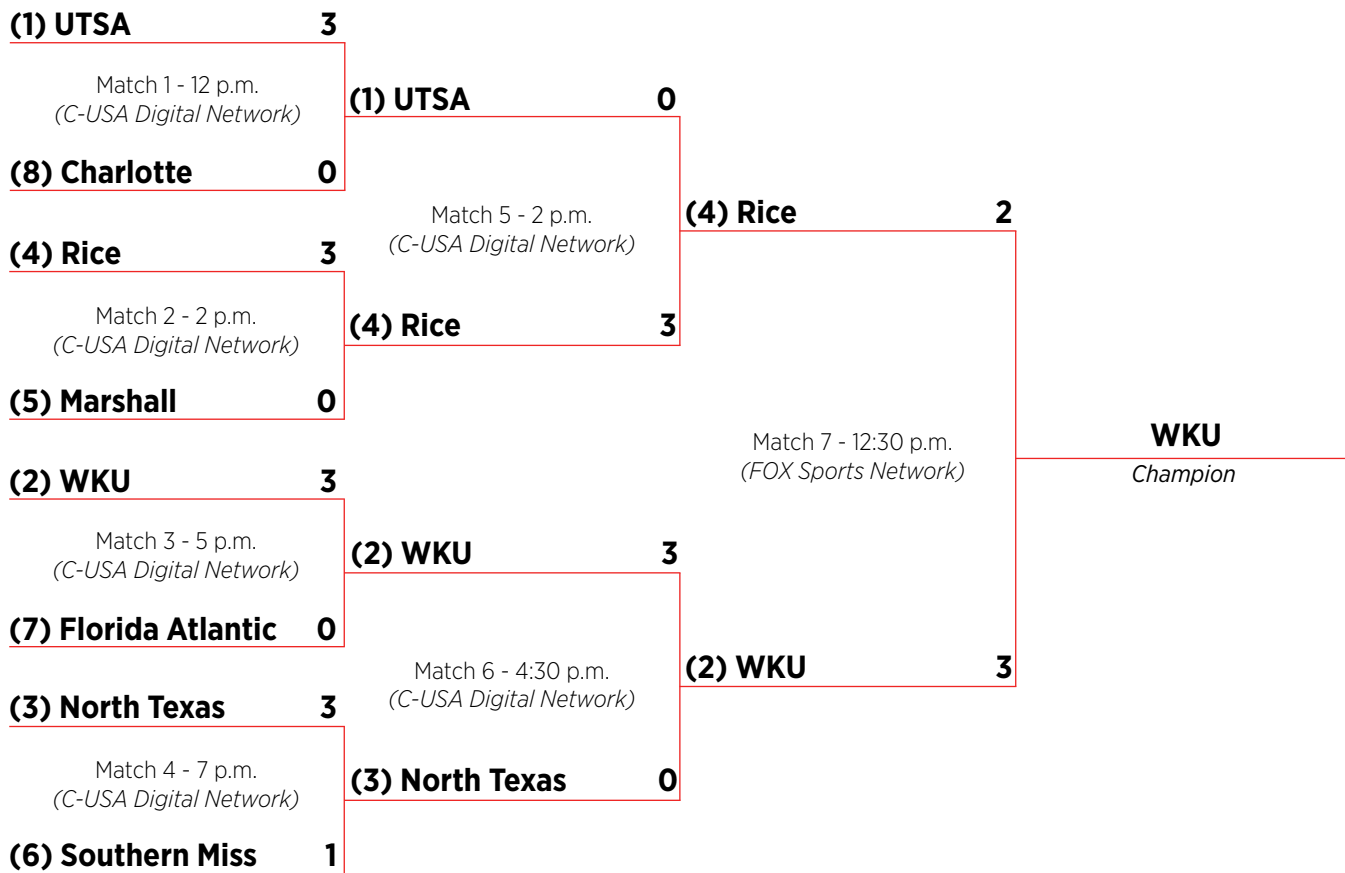
