The incredible run for Conference USA volleyball in 2015 continues on. UTSA became the latest team to join the upset trend on Monday night, knocking off No. 12 Oregon 3-1 (21-25, 25-23, 25-19, 25-23) in front of a crowd of 1,051 fans in the Convocation Center in San Antonio. The Roadrunners' convincing victory pushes the league's record to 5-1 against Top 25 and "receiving votes" opponents this season, with two wins coming against Top 15 teams. Since Rice fell to then-No. 2 Texas on the road on the opening day of the season, C-USA volleyball has ripped off five straight underdog victories. UTSA will also #BeTheNext to have a chance to contiune the #CUSAVB hot streak when the Roadrunners head to Austin, Texas on Friday for its shot at powerhouse, No. 4 Texas.

Top of the Standings

North Texas joined FIU at the top of the Conference USA volleyball standings at 1-0, after defeating UAB in straight sets (25-21, 25-20, 25-18) Monday night at the North Texas Volleyball Center in Denton, Texas. Senior Carnae Dillard had a match-high 19 kills to go along with a season-best .375 hitting percentage. The team's offensive prowess and ability to target its attacks is what ultimately resulted in the convincing win, as the Mean Green had a team attack mark of .391 on the day. With her very first assist of the day, junior Amy Henard became the fifth member of North Texas' 2,500-assist club. In **Andrew Palileo**'s third season at the helm, North Texas has amassed an impressive 24-5 (.828) record in home matches.

Eagles Stay Golden

Southern Miss swept the Bama Bash tournament field this weekend en route to its second championship this season and an 8-0 start for the first time in program history. The last standing undefeated in Conference USA capped off an impressive weekend with a five-set win over SEC preseason-No. 2 Alabama on the road in Tuscaloosa, Ala. and a convincing 3-1 victory over former C-USA foe Tulsa. Stephany Purdue led the way with 38 kills on 110 total attacks on Saturday, with freshman **Sarah Bell** continuing to produce early for Southern Miss, tallying 83 assists across the two matches.

#CUSAVB Continues to Make Waves

Florida Atlantic's dominating sweep of (RV) Lipscomb broadcast on ESPN3 on Saturday became the latest addition to the list of noteworthy wins on the Conference USA slate so far in 2015. The Owls' victory on the road in Nashville, Tenn. on Saturday pushes the league's record to 4-1 against Top 25 and "receiving votes" opponents this season.

Battle of the Books

Rice traveled up north to Ivy League territory in New Haven, Conn. this weekend to play in the 2015 Yale Invitational. After opening up with a tough 3-1 loss to UC-Santa Barbara on Friday, the Owls bounced back to two victories on Saturday over Rhode Island (3-1) and a five-set comeback against host Yale. Chelsey Harris was

named the MVP of the Yale Invitational.

David Beats Goliath (Again)

Conference USA volleyball is starting to get used to the national spotlight in 2015. North Texas' upset of (RV) Oklahoma on the road in Norman Friday night provided the league's third victory over a Top 25/Receiving Votes opponent already in the early season. The Mean Green relied heavily on senior leader and 2015 Conference USA preseason player of the year Carnae Dillard to lead the way in the five-set thriller (15-25, 25-22, 25-23, 21-25, 15-13). Her 22-kill, 14-dig performance provided the cushion needed to squeeze past the Sooners on the road, giving North Texas wins over Big 12 opponents in back-to-back seasons. Florida Atlantic can join the trend on Saturday when it takes on (RV) Lipscomb at 2:30 p.m. in Nashville, Tenn.

WKU Knocks Off No. 5 Wisconsin

The highlight of the 2015 season's opening night came from one of the league's two Top 25-matchups, as recieving-votes WKU knocked off No. 5 Wisconsin, 3-1 (13-25, 25-23, 25-19, 25-19), on the road in Madison, Wisc. WKU's triumph over the Badgers marks the third consecutive season that the Lady Tops have knocked off a ranked Big Ten foe as WKU defeated then eighthranked Purdue, 3-2, last season in E.A. Diddle Arena after knocking off the #16 Boilermakers, 3-2, in West Lafayette in 2013.

AROUND THE LEAGUE

Rice Mounts Comeback, Downs (RV) LSU Conference USA volleyball fans didn't have to wait long this season for the first conference clash. A schedule irregularity in 2015 had UAB opening conference play on Friday, vs. FIU in Birmingham, Ala., nearly a month before the C-USA slate typically begins. The match served as the opening match of the Blazer Classic tournament lineup, meaning that. for the first time since 2012, two Conference USA schools met in a midseason tournament matchup. It took five sets to determine who would sit atop the Conference USA standings after the night, but FIU snuck past UAB to pick up a 3-2 road victory (25-22, 20-25, 23-25, 25-14, 15-8). Double-digit kills from Jennifer Ene and Lucia Castro led the way for the Panthers, with a double-double from setter Katie Friesen keeping

Rice Mounts Comeback, Downs (RV) LSU

The Owls bounced back from a defeat at the hands of No. 3 Texas on Friday afternoon to knock off (RV) LSU on Saturday morning, 3-2 (24-26, 21-25, 25-17, 25-16, 15-10). Rice trailed 0-2 in the match before turning on the jets to mount a furious comeback against the Tigers, dominating the final three sets of play to pull off the league's second major upset in

pace as well.

For the first time since the last two weeks of 2014, Conference USA has a member school in the AVCA Top 25 poll. After receiving votes in the 2015 preseason poll, WKU went a perfect 3-0 on opening weekend, including a 3-1 upset of then-No. 5 Wisconsin on the road. As a reward, the Lady Hilltoppers launched up into the 20th spot of the weel two ranking with 341 total points, just eight points behind No. 19 Michigan State. In 2010, Tulsa entered the polls with a No. 25 ranking on Nov. 1 before rising to the 20th spot in the final poll of the season.

#CUSAVB Makes Opening Statement

Conference USA volleyball sprinted out of the gates on opening weekend of the 2015 season, with five teams going undefeated (WKU, Florida Atlantic, UTSA, Marshall and Southern Miss) and four others going 2-1 (Charlotte, Middle Tennessee, FIU and UAB), No teams came out of the weekend without at least one victory. As a whole, the league went 29-13 (.690) to open the season, claiming six tournament titles on the way and knocking off two nationally-recognized programs. The hot start in 2015 contrasts widely from the 2014 start that saw the league go 21-20 (.512) with only one team left undefeated at the end of the weekend (Southern Miss).

CUSAVB Gains Social Media Presence

Due to the gaining popularity of the sport and the continued success of the league's 13 volleyball members, Conference USA has launched a Twitter account solely dedicated to #CUSAVB. By following @CUSAVB, Conference USA volleyball fans, coaches, and players alike will have the ability to receive up-to-the-minute updates of the league's happenings.

WKU Looks To Defend Title

Following a share of the C-USA regular season crown and a C-USA tournament title during its inaugural season in the league, WKU made its eighth appearance in the NCAA tournament, facing Iowa State in 2014. The Lady Toppers only lost one league match en route to their titles, and the squad has been tabbed to repeat in the C-USA Volleyball Preseason Poll, where it collected 163 points in votes as selected by the league's 13 head coaches.



WKU notched an overall record of 30-6 with a 15-1 mark in league action in 2014. The Lady Toppers landed a conferencebest three players on the preseason squad in sophomores ALYSSA CAVANAUGH and JESSICA LUCAS and junior NO-ELLE LANGENKAMP.

UTSA was chosen to finish second in the upcoming season after earning a share of the regular-season crown last year. The Roadrunners are represented on the preseason team by the junior duo of outside hitter DAJANA BOSKOVIC and 2014 C-USA Setter of the Year JESSICA WALDRIP.

The C-USA Player of the Year from a year ago, CARNAE DILLARD of North Texas, was picked as the 2015 Preseason Player of the Year. For the second straight C-USA preseason poll, the Mean Green were picked to finish fourth.

Team Outlooks Going Into 2015

Charlotte

- ★ Karen Weatherington begins her first season as the new head
- → Charlotte looks to play in the Conference tournament in back-toback seasons for the first time since 2009/2010.
- → Senior Britney Leigh Held returns for her senior season sitting seventh all-time on Charlotte's career assists list.
- → Redshirt Junior Michelle Hovey returns after missing 2014 due to injury. Hovey adds to the defensive depth of Shelby Green and Morgan Barker on the back row.
- → Charlotte (as a team) led C-USA in assists, digs, kills, aces and attacks in 2014. Shelby Green led the league in aces/set and total aces.

- → Head Coach Rita Buck-Crockett was named the 2015 AVCA Sand Volleyball Coach of the Year
- → FIU returns its All-Freshman Team middle blocker Jennifer Ene.
- → Senior outside hitter Lucia Castro enters this season ranked ninth in FIU history in total kills (919).
- → The Panthers play 15 of its 27 matches at home this season, including two tournaments in the first four weeks of the season and eight C-USA matches.

Florida Atlantic

- → Owls will be looking to advance to the Conference USA tournament for the third year in a row.
- → Last year's 18 wins were FAU's most in a season since 2005.
- → The Owls will be an experienced bunch, returning six players who played in at least 28 matches last season.
- → Seniors Katarina Stepanovic (1st Team) and Brittney Brown (2nd Team) were named all-conference last season.
- → FAU will stay close to home this season, playing 18 of their 28 regular season matches in the state of Florida.

LA Tech

- → LA Tech returns eight letterwinners from last season, all of which played in at least 24 of the 30 matches from the 2014 season. Five of the returners started in at least half of the matches they played in last season.
- → Head coach Adriano de Souza enters his fourth year at the helm of the Lady Techster program, having led the Lady Techsters to an improvement in the win column each season.
- → The seven upperclassmen (2 seniors, 5 juniors) on this year's roster make the 2015 Lady Techsters the most experienced squad since the 2010 season
- → LA Tech returns three players from last season's team (Angela Papach, Helena Gunnarsdóttir, Adria Morales) that recorded at least 100 kills over the course of the 2014 season.
- → For the third straight season, Louisiana Tech is set to host the Lady Techster Invitational with ULM, Southern and Lamar set to visit Ruston for the two-day tournament in September. Since 2009, LA Tech has a 10-7 record in its home tournaments.

Marshall

- → The Thundering Herd returns three players (Jillian Shemanski, Ally Kiekover, Allie Kellerman) that were named Conference USA Players of the Week in 2014. The Herd returns six overall letter-winners for 2015.
- → Matt Jackson has been promoted from Graduate Assistant to Assistant Coach.
- → In Conference USA play, the Herd finished second in service aces, with 81 in 66 sets (1.23 per set).

AROUND THE LEAGUE

→ Senior Jillian Shemanski is second in Conference USA among returning players for blocks. She totaled 106 through 100 sets, for an average of 1.06 per set.

Middle Tennessee

- ightharpoonup The Blue Raiders finished 9-21 overall with a record of 5-11 in Conference USA in 2014.
- → MT returns nine players from last season's team along with six freshmen. It's the second straight season coach Peck has had at least six newcomers. Middle Tennessee returns 59.1 percent of its offensive output while returning just over 50 percent of blocking production. Senior Rachel Shaughnessy is the leading returning blocker with 39 blocks (8 BS, 62 BA).
- → Returning first team All-Conference USA member Chelsea Ross is in her final season for MT. She led the team in kills (490), kills per set (4.22), service aces (28) and points (548.5), and is fourth all-time in program history with 1380 kills.

North Texas

- → Reigning Conference USA Player of the Year Carnae Dillard enters her senior season with the chance to win four consecutive first team all-conference selections. Dillard would become only the second North Texas player to complete the feat, but she would be the first to do so while defending a conference MVP award.
- → The Mean Green have been tough to beat within the familiar confines of the North Texas Volleyball Center. North Texas has racked up a 37-9 home record over the last three seasons.
- → With 2,252 assists in her first two seasons, junior Amy Henard sits in fifth on the Mean Green's all-time assists list. If she continues her current pace, Henard would take sole possession of fourth place by the end of 2015.
- → After losing six from last year's squad, North Texas may have one of the youngest rosters in C-USA as Carnae Dillard and Amy Henard will be the team's only upperclassmen.

Rice

- → Last season the Owls won 23 games, the fifth-most in school history and the first 20-win season since 2009.
- → Rice advanced to the 2014 C-USA Championship match for the second time in school history.
- \rightarrow Ranked sixth in the nation (1st in C-USA) in kills per set (14.45) and seventh in the nation (1st in C-USA) in assists per set (13.57).
- → For a second straight summer, junior right side hitter Chelsey Harris took part in the U.S. Collegiate National Team (CNT) program. A C-USA Second-Team All-Conference selection in 2014, Harris and 35 other collegiate athletes across the country trained and competed in New Orleans from June 21-29.

Southern Miss

- → Southern Miss returns 11 letterwinners from last year's team including four starters that finished with a 20-14 record overall.
- → The Golden Eagles return 77 percent of their offensive attack including 75 percent of the scoring, 65 percent of their digs and 45 percent in blocking. Stephany Purdue is the top returner after leading the team in kills (407/3.34 k/s) and service aces. Quinci Hayward was second on the team in kills with 368.
- → The Golden Eagles also returns first team All-C-USA performer and Libero of the Year Mary Pursell. Pursell led the team in digs while ranking first against league teams in digs with a 4.95 per set average.
- → Head Coach Amanda Berkley begins her third season as head coach after serving as interim coach in 2013.

UAB

- → Head coach Kerry Messersmith enters her 10th season at the helm of the UAB volleyball team.
- → UAB, with eight total newcomers (five freshmen), will return four starters, including the libero from last season's team. Gabby Deshotel returns as the leading hitting from 2014 with 2.82 kills per set.
- → UAB will host 17 of its 32 matches, including two home tournaments in 2015.

UTEP

- → UTEP will begin the 2015 season with five student-athletes on the roster who were raised and trained outside of the United States. Canada is the most represented country with four players and Belgium follows with one. The success of outside hitter Coline Coessens (Belgium) and setter Lindsey Larson (Canada) has shown that seeking international talent could be a promising decision in terms of recruitment.
- → In the 2014 season, UTEP demonstrated it could dominate its digging skills. Together the Miners finished at 1,610, averaging 15.19 digs per set.
- → UTEP's 2015 roster returns four starters and eight letter winners while adding six freshmen and a transfer. With a squad of 16, the Miners have six outside hitters, four defensive specialists, three middle blockers and three setters.

UTSA

- → UTSA captured its second straight Conference USA regular season title in 2014 and will return five starters plus libero from one year ago, including All-American and C-USA Setter of the Year Jessica Waldrip.
- → Laura Neugebauer-Groff heads into the 2015 season with five consecutive 20-plus win seasons and has finished no lower than second in the league standings in the past five years (Conference USA, WAC and Southland).
- → Neugebauer-Groff is 11 wins away from her 500th career win as she's compiled a 489-241 record over 21 seasons.
- → On the slate for 2015 will be a pair of teams that finished in the top-25 in the nation. UTSA will welcome No. 14 Oregon for the home opener (Sept. 7) and will face No. 5 Texas in Austin. The Roadrunners will also welcome power house Santa Clara on Sept. 10.

wĸu

- → In its first year with Conference USA, WKU picked up right where it left off in the Sun Belt Conference, grabbing a share of the C-USA regular-season title with a 15-1 record before notching a sweep of the tournament field on its way to the program's eighth NCAA Tournament appearance. In the team's history, WKU has now recorded 12 conference championships and six league tournament championships.
- → The Lady Toppers put together the program's 15th-straight 20-win season in 2014, as they finished 30-6 on the year. WKU recorded its seventh 30-win season in program history. WKU was one of 10 squads in 2014 to have 30 victories. With three of the last four seasons having 30 or more wins, WKU joins Penn State as the only schools in the nation to accomplish that feat while WKU and Florida are the only schools to record 27 or more wins in the last five years.
- → WKU's 2015 schedule features 11 opponents in last year's top 100 RPI along with 13 who posted 20+ wins. The challenges will come in plenty for the Lady Toppers with four opponents claiming a spot in the NCAA Tournament last season.






