- Marshall hasn't won since their 3-1 win over MT on Oct. 21. They're on a 4-match losing streak.
- Ally Kiekoever is 2nd in C-USA with a .394 hitting percentage.
- Allie Kellerman is 2nd in C-USA with 4.71 digs per set.
- Kayla Simmons is 6th in C-USA with 9.33 assists per set.
- Cassie Weaver is 9th in C-USA with 3.38 kills per set.

The Final Push

Middle Tennessee is in a great position to make their second C-USA Tournament since joining the league for 2013. The last time the Blue Raiders made it, they hosted in 2013. They missed last year's tournament, mainly due to injuries to key contributors, and are hungry for another chance at their first conference title since they won the Sun Belt in 2010. But they still have some work to do. With two games to go, they are tied with Marshall for the eighth and final spot. Knowing they finish the season with Marshall on Senior Day Saturday, all the Raiders need to do is match the Herd's result Thursday night setting up a one-game "play-in" to end the regular season. Marshall takes on a tough WKU team Thursday in Bowling Green, Ky., as the Raiders travel to Denton, Texas to take on an equally tough North Texas squad.

North Texas Mean Green

North Texas comes into Thursday's match having won three of their last four with their win at FIU Sunday clinching them a spot in the C-USA Tournament. Carnae Dillard may be the best player on the planet. She appears to be headed for C-USA Player of the Year, if not National Player of the Year. Dillard leads the country in five offensive categories. She's the nation's best in attacks per set with 14.23, kills per set with 5.49, total points with 670.5, total attacks with 1608, and total kills with 620. She's also second in the country in points per set with 5.93, one place behind Samantha Bricio of USC who has 6.32. She has also been so dominant that she leads the total attacks category by 240 over fellow C-USA member Gabby Deshotel of UAB. Dillard also leads in total kills by nearly 100 over Laura Milos of ORU. Middle Tennessee's block, which was suspect at times and dominant at others in their last match against Charlotte, will have to be superb all night against Dillard and the Mean Green. Not one player does a whole team make, and that's the case with North Texas. Amanda Chamberlain ranks 9th in C-USA in hitting percentage with .316 while Amy Heneard's 9.25 assists per set put her 7th in the league. Middle Tennessee does hold the all-time lead over North Texas 10-8, but they are closing quickly. The Raiders haven't defeated the Mean Green since 2011 and have managed to win only four sets in the past four meetings.

Marshall Thundering Herd

Marshall will come to Murfreesboro for the final regular season match and the second match against the Blue Raiders this year. Marshall took the victory 3-1, but it was one of the tightest matches of the season as each team score 20 points in all four sets. After dropping the first set 25-20, MT evened the match with a 25-21 set two win. Marshall was able to come back, however, and take the final two frames 25-23, and 25-22 respectively. Chelsea Ross led MT with 22 kills as Miri Shade added 13 more. Cassie Weaver led Marshall with 22 kills as teammates Ally Kiekoover and Taylor Pelton also reached double-figures in kills. Kiekoover had 18 and a .484 hitting percentage while Pelton chipped in 12 kills. Delaney Taylor led all scorers with 43 assists, but that was just one more than Kayla Simmons's 42 for the Herd. Jacqueline Lux's 23 digs were the most by one player, but just a handful more Weaver's 19 for Marshall. The match also saw 32 ties and nine lead changes.

The match Saturday will also most likely be for the final place in the conference tournament. If team's match each other's result on Thursday and Charlotte loses to Florida Atlantic, it will set up an epic "play-in" match for the eighth place in C-USA. Marshall comes into the weekend with four different people in the top 10 in four conference categories. Ally Kiekoover and Cassie Weaver have been holding down the front row nicely, as Kiekoover is 2nd in C-USA with a .394 hitting percentage and Weaver is 9th in C-USA with 3.38 kills per set. They have good stats in large part because setter Kayla Simmons has 9.33

assists per set, which is good enough for 6th in C-USA. The back row has been led by Allie Kellerman's 4.71 digs per set.

Last time out

The Raiders dropped a tough five-set match last week at home against Charlotte. MT took the first frame with an impressive 5-0 run to close it out for a 25-22 victory. The 49ers evened the match with a dominant second set as they won 25-14 before taking a 2-1 match lead with a 25-20 third set win. As well as Charlotte dominated set two, the Raiders dominated the fourth frame. They outblocked the 49ers 10-2 and used a 15-4 run to take control of the set. MT won easily 25-18 to force the fifth and deciding frame. The last set didn't go as planned for MT as Charlotte won 15-12 and took the match 3-2. Chelsea Ross led all scorers with 19 kills as Miri Shade chipped in 14. Rachel Shaughnessy was nearly perfect as she had eight kills on nine attempts for a .778 hitting percentage. The back row play was a little off from normal, but Ross led the team with 13 digs.

Superlative Status

After a year-long drought, the Raiders have earned three C-USA individual superlative awards this season. Chelsea Ross earned C-USA Co-Offensive Player of the Week and Delaney Taylor joined her as C-USA Setter of the week for the week of October 5th. During the week Ross earned 46 kills between the two matches, including a season high 30 in a 5-set win over Rice. Taylor chipped in with 96 assists for the weekend including a career high 62 in the win over Rice. Jacqueline Lux took home C-USA Defensive Player of the Week for the week of October 26. Lux earned 6.33 digs per set during MT's two matches of the week, two 3-0 victories to help the Raiders keep pace in the C-USA standings. Lux earned 17 digs at LA Tech Friday, then Sunday she picked up 21 more at UAB, just four away from her season high.

Can you dig it?

Sophomore Libero Jacqueline Lux has been steady on the back row this season, currently sixth in C-USA with 4.20 digs per set. She leads the team in that category and her 370 total digs are by far the most on the team. For her efforts during the week of October 26, Lux earned C-USA Defensive Player of the Week. She earned a 6.33 digs per set average during the team's two matches, two 3-0 sweeps over LA Tech and UAB. Her 21 digs against the Blazers were just four away from surpassing her season high of 25, reached twice this season, the last time at Utah State in September.

Front Row Attack

Middle Tennessee's front row continues to improve. Rachel Shaughnessy is currently fourth in C-USA in hitting percentage at .370. Freshman LaVondria Covington has also performed well, earning a spot on the Hokie Invitational All-Tournament Team and is currently eighth in the conference with 1.01 block per set.

The Help

Setter Delaney Taylor leads the team in assists with 727 and her 7.65 assists per set rank her 10th in C-USA. She had her career high 62 assists in the Raiders' five set victory over Rice at Tudor Fieldhouse in Houston October 11. For her efforts at Rice, Taylor won C-USA Setter of the Week for the week of October 5th. Then, she nearly matched her career high with 51 more assists against FIU in another five set win for MT on October 25. She also earned a career high four kills in the match as this freshman is clearly finding her way in the Blue Raider offense.

Ross leads the way (National edition)

Chelsea Ross is in the top 15 nationally in six categories. She's 12th in total attacks with 1248, 11th with 520.0 total points, 9th in points per set with 5.20, 8th with 12.48 attacks per set, 7th in kills per set with 4.77, and 7th with 477 total kills. C-USA is showing its strength as Ross

is joined by Carnae Dillard of North Texas, Southern Miss's Stephany Purdue, and Gabby Deshotel of UAB in the top 10 of three of those categories.

Ross leads the way

Chelsea Ross leads the team in kills with 477. Her next closest competitor is Miri Shade who has 292. Ross also leads in kills per set with 4.77. Her 4.77 kills per set is currently second in C-USA behind pre-season Player of the Year Carnae Dillard's 5.49. In addition, Ross is second in the conference to Dillard in points per set this season with 5.20.

Ross in the Record Books

Mufreesboro native, Chelsea Ross, now has 1,857 career kills, good enough for second all-time in Blue Raider history as she passed Izabela Kozon with her fifth kill against WKU on October 4. Ross is now 171 kills behind KeKe Deckard who is the all-time leader in program history with 2,028 career kills. To pass Deckard, Ross and MT will need to make the Conference Championship game so that she can average 34.2 kills per match.

Close but no cigar

MT has scored 20 points in 67 of 97 (69%) sets this season, but have only won 35 (36%) of them. MT has also led at some point in 73 of their 97 (75%) sets this season.

Time Zone Adjustment

The Blue Raiders, who reside in the Central Time Zone, have played in three of the country's four mainland time zones this season. The first was a trip to the Mountain Time Zone when the Raiders traveled to Logan, Utah to participate in the Gossner Invitational at Utah State Sept. 4-5. MT made their second trip to MST on Sept. 27 to play UTEP. The team also hit up the Eastern Time Zone twice this season. They traveled to Blackburg, Va. to compete in the Hokie Invitational on the campus of Virginia Tech Sept. 18-19 and on October 21 they went back to EST to take on the Marshall Thundering Herd.

2014 Recap

The Blue Raiders went 9-21 overall with a 5-11 mark in Conference USA action. MT suffered through injuries to key players throughout the season.

Youth Movement

For the second-straight season, the Blue Raiders will have to deal with a youth movement as eight freshmen will make up more than half of the roster in 2015. The MT consists of two seniors, two juniors and two sophomores.

"Athleticism" is the Word

When describing the group of seven freshmen this season head coach Matt Peck has raved about the newcomers all spring, calling it "the most athletic group of newcomers we have ever had," along with "explosive and volleyball savvy".

Who Returns?

The Blue Raiders had just two player play over 100 sets last season in Ross and Lux. 2014 First Team All-C-USA selection Ross led the team in kills (490), kills per set (4.22) and point (548.5), while Lux led the squad at the libero spot with 425 digs. Senior Rachel Shaughnessy returns as the leading blocker with 70 swats, and sophomore Brianna Pannone is the returning leader in assists with 217.

Sophomores Improving in Year Two

Both second-year players in Lux and Pannone will look to improve on their freshmen campaign. Lux was one of two players that played in all 116 sets while leading the way defensively in digs. The Shelbyville,

Ind., native was the only freshman in C-USA in the top 10 in digs. Pannone, who's season was cut short due to an injury, led the team in assists through the first 13 contests, including a 30-assist match against Seton Hall.
