#5 THINGS

1. UTEP ranks first nationally with 18.81 digs per set and 1,072 team digs, according to the NCAA stats released Sept. 20.
2. Junior setter Lindsey Larson has been the trend-setter for the Miners this year. In 11 of the 15 matches, she has recorded a double-double.
3. UTEP picked up its first sweep of the 2015 season at the Bradley Invitational. The Miners claimed a 3-0 victory over the tournament host, Bradley (9/19).
4. The Miners lead the nation with 18.81 digs per set. If the Miners continue this trend it would be the most since 1991 (19.33).
5. The Miners have had two matches where they recorded 100 or more digs.

The UTEP volleyball team returns to Memorial Gym to take on North Texas on Friday at 6 p.m. and Middle Tennessee State on Sunday at 12:30 p.m. in its first conference match at home. The Miners head into this weekend's action after playing their last four matches on the road.

UTEP closed out non-conference play with a 6-8 record. The Miners finished second at the Bradley Invitational as they defeated Southeast Missouri St 3-2 (9/18) and Bradley 3-0 (9/19). The victory over Bradley earned the Miners their first sweep of the 2015 season.

Lindsey Larson continues to lead the defense while Coline Coessens paces the offense. Larson has registered 11 double-doubles this season while Coessens has accumulated eight.

NORTH TEXAS SCOUTING REPORT

SERIES: This Friday will be the 14th match between UTEP and North Texas. Last year UTEP fell short to the Mean Green in both matches they played. In their meeting last year, (9/26/14) Coline Cossens and Lindsey Larson both registered double-double performances with a combined 53 assists, 29 digs, and 17 kills. In their second meeting last year (11/15/14), Larson recorded a match high of 21 assists while Sarah Villa had a match high of 16 digs. North Texas is 9-7 during the 2015 campaign, and the Miners will take on the Mean Green at 6:00 p.m. MT.

MEAN GREEN NOTABLES

The Mean Green is led by senior outside hitter Carnae Dillard with 320 kills (5.16 per set) while Holly Millam (120 kills), Amanda Chamberlain (110 kills), and Alexis Wright (101 kills) are the next three leading attackers. Amy Henard boasts the most assists with a total of 565 (9.74 per set). Carnae (167 digs/ 2.69 per set) and Henard (125 digs/ 2.16 per set) are also defensive leaders while Chamberlain tops the team with 49 blocks.

MIDDLE TENNESSEE STATE SCOUTING REPORT

SERIES: UTEP will take on the Blue Raiders this Sunday at 12:30 p.m. MT. This will be the fourth meeting between the two universities. In the past three meetings between UTEP and Middle Tennessee State resulted in victories for the Miners. In last year's meeting (10/12/14), UTEP won 3-1 where Sarah Villa recorded 19 digs as part of a team total of 49 digs. Coline Cossens and Dalainee Perry totaled nine kills each, and Lindsey Larson aided the Miners' offense with 35 assists, while the Miners combined a team effort of 11 blocks. Middle Tennessee State is 3-12 on the 2015 campaign.

BLUE RAIDERS NOTABLES

The Blue Raiders' leading attackers are Chelsea Ross with 243 kills (4.76 per set), and Miri Shade with 126 kills (2.47 per set). Delaney Taylor (264 assists/ 5.74 per set) and Brianna Pannone (262 assists/ 5.95 per set) aid the Blue Raiders in offense as the teams' leaders in assists. On the defensive side, Jacqueline Lux (222 digs/ 4.35 per set) and Shade (106 digs/ 2.08 per set) lead the team with the most digs, while senior Rachel Saughnessey has a total of 46 blocks.

MINERS IN THE NATIONAL STATS

UTEP ranks first nationally with 18.81 digs per set and 1,072 team digs, according to the NCAA stats released Sept. 20. The Miners are also third in team attacks per set (39.04). Individually, Lindsey Larson is 34th nationally with 519 total assists. Coline Coessens is 19th with 571 total attacks while Maddie Morgan is 31st with 59 total blocks.

TOUGH BLOCKERS

UTEP's presence at the net has been felt the first month of the season. The Miners rattled off 27.5 total blocks at the TCU Tournament, 35 at the Bruin Invitational, 33 when co-hosting the Borderland Invitational and 30 at the Bradley Invitational. They have accumulated 143.5 total blocks which equate to a 2.35 blocks per set average, which is the sixth best in Conference USA. This is the highest average it has achieved since 2012 when UTEP averaged 2.36 blocks per set. Team leaders Xitlali Herrera and Jean Horton became AVCA Division I All-American Team honorable mentions that season.

MINERS RANKED IN CONFERENCE

Freshman Kylie Baumgartner and Maddie Morgan rank fourth and seventh in Conference USA, respectively, in blocks per set with 1.18 and 1.07. Junior setter Lindsey Larson is seventh in the league with 9.05 assists per set. Defensive specialist Ashley Peak is ranked 10th with 3.91 digs per set. As a whole, the Miners lead the league with 18.81 digs per set and are sixth with 2.30 blocks per set.

DIGGING DEEP

The Miners have had two matches where they recorded 100 or more digs. At the Belmont Bruin Invitational, UTEP notched 104 digs in the five-set victory against South Alabama (9/5). The squad was led by senior defensive specialist Ashley Peak, who tallied 31 digs while four more Miners (Coline Coessens, Naomi Whitehair, Lindsey Larsson, Dalainee Perry) registered 10 or more digs. When co-hosting the Borderland Invitational, UTEP posted 123 digs with Peak leading the pack once again with 35 while Larson added 27.

UTEP SWEEP

UTEP picked up its first sweep of the 2015 season at the Bradley Invitational. The Miners claimed a 3-0 victory over the tournament host, Bradley (9/19). The last time the Orange and Blue notched a 3-0 win was against Nevada (9/19/14) at the Denver Invitational.

COESSENS CRUSHING IT

A member of the 2014 Conference USA All-Freshman Team, Coline Coessens has been doing it all for the Orange and Blue in 2015. The sophomore leads the team with 196 kills, ranks third in assists (27) and digs (178) and fourth in blocks (36). Coessens has registered eight double-doubles in 2015.

DIGS LEADING THE NATION

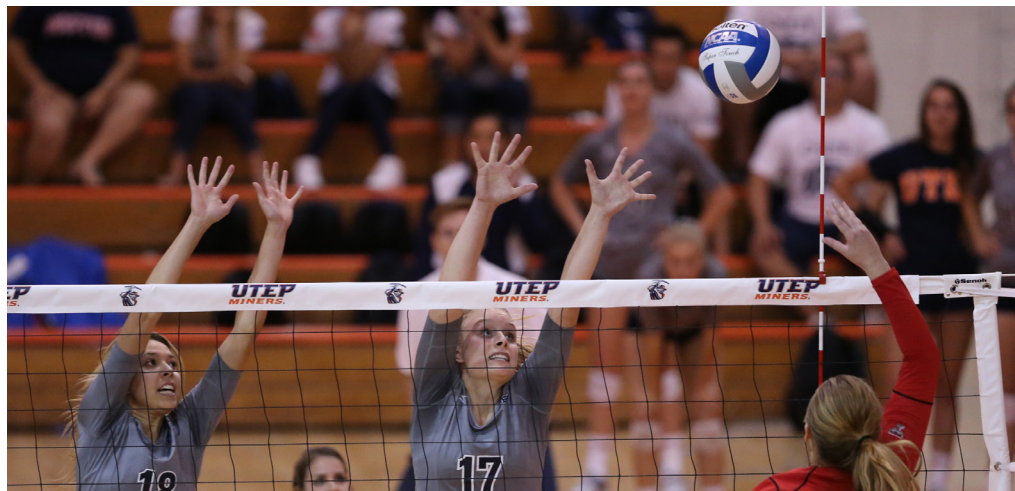
The Miners lead the nation with 18.81 digs per set. If the Miners continue this trend it would be the most since 1991 (19.33). This is the most digs UTEP has averaged since head coach Holly Watts was hired. Under Watts's helm, in 2013 UTEP averaged 14.6, and in 2014 it averaged 15.2.

LARSON DOUBLES UP

Junior setter Lindsey Larson has been the trendsetter for the Miners this year. In 11 of the 15 matches, she has recorded a double-double. In 2013, Xitlali Herrera led the squad's defense and offense with 13 double-doubles, where she was named to the AVCA Division I All-American team. Based on Larson's performance so far this year, she shows that she is on the pace to meet or surpass the amount of double-doubles registered by Herrera. Larson was named to the Bruin Invitational All-Tournament team, TCU Tournament All-Tournament team and Bradley Invitational All-Tournament team. The Miners co-hosted the Borderland Invitational where Larson tallied a career-best 62 assists accompanied by 27 digs to help the Miners beat Brown University (9/11).

ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM SELECTIONS

UTEP rounded up the Bradley Invitational this past weekend in Peoria, Ill. Lindsey Larson and Coline Coessens were named to the All-Tournament team as they led the Miners to a 2-1 finish. Larson notched 112 assists, 44 digs, 19 kills and nine blocks while Coessens hammered 48 kills, 37 digs and seven blocks. Larson has also been named to the TCU Invitational All-Tournament team as well as the Belmont Bruin Invitational All-Tournament team.

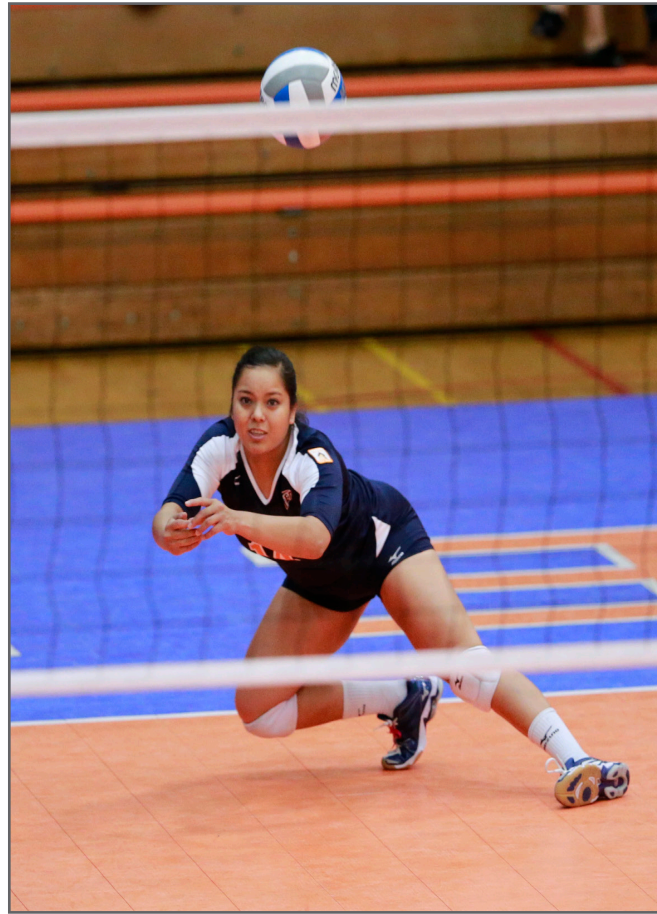
