Degree Requirements and Information

- **Minimum Grades:** Must earn grades of C or above in all required courses.
- Total Hours: Minimum of 120 total hours, at least 30 hours earned in residence at UNT. Completion of minimum hours required for the degree does not guarantee completion of all degree requirements.
- University Core GPA: Minimum 2.750 GPA required in completed Core, for all graded courses.
- Academic Major GPA: Minimum 2.750 GPA required in completed Academic Major.
- Professional Development School (PDS) GPA: Minimum 2.750 GPA required in completed PDS, for all graded courses.
- Prerequisites: All prerequisites must be satisfied before beginning a course. Students must verify completion of prerequisites which
 appear in course descriptions found in the UNT Catalog (catalog.unt.edu) and class details when viewing courses in my.unt.edu.
