THE PARTICULARS

North Texas Football kicks off the 2009 campaign in Muncie, Ind. this Thursday against the Ball State Cardinals. The game will be nationally televised on ESPNU and can also be heard on the Mean Green Radio Network. Kickoff is set for 6:35 p.m. CT

THE PRINCIPALS

Third-year coach Todd Dodge is looking to get North Texas back on solid ground after a 3-21 record in his first two seasons. The Mean Green won four straight Sun Belt Conference championships from 2001-04, before beginning a slide that has produced just eight wins in the last four years. The Ball State Cardinals had what could be deemed as their best season ever starting out 12-0 before falling in their last two games of the year.

THE SERIES

North Texas and Ball State have never met before. However, North Texas holds a 1-3 all-time record against teams from the Mid-American Conference.

NEXT GAME

The Mean Green will return home to face another Mid-American Conference team in the Ohio Bobcats for the home opener at Fouts Field Saturday Sept. 10. Kickoff is set for 6 p.m. Ball State will stay at home and welcome New Hampshire.

A CLOSER LOOK AT BALL STATE

Head Coach Stan Parrish – Parrish will enter his first full season at the helm of the Ball State Cardinals. He has been the Offensive Coordinator since 2006, and took over as head coach before the GMAC Bowl last season. Parrish comes into the 2009 season with a 57-42-3 record as a coach, which includes the bowl loss last season. Kansas State was Parrish's previous coaching stop, where he went 2-21-1 in three seasons.

The Matchup – North Texas and Ball State ended on opposite sides of the spectrum last season. Ball State had what is widely considered their best season ever, and North Texas had one of its worst. Ball State held its ground at home in 2008 going 6-0, while North Texas rolls into Muncie with only two road wins since the 2006 season. Both teams come into the 2009 season with questionmarks on the offensive side of the ball. The Cardinals lost not only All-American quarterback Nate Davis, who accounted for 99 percent of their passing, but also three of their top four receivers, who accounted for 63 percent of the touchdowns received. With redshirt freshman Riley Dodge taking over the offense and the loss of Casey Fitzgerald, the Mean Green have the same problems. Defensively in 2008, although the Cardinals did struggle in their last two games, they finished 69th in the NCAA in total defense, a far cry from North Texas' 119, which was last in the Football Bowl Subdivision.

Media Information Post-Game Interviews

The North Texas locker room is closed to all members of the media. Head coach Todd Dodge and requested players will be available for interviews following a brief cooling off period. Postgame interviews at Fouts Field will be held in the media interview room below the east stands.

Credentials For Media

Those wishing to cover North Texas must contact Eric Capper or Steven Bartolotta for credentials for home and away games. Seating is very limited at Fouts Field and requests for North Texas home games need to be made at least one week prior to the contest.

Media Availability for Players

All player interviews will be conducted following the teams practice on Tuesday afternoon at the Athletic Center. Requests for players should be made in advance through the sports information office. No interviews will be granted on Monday or Wednesday post practice. Special exemptions may be granted to those media wishing to interview a specific student-athlete before practice at the discretion of the media relations office.

Sun Belt Teleconference

The Sun Belt Conference will conduct a weekly teleconference with each of the eight head coaches each Monday throughout the season. Coach Dodge will be on the call from 11:08-11:14 a.m. each week.

Post-Practice

Dodge will be available to media immediately following Tuesday's practice at the Darrell Dickey Practice Facility. Requests should be made in advance of practice to the media relations office.

Out of Town Media

Dodge and his assistant coaches are also available by request to out-of-town media Monday through Wednesday from 11 a.m.-12 noon. Contact the media relations office to arrange these requests.

Practice Coverage

Media has limited access to North Texas football practice. Viewing is available outside the fence of the practice facility. Video and still photography can be shot during the first 30 minutes of practice. Players and coaches are available for interviews following practice on Tuesday. All requests for interviews must be made in advance through the athletic media relations office.

The 94th Season Set To Begin

North Texas will begin its 94th season of football when it takes the field for the 2009 season against Ball State in Muncie, Ind. on September 3. Since the inaugural season in 1913, North Texas has accumulated a record of 465-431-34, amassed 25 conference championships and played in seven bowl games.

Season Openers

North Texas is 36-54-3 all-time in the season debut. The Mean Green has one just one season-opener in the last 12 years, a 14-7 win at Middle Tennessee in 2005. The game with Ball State marks just the third time this decade that North Texas has not opened a season against a team from the Big 12 Conference. The Mean Green hold a 1-1 record season openers not played against a Big 12 team, losing to TCU in 2001 19-5 and beating Middle Tennessee in 2005 14-7. The game at Ball State marks the eight straight year that North Texas will open the season away from home.

A New Home For The Mean Green

North Texas has called Fouts Field home since 1952, but those days are nearing an end. In 2011 the Mean Green will move into a new stadium located on-campus. Construction is set to begin on the stadium in January of 2010 and the stadium will have a capacity of 30,000 with the ability for future expansion to raise the total to 50,000. North Texas partnered with HKS to build the stadium - the same company that designed the American Airlines Center in Dallas and the new Cowboys Stadium in Arlington, Texas.



Don't I Know You From Somewhere

Ball State defensive coordinator Doug Graber has some insight into North Texas football that no opposing coach has ever had. Graber, in his first year with the Cardinals, spent several hours over the past two years watching film of North Texas while he was the color commentator for Sun Belt Conference games on ESPN Regional. Graber and North Texas head coach Todd Dodge discussed the intricacies of the Mean Green offense at length, both having no idea they would meet as opposing coaches the following year.

You Look Familiar Also...

Graber is also very familiar with North Texas defensive line coach Mike Nelson, who served on his staff when Graber was the head coach at Rutgers. Nelson was Graber's defensive line coach for the Scarlet Knights in 1993 and 1994.

Can I Get a Lift

Ball State's director of strength and conditioning will also recognize some faces when North Texas rolls into town Thursday. Mark Naylor served as the Mean Green's director of corporate sales in 2008 before returning to Ball State to lead the Cardinals strength and conditioning program. After a year of lifting nothing heavier than a case of drinks for a tailgating tent, Naylor is now charged with much weightier issues for the Cardinals.

Inexperience Abound

North Texas played with a very youthful team in 2008, with 31 players seeing their first action with Mean Green. Those 31 were made up of freshman, transfers and players who had been on the team but hadn't played in a game. There were a total 17 freshman that played last season (12 true freshmen), and 11 of those were in the two-deep. Six of the 11 offensive starters at the end of the year were in their first year of action with North Texas. Only seven schools played more true freshmen than North Texas last season.

Redshirt At The Helm

Riley Dodge will be just the second redshirt freshman this decade to start the season opener at quarterback when the Mean Green faces off against Ball State. The only other red-shirt freshman to start the season at quarterback this decade was Daniel Meager who opened the season as the starting quarterback at Middle Tennessee in 2005.

Turnover Tornado

North Texas was bitten by the turnover bug in 2008, finishing the season ranked 116th in the NCAA in turnover margin. The Mean Green committed 33 turnovers, while gaining 16 for a -17 margin. North Texas won the turnover battle just twice during the season, against Kansas State and Western Kentucky. The productivity of those opportunities was also costly for North Texas last year. On the 33 turnovers by North Texas, opponents scored 20 times (18 touchdowns and two field goals) for a scoring success rate of 61 percent off of turnovers. North Texas scored seven times off of its 16 takeaways for a success rate of 44 percent. The Mean Green had 38 points off turnovers, while its opponents scored 132 points off turnovers.

Big Guys Starting A Trend

While the Mean Green battled inexperience and youth in 2008, heading into 2009 the North Texas offensive line is as battle tested as you want. The starting five returning from last year have combined for a total of 102 career starts. The best part about the group of Santiago, Feeley, Johnson, Drake, and Gill is that none of them are seniors. The starting offensive line consists of three juniors and two sophomores. The depth behind that starting group features a two freshman, a junior, and two seniors.

Forming A Committee

The offensive line might boast the most experienced, but the running back unit for North Texas is a close second. The Mean Green returns four or its top five rushers from last season and takes the redshirt off a promising young freshman. Senior Cam Montgomery is back after rushing for 928 yards last season. Backing up Montgomery is a host of players led by sophomore Lance Dunbar, junior Micah Mosely, sophomore James Hamilton and freshman Jeremi Mathis.

Slow Start

North Texas let its 2008 opponents get out to big first-half leads, which made it difficult to mount a second-half comeback. The Mean Green was outscored 167-64 in the first quarter and 210-59 in the second quarter, leading to an average halftime deficit of 21.2 points per game. It was a lethal combination of inefficient drives by the North Texas offense and a Mean Green defense that had a hard time keeping the opponent out of the end zone. North Texas allowed 62 percent of the opponent's total offense and 65 percent of the opponent's scoring in the first half. In two years under head coach Todd Dodge, North Texas is 1-18 when trailing at the half.

Coaches Picks

Troy was chosen as the 2009 Preseason favorite to win the Sun Belt Conference as voted on by the leagues head coaches. The Trojans received five of the nine first-place votes. The Trojans were followed by Arkansas State, Florida Atlantic, Middle Tennessee, Florida International, Louisiana-Lafayette, ULM, North Texas, and Western Kentucky. Florida Atlantic, Florida International, Louisiana-Lafayette, and ULM picked up the remaining first-place votes.

Coaches Up/Coaches Down

North Texas will put three assistant coaches in the press box during games and will have six assistants along with head coach Todd Dodge on the sideline. In the press box will be offensive coordinator Todd Ford, along with defensive coordinator Gary DeLoach. Cornerbacks coach Carlton Buckels and safeties coach Chuck Peterson will join DeLoach in the press box. Linebackers coach David Rausch and defensive line coach Mike Nelson will be on the sidelines. Wide Receiver coach Clayton George and offensive line coach Spencer Leftwich will be on the sidelines along with special teams/running backs coach Shelton Gandy. Graduate assistant coaches Brian Morgan and Kevin Barbay will also be in the press box.

Well Represented in the NFL

North Texas has had more players drafted to play professional football than any other team in the Sun Belt Conference. Since the first NFL draft in 1936, North Texas has had 77 players drafted, including seven players picked in the first round. Arkansas State is second among Sun Belt Schools which have had players drafted with 46. Joe Greene is the highest drafted player ever from North Texas when he was selected by the Pittsburgh Steelers with the fourth overall pick in 1969.

TV Time

North Texas is scheduled to play on television eight times in 2009. The Mean Green will be shown in the Dallas/Fort Worth market on KTXA 21 for the Ohio and Army games as part of two-game deal with the station. The season opener at Ball State is slated for a national broadcast on ESPNU and the game at Alabama will be broadcast across the SEC Regional Network. The game at Louisiana-Lafayette and two home games with Florida Atlantic and Western Kentucky will be shown as part of the Sun Belt Conference package with ESPN Regional. The game at Troy will be broadcast by the Troy ISP Network. KTXA 21 will also air the North Texas games that are being broadcast as part of the Sun Belt package.

Charr-ging Them Up

One of the new additions to North Texas this offseason was that of a strength and conditioning coach for football. Aaron Ausmus started the program in January before leaving to take the same position at Tennessee. Todd Dodge then turned to Charr Gahagan to replace Ausmus. Gahagan was at the University of Washington and spent eight seasons at USC before that. He was a three-time national champion in powerlifting while at Louisiana Tech. The results have been noticable. Defensive lineman Eddrick Gilmore put on 29 pounds in the offseason, going from 240 to 269 in the new program. Offensive lineman Nate Jenkins went from 379 down to 349 pounds this season.

Did You Know

North Texas has its share of players on the roster that have great genes of their own but some have even better bloodlines. Wide receiver Alex Lott is the son of former Oklahoma All Big 8 quarterback Thomas Lott. His older brother just finished up his college career at Rice. Freshman wide receiver Desmond Brigham is the nephew of current Arizona Cardinals wide receiver Jamaica Rector. And if that wasn't enough freshman defensive back Jeremy Phillips is the younger brother of Jason Phillips, last seasons Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year and a former linebacker at TCU.

Following In Footsteps

North Texas head coach Todd Dodge is one of only 56 known major college head coaches who have had the rare opportunity to coach his son in college. There are only three other current sets of father-and-son duos on Football Bowl Subdivision teams, Dan and Cody Hawkins at Colorado, Ricky and Brad Bustle at Louisiana-Lafayette and Steve and Scott Spurrier at South Carolina. Todd and Riley make only the 22nd father-and-son, quarter back-and-coach tandem in FBS history.

Lack of Senioritis

The North Texas roster has only 13 seniors entering the 2009 season. Only eighth teams in the Football Bowl Subdivision have fewer seniors on their roster than North Texas, and only three of those teams (Boise State, Miami (OH), and Idaho) are non-BCS teams.

National Leader

Former North Texas wide receiver Casey Fitzgerald led the nation in receptions in 2008, with an average of 9.4 per game. He had two games with 14 catches last season, which was the third-best single-game performance in North Texas history and the second-best performance by any receiver in the NCAA last year. He has had 10 or more receptions in 11 of his 23 games as a starter, including seven of the top 10 single-game performances in school history. His 93.3 receiving yards per game also ranked 13th nationally last year.

Cam Coming On

Running back Cam Montgomery established himself as one of the premiere running backs in the Sun Belt Conference last season, bursting onto the scene in his first season of action with the Mean Green. After spending his first season at North Texas on the sideline with an injury, Montgomery surprised many opponents by averaging 5.5 yards per carry and leading the team with 928 yards. Montgomery fell just 72 yards shy of becoming just the ninth back in school history to rush for 1,000 yards in a season. He finished fourth in the Sun Belt Conference by averaging 81.6 yards in league games. Over the last seven games of the year, he averaged 101.1 yards per game. Montgomery led the team with nine touchdowns.

Going For A Three-Peat

Todd Dodge has helped the Mean Green to back-to-back years with over 4,000 yards of total offense. It is only the third time in school history that North Texas had consecutive years with over 4,000 yards of total offense. The 4,356 yards of offense in 2008 is the fifth-highest total in school history. The Mean Green has never had three straight seasons of 4,000 or more yards of total offense before. North Texas is also going after its second 3,000-yard passing season in the last three years which has never happened before in school history.

A Top 10 In Sight

Running back Cam Montgomery enters the 2009 season just 72 yards away from topping the 1,000 yard mark for his career. If he duplicates his success from last season he will be approaching record territory. Montgomery is just 937 yards from entering the top 10 all-time for most rushing yards in a career. If he does so this year Montgomery will be knocking a legend from the top 10 list. Ranking 10th all-time in rushing yards is Abner Haynes with 1,864 yards from 1957-59.

Drake Back At 100 Percent

Offensive lineman Kelvin Drake, a 2007 all-conference selection, sat out last season with an ankle injury but received a medical redshirt. Drake is back at 100 percent this season and has a new position to learn. Drake was an all-conference center for the Mean Green as a sophomore but has since moved to the guard position. It's not an unfamiliar area for Drake though as he was a guard during his high school days.

A Lot To Replace

North Texas has to fill the void left at the wide receiver spot this season. The Mean Green returns only 35 percent of its players who made catches last season and must replace its top two receivers from last season. Alex Lott is the leading receiver returning from last year with 26 catches and 201 yards. The only other returning player who had 20 catches last season is Kevin Dickerson. The running game returns its top two players in Cam Montgomery and Lance Dunbar while the Mean Green has only 55 passing yards back from last season.

Welcome To Denton

While the North Texas offense does have an abundance of starters returning this season, the Mean Green also welcomes in some new faces. Particularly at the wide receiver spot, North Texas brought in junior college transfers Michael Outlaw and Jamaal Jackson. Outlaw and Jackson were both junior college transfers from East Mississippi and SW Mississippi. Outlaw had 624 yards receiving last season while Jackson hauled in 418 yards. The offensive line was bolstered by the arrival of tackle Jeremy Bean from NE Oklahoma. Wide receiver Tyler Stradford transferred in from Oklahoma but must sit out the 2009 season due to NCAA transfer rules.

Fresh Front Line

The North Texas offensive line was very young and inexperienced in 2008, with the final starting lineup consisting of two freshmen, two sophomores and one junior. Of the final starting five, only right tackle Esteban Santiago had any previous game experience on the offensive line for North Texas prior to last year. Starting right guard Coleman Feeley and starting center J.J. Johnson were both freshmen. Starting left guard Gabe Hollivay was a transfer and starting left tackle Victor Gill was a converted tight end. Despite the youth, the Mean Green front liners allowed just one quarterback sack per every 21.4 pass attempts in 2008, which was a dramatic improvement from the average of one per every 14.2 pass attempts the previous year.

Nwigwe Serving Notice

Junior linebacker Tobe Nwigwe finally had the kind of season that many thought he could when he came to North Texas in 2006. Nwigwe led the team and ranked 22nd in the nation in tackles with an average of 9.3 per game. He led the team in tackles in five games, including a career-best 14 against Troy. His 111 total tackles are the most by any North Texas linebacker since Cody Spencer had 121 in 2003. Nwigwe was largely responsible for the team's win at Western Kentucky when he stuffed two goal line dive attempts and followed it with a 97-yard interception return for a touchdown on the final play of the game.

Young Secondary

Three of the four starters in the North Texas defensive secondary last year were in their first year at North Texas. Sophomores Darien Williams and Royce Hill were starters at safety and cornerback respectively while junior college transfer Kylie Hill was the other starter at safety. Senior Antoine Bush was the only starter in the backfield with any previous FBS football experience. The three newcomers held up admirably, with Kylie Hill and Williams finishing third and fourth on the team respectively in tackles while Royce Hill finished seventh.

Weighty Up Front

One of the biggest areas, literally, that North Texas has tried to address in the offseason was the defensive line. The Mean Green brought in six new players to help the defensive line and a lot of it was size. If you compare the starting front four to this seasons projected starting four the Mean Green has added nearly 20 pounds. Last seasons starting defensive line averaged 265 pounds up front, this season the lineup of Brandon Akpunku, Shavod Atkinson, Kelvin Jackson and Tevinn Cantly check in at an average of 285 pounds. Atkinson and Jackson are both junior college transfers who weigh in at 307 and 309 pounds at the tackle spot.

Ending On A High Note

The struggles for North Texas last season were well documented but the Mean Green perhaps carries some momentum over from the season ending game against Arkansas State. In that game the Mean Green held the Red Wolves to the third lowest passing yards allowed in 2008 and the second fewest total yards in a game to close out the season.

Atterberry Takes Over For Spencer

True freshman punter Will Atterberry has some big shoes to fill as he must replace Truman Spencer who averaged over 42 yards a kick last season. Atterberry has won the job and will start at Ball State. He was a second-team all-state selection last season at Lewisville and averaged over 42 yards a kick. He doubled as the place-kicker as well, knocking home a season-long of 47 yards.

Knott A Problem

Place-kicker Jeremy Knott is back for his senior season after a successful junior campaign that saw him connect on over 70 percent of his kicks. Knott was 12-for-17 last season and hit on a season-best 47 yard field goal. He was perfect from inside of 30 yards at 5-for-5. He led the team in scoring last year with 58 points. Knott was 60 percent on his kicks from 40-49 yards last season. Twice last season Knott connected on three field goals in a single game.

Lets Bring One Back

North Texas last season had its struggles in the return game and it was evident in the punt return game. The Mean Green returned only 10 total punts for the season and had an average of just 4.6 yards a return. Sophomore Royce Hill, who led the Mean Green in kickoff return average last season, will assume the role of punt returner, a spot he played in high school.

Return Drought Continues

It has been 121 games and counting since North Texas has returned a kickoff for a touchdown. Broderick McGrew was the last Mean Green player to do so when he took a kickoff and returned it 100 yards in a 28-27 loss to Utah State on Nov. 14, 1998. North Texas' current streak ranks as the fifth-longest without a kickoff return for a score.

Todd Dodge understands. The North Texas head football coach understands that he was hired to turn around a program that had slumped. He understands that, as he enters his third year, the pace of improvement has not come at the rate that many Mean Green fans had hoped for. But he has not wavered from his plan and the only pressure to hasten the timeline for progress comes from within his own uncompromising commitment to success. Dodge understands his role in the development of the North Texas football program and he is fully invested.



In two years at the helm, Dodge has tried to establish a foundation that would lead to victory. The baseline of success on the field has been set and now Dodge believes he has the pieces in place to show that his work has not been futile. He has quietly assembled a team of coaches and players that he believes can thrive in his system. It has been a two-year process of molding young men and tweaking a staff that will serve as the groundwork for developing his program.

On the field, Dodge's influence has helped the Mean Green to back-to-back years with over 4,000 yards of total offense. It is only the third time in school history that North Texas had consecutive years with over 4,000 yards of total offense. The 4,356 yards of offense in 2008 is the fifth-highest total in school history. Dodge is now at least partially responsible for three of North Texas' top 10 total offensive performances, with 4,901 as a head coach in 2007 and 4,031 as an assistant coach in 1993 added to last year's performance.

One of the best success stories during the Dodge era will always be of wide receiver Casey Fitzgerald. Fitzgerald came to North Texas as a walk-on and spent his first two seasons in obscurity while seeing little action in a run-based offense. In his first year of Dodge's offense, Fitzgerald broke every North Texas single-season receiving record and after just two years in his system, he is now the school's all-time leading receiver with 229 career catches (224 in his final two years under Dodge).



Dodge, 45, officially assumed control of the North Texas football program on Dec. 26, 2006 - three days after he had coached his Southlake Carroll High School football team to its fourth state championship in five years. As one of the most widely respected high school football coaches in the nation, Dodge led Southlake Carroll to a 79-1 record over his final five years, with the only loss coming by a single point in the 2003 state championship game. Dodge closed his high school career with an amazing 48-game winning streak.

Dodge had already been familiar with the Mean Green, having served as an offensive assistant coach in 1992 and 1993. During his tenure he helped direct the Mean Green offense to a per-game average of 348 yards and 26 points. He oversaw the progression of quarterback Mitch Maher, who holds numerous Mean Green offensive records, including pass completions, passing yards, and total offense. Maher went on to play for the Canadian Football League's Shreveport Pirates.

Prior to coming to North Texas, Dodge's name had become synonymous with high school football success on the national scale. In addition to winning four class 5A state championships in five years, Southlake Carroll was recognized as national champions by USA Today in 2004 and 2006, and by PrepNation.com in 2005. Dodge amassed a 98-11 record overall at Carroll after taking over in 2000. In 2005, the Dragons set the Texas 5A state record for most points in a single season by tallying 764.

Dodge was named National Coach of the Year by Schutt Sports in 2004 and by USA Today in 2005. In 2006 PrepNation.com named him the Southwest Region coach of the year.
