THE PARTICULARS

North Texas faces off against the Ohio Bobcats in the home opener for the Mean Green. The game will be televised in the Dallas-Fort Worth area on TXA 21 and can be heard on the Mean Green Radio Network. Kickoff is set for 6:05 p.m.

THE PRINCIPALS

North Texas is home for the first time this season looking to build on its momentum from the 20-10 victory over Ball State to begin the year. The Mean Green is 1-0 for the first time since the 2005 season and going after its first 2-0 start to a year since the 1994 season. The Mean Green won its first non-conference season opening game for the first time since 1988. Ohio is looking to bounce back after a 23-16 loss at home to Connecticut to start the season. The Bobcats were 2-5 away from home last season as they start a difficult stretch with four of their next five games on the road.

THE SERIES

North Texas and Ohio have never met before. However, North Texas holds a 2-3 all-time record against teams from the Mid-American Conference.

NEXT GAME

The Mean Green will take to the road for the second time in the 2009 season as the visit the Alabama Crimson Tide. Ohio returns back home next week to face Cal-Poly.

A CLOSER LOOK AT OHIO

Head Coach Frank Solich – Solich is entering his fifth season at the helm of the Ohio program. Solich guided the Bobcats to a 9-5 record in 2006 and the 2007 GMAC Bowl. Solich is sixth all-time at Ohio with 23 career wins. He has a long and rich history of coaching at the collegiate level as most of his time was spent with Nebraska. He was the head coach of the Cornhuskers from 1998-03 and compiled a 58-19 record. He was the Big 12 Coach of the Year in 1999 and 2001 and his team won the 1999 Big 12 title.

The Matchup – The Mean Green enters the game with some momentum after knocking Ball State while Ohio is looking to rebound after a loss to Connecticut. The North Texas ground game was rolling against the Cardinals with 296 total yards, which is 14th in the nation. Cam Montgomery piled up 149 yards on the ground and is ninth in the nation with that total. Freshman Riley Dodge handled the pressure of his first start well with 289 yards of total offense. The Mean Green's offensive line also get's alot of the credit as they did now allow a sack against Ball State and is one of 30 teams in the country that didn't allow a sack in the opening game. Ohio faced a tough defense in Connecticut and only had 247 yards of total offense. Boo Jackson leads the way at quarterback but on defense Lee Renfro is the playmaker for the Bobcats. The linebacker had 12 tackles in the opening game against the Huskies.

Media Information Post-Game Interviews

The North Texas locker room is closed to all members of the media. Head coach Todd Dodge and requested players will be available for interviews following a brief cooling off period. Postgame interviews at Fouts Field will be held in the media interview room below the east stands.

Credentials For Media

Those wishing to cover North Texas must contact Eric Capper or Steven Bartolotta for credentials for home and away games. Seating is very limited at Fouts Field and requests for North Texas home games need to be made at least one week prior to the contest.

Media Availability for Players

All player interviews will be conduted following the teams practice on Tuesday afternoon at the Athetic Center. Requsts for players should be made in advance through the sports information office. No interviews will be granted on Monday or Wednesday post practice. Special exemptions may be granted to those media wishing to interview a specific student-athlete before parctice at the discretion of the media relations office.

Sun Belt Teleconference

The Sun Belt Conference will conduct a weekly teleconference with each of the eight head coaches each Monday throughout the season. Coach Dodge will be on the call from 11:08-11:14 a.m. each week.

Post-Practice

Dodge will be available to media immediately following Tuesday's practice at the Darrell Dickey Practice Facility. Requests should be made in advance of practice to the media relations office.

Out of Town Media

Dodge and his assistant coaches are also available by request to out-of-town media Monday through Wednesday from 11 a.m.-12 noon. Contact the media relations office to arrange these requests.

Practice Coverage

Media has limited access to North Texas football practice. Viewing is available outside the fence of the practice facility. Video and still photography can be shot during the first 30 minutes of practice. Players and coaches are available for interviews following practice on Tuesday. All requests for interviews must be made in advance through the athletic media relations office.

SBC Players of the Week

North Texas was awarded both the offensive and defensive Players of the Week in the Sun Belt Conference after the win over Ball State last week. Freshman quarterback Riley Dodge and junior linebacker Craig Robertson earned the awards for their effort against the Cardinals. Dodge had 289 yards of total offense, including 216 passing and 73 rushing with one touchdown. Robertson had a team-high 12 tackles, including two for a loss and one fumble recovery. It was the first time since Sept. 12 of 2005 that North Texas had both the offensive and defensive Players of the Week, when Patrick Cobbs and Maurice Holman both had the honor in a season-opening win over Middle Tennessee.

Home Opener

North Texas is 55-21-2 all-time in home openers and 41-14-2 in home openers at Fouts Field. The Mean Green has lost four of the last five home-opening games, with the only win during that span coming against SMU in 2006.

Season Opening Victory

North Texas' win at Ball State last week was just the second win in a season opener in the last 13 years. Since the 1997 season, the Mean Green had been just 1-11 in season-opening games, with the only win coming at Middle Tennessee in 2005. Eight of those 11 losses came at the hands of a Big XII Conference school, including Texas three times and Oklahoma three times.

Non-Conference Road Win

The victory over Ball State was also a rare non-conference road win for the Mean Green, which had won just five of those games in the last 14 years before beating the Cardinals last week. Technically speaking, the last non-conference road win for North Texas before last week was the 51-40 win at Western Kentucky last season when the Hilltoppers were in their last year of transitioning into the Sun Belt Conference. Prior to that, the last non-conference road win was a 13-0 win at UL-Lafayette in 2000 when the Mean Green was a member of the Big West Conference. There was also two wins at Texas Tech in 1999 and 1997 as well as a 24-21 win at Northern Illinois in 1996. The trend that North Texas will try to break with this latest victory is that each of those previous four non-conference road wins came in losing seasons.

Holding it Down

The 10 points that North Texas allowed Ball State last week was the lowest scoring output by a Mean Green opponent since it held Louisiana-Lafayette to seven points in a 16-7 win in 2006. Over the past two years the North Texas defense allowed an average of 46.3 points per game and didn't hold any opponent in 2008 below 33 points.

Time Management

North Texas controlled the time of possession in the win over Ball State last week, holding the ball for 37:18 compared to just 22:42 for the Cardinals. The second quarter was really lopsided when the Mean Green held the ball for 11:14 and Ball State just 3:46. In that second quarter North Texas ran 27 plays compared to 10 for Ball State and had 142 yards compared to 30 for the Cardinals.

Special Improvement

Last season North Texas ranked 114th in the nation with a kickoff return average of 18.5 yards and it ranked dead last in the nation in kickoff return coverage, allowing an average of 30.9 yards per return. Insert new special teams coach Shelton Gandy. In the win over Ball State, North Texas averaged 20.0 yards per return and allowed an average of 16.8 yards per return.

Conversion Difference

In the win over Ball State, North Texas converted 7-of-15 third down attempts (47 percent) while the Cardinals were just 2-of-13 on third downs (15 percent). Last season, North Texas was 38 percent converting its own third down attempts and opponents were successful 47 percent of the time on third down.

A New Home For The Mean Green

North Texas has called Fouts Field home since 1952, but those days are nearing an end. In



2011 the Mean Green will move into a new stadium located on-campus. Construction is set to begin on the stadium in January of 2010 and the stadium will have a capacity of 30,000 with the ability for future expansion to raise the total to 50,000. North Texas partnered with HKS to build the stadium - the same company that designed the American Airlines Center in Dallas and the new Cowboys Stadium

in Arlington, Texas.

Redshirt At The Helm

Riley Dodge is just the second redshirt freshman this decade to start the season opener at quarterback. Dodge performed admirably in his first duty under center, completing 22-of-33 passes for 216 yards, with one touchdown and one interception. He also had 73 yards rushing. The only other redshirt freshman to start the season at quarterback this decade was Daniel Meager who opened the season as the starting quarterback at Middle Tennessee in 2005.

Big Guys Starting A Trend

While the Mean Green battled inexperience and youth in 2008, the 2009 North Texas offensive line is about as battled tested as you could want. The starting five have combined for a total of 76 career starts. The good thing about the group of Santiago (23 career starts), Bailey (14 career starts), Johnson (13 career starts), Drake (13 career starts), and Gill (13 career starts) is that only one is a senior (Bailey). In fact of the 10 offensive linemen in the two deep, only two are seniors, while four are juniors, three are sophomores and there is one freshman.

Forming A Committee

The offensive line might boast the most experienced, but the running back unit for North Texas is a close second. The Mean Green returns four or its top five rushers from last season and takes the redshirt off a promising young freshman. Senior Cam Montgomery is back after rushing for 928 yards last season. Backing up Montgomery is a host of players led by sophomore Lance Dunbar, junior Micah Mosely, sophomore James Hamilton and freshman Jeremi Mathis.

Coaches Picks

Troy was chosen as the 2009 Preseason favorite to win the Sun Belt Conference as voted on by the leagues head coaches. The Trojans received five of the nine first-place votes. The Trojans were followed by Arkansas State, Florida Atlantic, Middle Tennessee, Florida International, Louisiana-Lafayette, ULM, North Texas, and Western Kentucky. Florida Atlantic, Florida International, Louisiana-Lafayette, and ULM picked up the remaining first-place votes

Coaches Up/Coaches Down

North Texas will put three assistant coaches in the press box during games and will have six assistants along with head coach Todd Dodge on the sideline. In the press box will be offensive coordinator Todd Ford, along with defensive coordinator Gary DeLoach. Cornerbacks coach Carlton Buckels and safeties coach Chuck Peterson will join DeLoach in the press box. Linebackers coach David Rausch and defensive line coach Mike Nelson will be on the sidelines. Wide Receiver coach Clayton George and offensive line coach Spencer Leftwich will be on the sidelines along with special teams/running backs coach Shelton Gandy. Graduate assistant coaches Brian Morgan and Kevin Barbay will also be in the press box.

Well Represented in the NFL

North Texas has had more players drafted to play professional football than any other team in the Sun Belt Conference. Since the first NFL draft in 1936, North Texas has had 77 players drafted, including seven players picked in the first round. Arkansas State is second among Sun Belt Schools which have had players drafted with 46. Joe Greene is the highest drafted player ever from North Texas when he was selected by the Pittsburgh Steelers with the fourth overall pick in 1969.

TV Time

North Texas is scheduled to play on television eight times in 2009. The Mean Green will be shown in the Dallas/Fort Worth market on KTXA 21 for the Ohio and Army games as part of two-game deal with the station. The season opener at Ball State is slated for a national broadcast on ESPNU and the game at Alabama will be broadcast across the SEC Regional Network. The game at Louisiana-Lafayette and two home games with Florida Atlantic and Western Kentucky will be shown as part of the Sun Belt Conference package with ESPN Regional. The game at Troy will be broadcast by the Troy ISP Network. KTXA 21 will also air the North Texas games that are being broadcast as part of the Sun Belt package.

Charr-ging Them Up

One of the new additions to North Texas this offseason was that of a strength and conditioning coach for football. Aaron Ausmus started the program in January before leaving to take the same position at Tennessee. Todd Dodge then turned to Charr Gahagan to replace Ausmus. Gahagan was at the University of Washingon and spent eight seasons at USC before that. He was a three-time national champion in powerlifting while at Louisiana Tech. The results have been noticable. Defensive lineman Eddrick Gilmore put on 29 pounds in the offseason, going from 240 to 269 in the new program. Offensive lineman Nate Jenkins went from 379 down to 349 pounds this season.

Did You Know

North Texas has its share of players on the roster that have great genes of their own but some have even better bloodlines. Wide receiver Alex Lott is the son of former Oklahoma All Big 8 quarterback Thomas Lott. His older brother just finished up his college career at Rice. Freshman wide receiver Desmond Brigham is the nephew of current Arizona Cardinals wide receiver Jamaica Rector. And if that wasn't enough freshman defensive back Jeremy Phillips is the younger brother of Jason Phillips, last seasons Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year and a former linebacker at TCU.

Following In Footsteps

North Texas head coach Todd Dodge is one of only 56 known major college head coaches who have had the rare opportunity to coach his son in college. There are only three other current sets of father-and-son duos on Football Bowl Subdivision teams, Dan and Cody Hawkins at Colorado, Ricky and Brad Bustle at Louisiana-Lafayette and Steve and Scott Spurrier at South Carolina. Todd and Riley make only the 22nd father-and-son, quarter back-and-coach tandem in FBS history.

Lack of Senioritis

The North Texas roster has only 13 seniors entering the 2009 season. Only eighth teams in the Football Bowl Subdivision have fewer seniors on their roster than North Texas, and only three of those teams (Boise State, Miami (OH), and Idaho) are non-BCS teams.

MEAN GREEN OFFENSIVE NOTES

Balanced Attack

North Texas 512 yards of total offense in the win over Ball State was balanced between 296 yards rushing and 216 yards passing. The total offense was made up of 58 percent rushing yards and 42 percent passing yards. Only once last year did North Texas rush for more yards than it passed for and that was in the season opener against Kansas State. There was also only two games last year when the balance between run and pass was better than it was last week against the Cardinals.

Going For A Long Time

North Texas held the ball for over 37 minutes against Ball State which is the best time of possession in nearly two years. Not since holding the ball for over 40 minutes against Louisiana-Lafayette in 2007 has North Texas dominated in time of possession like it did against Ball State.

Crazy 8's

Cam Montgomery had his best night in a North Texas uniform against Ball State with a career-high 149 yards rushing. Montgomery made it look easy against the Cardinals with an average of 8.8 yards a carry, which is also a career-best for the senior. The 8.8 yard average is the highest for North Texas running back in a game since Jamario Thomas had a 9.2 yard average against Western Kentucky on November 24, 2007. Montgomery also went over the 1,000 yard mark for his career and now sits with 1,077 yards for his career.

Dazzling Debut

The wide receiving duo of Michael Outlaw and Jamaal Jackson made their Mean Green introduction in grand style against Ball State last week. In his first game, Outlaw led the team in receiving with seven catches for 43 yards and one touchdown. Jackson led the team in receiving yards with 86, including a spectacular play when he took a short pass 59 yards down the sideline.

A Good Distributor

One of the areas that Coach Todd Dodge has emphasized this year is getting the ball in the hands of as many different people as possible. Through one game the offense is getting the message. The Mean Green had nine different wide receivers have at least one catch, which is the most since the second game of the season last year against Tulsa. To go along with that, four different players had over 20 yards rushing and three with over 60 rushing yards.

Going For A Three-Peat

Todd Dodge has helped the Mean Green to back-to-back years with over 4,000 yards of total offense. It is only the third time in school history that North Texas had consecutive years with over 4,000 yards of total offense. The 4,356 yards of offense in 2008 is the fifth-highest total in school history. The Mean Green has never had three straight seasons of 4,000 or more yards of total offense before. North Texas is also going after it's second 3,000-yard passing season in the last three years which has never happened before in school history.

A Top 10 In Sight

Running back Cam Montgomery has topped the 1,000 yard rushing mark for his career and has his sights set on joining the top 10 all-time at North Texas. Montgomery is just 788 yards from entering the top 10 all-time for most rushing yards in a career. If he does so this year Montgomery will be knocking a legend from the top 10 list. Ranking 10th all-time in rushing yards is Abner Haynes with 1,864 yards from 1957-59.

Not The Same Anymore

There might not have been a more maligned defense than North Texas over the last two seasons but Gary DeLoach and crew are starting to change things. North Texas allowed only 309 yards in the season opener against Ball State, the fewest yards allowed in the Todd Dodge era. Not since November 18, 2006 has the Mean Green held an opponent to less yards. It is also just the fifth time since the start of the 2007 season that the North Texas defense has held its opponent to less than 400 yards of total offense. The 140 yards of passing allowed were the fewest given up by North Texas since late in the 2007 season against Western Kentucky.

Nwigwe Serving Notice

Senior linebacker Tobe Nwigwe has develop into one of the top linebacker in the Sun Belt Conference after a breakout year in 2008. Nwigwe led North Texas and ranked 22nd in the nation last year with an average of 9.3 tackles per game and his 111 total tackles was the most by any linebacker since 2003. In his first game of the year last week against Ball State, Nwigwe had 11 tackles. He was a second team all-Sun Belt Conference selection as a junior and should be a strong candidate for all-conference consideration again this season.

Coming of Age

North Texas still has a very young defensive secondary, with all four starters either in their first or second year with the Mean Green. Sophomores Royce Hill and DaWaylon Cook are starters at cornerback and safety after playing extensively as true freshmen last season. Adryan Adams transferred to North Texas last year, but is in his first year as a full-time starter at cornerback. Fellow transfer Ira Smith is in his first year at North Texas and is the other starter at safety. The foursome held Ball State to just 140 yards passing and intercepted one pass.

Weighty Up Front

One of the biggest areas, literally, that North Texas has tried to address in the offseason was the defensive line. The Mean Green brought in six new players to help the defensive line and a lot of it was size. If you compare the starting front four to this seasons projected starting four the Mean Green has added nearly 20 pounds. Last season's starting defensive line averaged 265 pounds up front, this season the lineup of Brandon Akpunku, Shavod Atkinson, Kelvin Jackson and Tevinn Cantly check in at an average of 285 pounds. Atkinson and Jackson are both junior college transfers who weigh in at 307 and 309 pounds at the tackle spot.

True Debut

True freshman punter Will Atterberry had an outstanding debut for North Texas in the win over Ball State. Atterberry had just three punts, but averaged 47 yards per attempt and had a long of 51 yards. He downed two of his punts inside the opponent 20-yard line and the other began on the Cardinals 28-yard line.

Special Teams Improvement

North Texas last season had its struggles on special teams. Of 119 Football Bowl Subdivision teams last year, North Texas ranked 111th in punt returns, 114th in kickoff returns, 109th in punt coverage and 119th in kickoff coverage. While it is still very early, the Mean Green has shown vast improvement in those areas. After one game, North Texas ranks 88th in punt returns, 65th in kickoff returns, 35th in punt coverage and 27th in kickoff coverage.

Return Drought Continues

It has been 122 games and counting since North Texas has returned a kickoff for a touchdown. Broderick McGrew was the last Mean Green player to do so when he took a kickoff and returned it 100 yards in a 28-27 loss to Utah State on Nov. 14, 1998. North Texas' current active streak ranks as the fifth-longest without a kickoff return for a score.

HEAD COACH TODD DODGE

Todd Dodge understands. The North Texas head football coach understands that he was


hired to turn around a program that had slumped. He understands that, as he enters his third year, the pace of improvement has not come at the rate that many Mean Green fans had hoped for. But he has not wavered from his plan and the only pressure to hasten the timeline for progress comes from within his own uncompromising commitment to success. Dodge understands his role in the development of the North Texas football program and he is fully invested.

In two years at the helm, Dodge has tried to establish a foundation that would lead to victory. The baseline of success on the field has been set and now Dodge believes he has the pieces in place to show that his work has not been futile. He has quietly assembled a team of coaches and players that he believes can thrive in his system. It has been a two-year process of molding young men and tweaking a staff that will serve as the groundwork for developing his program.



On the field, Dodge's influence has helped the Mean Green to back-to-back years with over 4,000 yards of total offense. It is only the third time in school history that North Texas had consecutive years with over 4,000 yards of total offense. The 4,356 yards of offense in 2008 is the fifth-highest total in school history. Dodge is now at least partially responsible for three of North Texas' top 10 total offensive performances, with 4,901 as a head coach in 2007 and 4,031 as an assistant coach in 1993 added to last year's performance.

One of the best success stories during the Dodge era will always be of wide receiver Casey Fitzgerald. Fitzgerald came to North Texas as a walk-on and spent his first two seasons in obscurity while seeing little action in a run-based offense. In his first year of Dodge's





Dodge, 45, officially assumed control of the North Texas football program on Dec. 26, 2006 - three days after he had coached his Southlake Carroll High School football team to its fourth state championship in five years. As one of the most widely respected high school football coaches in the nation, Dodge led Southlake Carroll to a 79-1 record over his final five years, with the only loss coming by a single point in the 2003 state championship game. Dodge closed his high school career with an amazing 48-game winning streak.

Dodge had already been familiar with the Mean Green, having served as an offensive assistant coach

in 1992 and 1993. During his tenure he helped direct the Mean Green offense to a per-game average of 348 yards and 26 points. He oversaw the progression of quarterback Mitch Maher, who holds numerous Mean Green offensive records, including pass completions, passing yards, and total offense. Maher went on to play for the Canadian Football Leagues' Shreveport Pirates.

Prior to coming to North Texas, Dodge's name had become synonymous with high school football success on the national scale. In addition to winning four class 5A state championships in five years, Southlake Carroll was recognized as national champions by USA Today in 2004 and 2006, and by PrepNation.com in 2005. Dodge amassed a 98-11 record overall at Carroll after taking over in 2000. In 2005, the Dragons set the Texas 5A state record for most points in a single season by tallying 764.

Dodge was named National Coach of the Year by Schutt Sports in 2004 and by USA Today in 2005. In 2006 PrepNation.com named him the Southwest Region coach of the year.


